Welcome

Our usual approach to finding new agencies is to look to unearth a gem which is likely to be relatively unknown in the UK, with the added potential to be relevant to a broad range of our customers. Occasionally a big name will cross our bows and then a whole bunch of additional factors need to be considered. Thankfully, in the case of Peter Lehman and Morris of Rutherglen these were all met with ease. Tasting the wines proved that whilst Peter Lehman is a well-known name from Barossa, quality remains very much at the heart of everything they do, and this crystalised our view that this is a great winery for the future, not just a grand old name of the past.

The tried and tested route of unearthing lesser know gems has resulted in us 'ticking' off yet another country. Not for the sake of it, more to offer relevant, contemporary wines to our customers. Pisano have hit their stride with Albarino which, combined with their very drinkable range of Tannats, made it an easy decision for us to bring them on board.

Boutinot have been dabbling in no alcohol wines with varying success for a number of years. Whilst still clearly a category in its infancy, we have seen good uptake in our wines from Bischöfliche and Murviedro and when the chance came to work with the qualitative leaders from France, Chavin, we bit the bullet, and launched our first non alcoholic producer with a range of five wines.

The Autumn also saw us launch new producers from Italy and Greece. Collio is a region we've long admired, and in Gradis'ciutta, Beth has found some outstanding wines which closely reflect winemaker 'Robert Princic's' philosophy of sustainability, and integrity to the region's grapes, and their whites are outstanding.

February saw the launch of a few European producers. From the Mâconnais, Nicholas Delfaud's wines have been here before, and after a couple of difficult vintages we now have availability on his delicious, organic wines including his stunning St Veran. We've also found a lovely producer of Crozes-Hermitage, Domaine les 4 Vents. Sisters Lucie and Nancy produce fine and balanced Syrahs from their small organic estate. Sally has also found an exciting Beaujolais producer, Domaine Cheysson, whose vineyards are spread over 100 parcels across the Chiroubles, with wines which have great purity and energy.

Mike has new wines from Calatayud. Norrel Robertson's wines have been distributed in the UK for a number of years and now come in to compliment our portfolio providing wonderfully pure Garnachas from the region's old vines. Mike is also adding fuel to the growing interest in Greece, and our new relationship with Boutari will bring diversity to our range from their wineries in Mantinia, Naoussa, and Goumenissa.

Completing the new producer roster are the delicious Tellurian wines from Heathcote, Victoria. Talented winemaker Tobias Ansted produces Rhône varietals from organic vineyards which sit on the region's ancient Cambrian soils.

Bodega Urqo Palo Santo Cabernet Franc, Valle de Uco

All the Cab Franc from Urqo is from their higher Los Chacayes blocks, nestled against the Andes in deep sandy soils. Bright, leafy and alive with minerals this is another very pure expression from Leo Pisano and Daniel Pi.



Bodega Urqo El Mirador Chardonnay, Chacayes

As the Valle de Uco regrafts to select white grapes, this Chardonnay is proof of this exercise's worth. Citrus bright, with gentle waxy citrus oils on the palate, a bright crème fraîche acidity and terrific minerality. Just a joy.



Bodega Urqo Malbec Organico, DO Valle de Uco

Bodega Urqo has a magical vineyard on a corner of the Cordon del Plata ward of Tupungato. A slightly sunken plot which creates a cold trap here compared to the surrounding vineyards, meaning it's generally 2 degrees cooler on average over the year. It's thought that this must be what gives this organic Malbec it's charming, Pinot Noir-like aromatics. Indeed you could argue it's this Malbec is the best Pinot Noir in Mendoza. As gloriously labelled as this block of vines is unique, it's a truly wonderful product from the increasingly interesting Bodega Urqo. We are genuinely excited to present this wine, like no other in Mendoza.



Bodega Urqo Palo Santo Chardonnay, Valle de Uco

Palo Santo Chardonnay is from organically-farmed blocks in Tupungato. The ferment enjoys about 20% oak to keep the abundant mountain purity of fruit but just to give it a lick of structure. Delicious, stony, gently mineral but generous Chardonnay with lively acidity, generosity of fruit. A very contemporary expression of Valle de Uco Chardonnay seeking to be an instant staple on your list!



Australia



Pyren Vineyard Sauvignon Dunk, Pyrenees, Victoria

Barrel fermented on skins for 8 months in old barrels that are about 70% full, then aged off skins for a few 10 months in equally-ullaged barrels gives the wine positive oxidation, texture and body, quite apart from a unique character. Its a natural, orange, gently-oxidised wine from the hills, and is massively foody for things with pork fat, flesh and the right kind of cheese. A great find...

Chile



CoPa Semillón , Valle de Itata

Rodrigo Concha's wines from Itata have been attracting plenty of attention from the critics, with the Itata region now cited as one of Chile's most attractive options thanks to old vines, small growers and garagiste producers. We tasted this back in May and we were immediately impressed by the layered complexity; think lemon, beeswax and minerality all held together by fantastic freshness. A wine which will work for Soms, and any credible Indie retailer who wants to show some diversity in their Chilean range. Oh, and it got 95 points from Tim Atkin in his recent report where it was cited as a white wine of the year.

France

LA QUILLE

These are fruit-forward, great value, wines from the team at Château de Cérons produced from the estate's younger vines; La Quille translates as skittle in French as well as, more colloquially, the idea of sharing an impromptu drink with friends. All three wines are approachable but of top quality, as you would expect from Xavier Perromat.



La Quille Blanc, AOP Graves

The white is a classic Graves blend of Semillon, Sauvignon Blanc and Gris fermented in stainless steel and lees aged for 6 months with expressive stone fruit flavours, some weight on the palate and ripe pink grapefruit acidity.



La Quille Clairet, AOP Bordeaux Clairet

Launched for the 2024 vintage, La Quille Clairet is a refreshing light red in the tradition of the original Clarets exported to England in the Middle Ages, reintroduced as an AOP in its own-right in the 1950s and now making a come-back.



La Quille Rouge, AOP Graves

100% Cabernet Sauvignon grapes have a short maceration producing a lively, wild berry flavoured wine with low tannin and bright acidity at a modest alcohol of 11.5%.





Cave de Turckheim Mayerling Brut, AOP Crémant d'Alsace (Magnum)

We now have well-priced magnums of this excellent Crémant to help celebrate their 70th anniversary.



Château de Piote Cuvée des Potes Rouge, AOP Bordeaux Supérieur

Our only biodynamic Bordeaux Rouge. It retains a slight natural edge, full of life and character but with balance and typicity.



Domaine Boutinot Sélection Parcelaire 'La Truffière', AOP Cairanne

It's been a while since there's been a new addition to the Domaine Boutinot range, we're pleased to introduce the La Truffière, the very first wine in our Sélection Parcelaire. This wine is limited release, only 2,400 bottles produced. The idea behind this range is that each year a parcel will be highlighted for its exceptional quality and we produce a wine using fruit from that particular parcel. Simple, really! Breathes a bit of life back into one of our more classic ranges. In terms of the blend, it is heavily Syrah dominated (around 70% with 30% grenache) and this really shows when tasting. It's not unusual for Southern Rhone Syrah dominated (around 70% with 30% Grenache) and this really shows when tasting. It's not unusual for Southern Rhône Syrah to really shine in cooler seasons like V24, as the climatic conditions can start to more closely resemble those of its more traditional home in the northern Rhône.



Pierre Chainier Brut Rosé, AOP Crémant de Loire

Crémant as a category is going from strength to strength, but the rosé is less widely available, and usually more expensive than its Brut counterpart. This Crémant de Loire Rosé from Pierre Chainier is the same price as the Brut and has also undergone extended time on the lees (12 months rather than the required 9). A blend of Pinot Noir, Cabernet Franc and Pineau d'Aunis, sourced from Anjou, this should be a great addition to our flourishing Crémant portfolio.



Château de Pocé Sauvignon Blanc, AOP Touraine

We have been developing a more bespoke range from Pierre Chainier for the Independent and On-trade channels and the Domaines owned by the Chainier family in their Touraine heartland play an important role in this. They own the 40 hectares of vineyards surrounding this Château in the village of Pocé-sur-Cisse close to historic town of Amboise. Situated on an elevated plateau above the village with clay/limestone soils, the wine has a classic herbaceous style with a fine, mineral finish.



Domaine Haut-Marin No.10 Sparkling Wine, Vin Pétillant

New this year from Haut-Marin, a fun, zesty fizz with all the lovely bright apple and grapefruit zing of a still wine from Gascony but with bubbles. Gascony is good source of naturally lower alcohol, tasty wines so No.10 should be relevant for this growing category. A blend of Gros Manseng, Colombar and Sauvignon Blanc, unashamedly off-dry with 16gm/rs but delicious ripe sherbet-lemon acidity to balance this.

Georgia



Teliani Valley Winery 97 Tsoolikouri

Teliani Valley Winery 97 Tsoolikouri - This as a new addition to the range which we were attracted to list as a contrast to the more traditional, textured wines that Teliani produce. Tsoolikouri (pronounced tso-lee-ko-oo-ree) is widely planted in western Georgia and tends to produce medium bodied wines with focused pithy fruit and acidity. This is a great example from the Imereti region having been fermented in stainless steel to retain its zesty character.

Germany



Bischöfliche Urziger Würzgarten Riesling Kabinett, Mosel

Hand-picked Riesling with some nice bottle age from one of the best and steepest slopes in the Middle Mosel with shallow, slate soil. The wine ferments in large 1000l fuder and stays on the fine lees until bottling in the Spring after the vintage. This is classic, wonderfully mineral Riesling with a nery balance of ripe limey fruit, sherbet acidity, added complexity from time in bottle and so much flavour for the modest 8% alcohol.



Friedrich Wilhelm Gymnasium Fritz Willi Rosé Feinherb, Qualitätswein


Produced by the Friedrich-Wilhelm-Gymnasium, Bischöfliche's sister winery, Fritz Willi wines are versatile and not too complicated. Their new off-dry rosé is a very drinkable blend of Pinot Noir and Saint Laurent with fresh, nicely balanced red berry fruit and clean finish.



Bischöfliche DOM Zero Sparkling Riesling Alkoholfrei

The still version of this zero-alcohol wine has performed well so we were keen to take on Bischöfliche's new sparkling Riesling, again made with good quality Kabinett wine to ensure a more naturally balanced drink once the alcohol has been removed. We feel that if you are going to choose a wine without alcohol then it should be a credible alternative and enjoyable to drink and this wine delivers that.

Serranova Estate





Conviviale Pinot Grigio Rosé, Delle Venezie DOC

An addition to the Conviviale range, to sit alongside the Pinot Grigio, as a step up PG rosé in the Adria range with a little more weight and texture on the palate. When we tasted the 2024 we knew this was the right year to introduce it! Sourced from our very best partners in Delle Venezie, this has pretty summer fruits with a beautiful creamy lingering mouthfeel.



La Pieve, Chianti Classico Gran Selezione DOCG

This is replacing Il Grigio Gran Selezioni Chianti Classico in the San Felice range. The grapes are selected from some of the best Sangiovese vineyards on the estate and higher altitude plots - blended with their trademark Pugnitello and other local varieties to give it real character. 24 months in barriques, then refinement in tonneaux followed by 8 months in bottle before release. Full bodied, refined and harmonious.



Castel Serranova Susumaniello, Salento IGP

This wine, sourced from a 3ha plot on the Serranova Estate, replaces Tenuta Serranova Susumaniello. It's higher quality and 60% is aged in tonneau, giving a rich, more spicy and complex wine for a very modest jump in price.



Castel Serranova Susumaniello Rosé, Salento IGP

This Rosé joins the Susumaniello red and Fiano to make a trio of great tasting (and looking!) wines. A vibrant rosé with an intense fresh berry character.



Alasia Viognier, Piemonte DOC

Carlo Manera, winemaker at Araldica, has wanted to produce a Viognier for a few years as a couple of Araldica members have 1ha of Viognier vines between them. 2024 had cooler temperatures throughout the growing season and no periods of extreme heat, which was perfect for the style of Viognier Carlo wanted to make, lean and linear with beautiful aromatics and minerality to finish.



Ferghettina Tal Quale Brut Nature, Franciacorta DOCG

Tal Quale means 'as it is' - reflecting the Brut Nature style of this wine. This is a brand-new addition to the Ferghettina range with only 8,000 bottles produced. 85% Chardonnay and 15% Pinot Noir, fermented in stainless steel and aged for 28 months on lees, followed by 24 months in bottle post-disgorgement. This is mineral, elegant, and finely textured—a precise and focused expression of Franciacorta.



Prà Morandina, Valpolicella Superiore DOC

Graziano Prà waited over 20 years to produce this Valpolicella Superiore - he wanted it to be the perfect expression of the Morandina Cru. The vineyard is on high ground with characteristic limestone soils which gives the red wines their distinctive elegance, balanced perfectly by the strength and complexity that comes from mature vines. This is an outstanding addition to the Prà range.



Bottega Vinai Nosiola, Trentino DOC

Nosiola is back! Many of you will remember that we used to have it in the Cavit range a few years ago and was always well loved. It's back for V24 and as delicious as ever. Nosiola comes from the Italian word nocciola as the wine is known for showing characteristic toasted hazelnut characters. Beautiful depth and texture in this wine and bags of character.



Lunetta Zero

We've been searching for decent quality 0% options for the range for a long while and when the 1st samples of Lunetta 0% landed, they stood out by a long way. Rather than achieve 0% by dealcoholisation, they have opted for carbonating Chardonnay and Moscato grape must. The result is sweet and delicate Moscato flavours enhanced by a dash of tropical fruits and citrus.



Montresor La Colombaia, Valpolicella Ripasso DOP

This joins the Montresor range - a fresh and vibrant Valpolicella Ripasso that spends 12 months in large Botti. It sits nicely alongside the Colombaia Amarone.



Poderi Colla, Verduno Pelaverga DOC

No one needs a Pelaverga but there are some wines which you can't say no to! Crafted beautifully (as all Colla wines are) from one of Piedmont's most intriguing native grapes: Pelaverga Piccolo. The fruit is carefully hand-harvested and gently vinified to preserve its delicate character - a bright, fragrant red with notes of wild rose, pomegranate flower, and a gentle, lifted spice. Light, vibrant, and precise.

Chateau Mercian, Yamanashi

Château Mercian Muscat Bailey A, Yamanashi

Hybridised to survive, and work, within Japan's intemperate climate of steamy summers and freezing winter temperatures, Muscat Bailey A is a thick-skinned, aromatic grape of which Chateau Mercian's is likely the finest example. A pale red with Muscat's gently heady aromatics, the palate is light, silky and defined by notes of fig, plum and allspice.

South Africa



Wildeberg Amphora, WO Franschhoek

Very limited release single Amphora Semillon. Old vine Semillon has always represented the pinnacle for our WO Franschhoek whites; it's a versatile beast that can shapeshift to take on many different personalities. The blend here is exactly the same as found in our Wildeberg White (SBO501), mostly Semillon Blanc with blob of its naturally mutated cousin; Semillon Gris, all from ancient vineyards dating back to 1905. Just the 900 bottles made for this first vintage.



Pressure Point Méthode Ancestrale, WO Paarl (Pet Nat)

A small production of Méthode Ancestrale from dry-farmed, bush-vine Cinsault grown on Paarl's sandy soils. Pressure Point 2025 is a delicate pink in the glass with a nose of light strawberry and redcurrant fruit. The slightly lower pressure in Methode Ancestrale means that the effervescence is light-footed and graceful rather than anything too vigorous.

Spain



El Ninot de Paper Blanc de Noirs Sparkling

Murviedro have excellent sparkling capability and this well-priced example wine, produced from Garnacha, works really well alongside the white - rosé - red wines in the range. A Charmat method fizz with enough dosage to make it fruity and approachable, just perfect for events, casual dining and parties.



Fernando de Castilla Yema Palomino, VdT Blancas del Sur de Andalucia

Fernando de Castilla don't release many new wines, so when it happens this is something quite exciting. The unfortified wines of Jerez are enjoying a renaissance, driven by 'Vino de Pasto'. However, this dry and delicious white doesn't have any biological ageing under flor. It has a nutty and salty tang which Jan Pettersen assures us is from Palomino growing in Albariza soil. "It was fermented in stainless steel and aged on lees in a full tank, there hasn't been any flor influence". A premium, relevant and modern white which is bound to be a hit for fans of Fernando de Castilla.

Shannon Ridge Chardonnay, Lake County AVA

Oaked Chardonnay is always a popular wine and trying to find something from the USA approaching 'value for money' is a challenge. This from Clay Shannon in Lake County AVA (Northern California) is as good as anything on the market from the USA around the £20 mark.



Shannon Ridge Zinfandel, Lake County AVA

This Zinfandel offers a different style to the richer Cline wines and remains good value around the £20 retail mark. It offers a point of difference to ubiquitous Pinot and Cabernet, as well as belonging to the Clay Shannon stable as a regenerative Organic producer, which is very commercially relevant.

We were keen to look for a smaller grower producer in Crozes-Hermitages so are fortunate to have found this small, organic estate in the hamlet of Mercurol, just outside Tain l'Hermitage.. Run by sisters – Lucie and Nancy - whose parents used to sell their grapes to Cave de Tain, the estate is made up of 12 hectares of vines all grown organically. Their winemaking philosophy is as follows: *“In the constant pursuit of the respect of the environment, our interventions in the vines, as in the cellar, are simply to accompany the grapes, then the wine, towards it’s most authentic expression.”* We have selected two of their red Crozes-Hermitages and pricing reflects the small-scale production.

We started working with Nicolas in 2019, the aim being to develop our grower offering from the Mâconnais alongside the wines which we produce ourselves. Nicolas really is an artisan, organic winemaker and his small domaine was devastated in the 2021 vintage so we were not able to source more wine from him. Following a visit last year, we have renewed our relationship as he has gradually built up his production again enabling him to employ someone to help him in the winery. His wines are as good as ever with real depth and complexity to enhance the lovely expressive fruit.

GRADIS'CIUTTA

We were hunting for a quality led producer in Friuli for a while and then Gradis Ciutta popped up, a recommendation which nearly didn't get followed up... but we're do glad it did. Robert Princic founded the winery in 1997, named after the hilltop village where he grew up, surrounded by vineyards that his family had tended for generations. At 47 hectares (*across 21 vineyards, all cultivated organically*) Gradis'ciutta is now one of the ten largest producers in Collio, however the winery's focus is ruthlessly on quality over quantity. The region's distinctive Ponca soil and its proximity to the Slovenian border are deeply influential - shaping both the landscape and the wines it produces.

EL ESCOCÉS VOLANTE

El Escocés Volante is the project of Norrel Robertson, a charismatic Scottish MW who has been a flying winemaker, and has lived and made wine in Spain for the past 20 years. He crafts old vine and mostly single vineyard wines based around Garnacha, Macabeo and Viognier in Calatayud. These elegant, bright wines are very much in vogue.




