HUNTER HEALTH EMPLOYEE SURVEY

Each year we complete an employee engagement survey, which is conducted by a third party, to hear how our employees feel about working at Hunter Health and to benchmark our performance against healthcare organizations across the country. Our employees are our greatest resource, and it is important to me, our Leadership Team, and our Board of Directors to hear how our team feels about working at Hunter Health and to leverage their feedback to continually improve our organization.

I am excited to share our results for 2024. We always have a high rate of participation, an indicator that employees believe the survey is valuable, and this year was no exception with 100% participation. Our employee engagement results rank in the 89th percentile nationally across healthcare organizations! This is the seventh annual survey we have performed since 2017 and the third year in a row that we have ranked in the top 15% of healthcare organizations nationally.

Employee engagement is about more than whether our employees feel satisfied working at Hunter Health; it's also about how engaged they are in our mission and their willingness to go above and beyond for our clients, our community, and each other.

There are examples every day of how our workforce feels engaged and empowered to provide an exceptional level of care to our clients. Just this week I heard about an employee offering a visibly distraught client a hug, an employee sitting with a client with dyslexia to help them complete their paperwork and an employee preparing a "Superstar" certificate for a client that reached a major health milestone. These are all actions our employees felt empowered to perform to provide the best possible care to our clients.
