



## KEEPING OUR PETS HEALTHY

We all love our pets, but caring for their health can be tricky. They can't tell us when something is wrong, and in fact they often try to hide any physical pain from us. That's why it's important to bring your pets to a team you can trust. Located in Beaver Dam, Wyllow Pet Hospital provides a wide range of care for both sick and healthy pets. They specialize in customizing care for each individual pet, based on species, breed, age, lifestyle, prior health history, and risk factors for diseases. With an extensive in-house laboratory and partner laboratories, the team can provide complete diagnostic labs services. "A while back, we had a canine patient that had just started coming to our hospital. Although she was healthy and only 7 years old, we recommended routine bloodwork. Thankfully, the owners accepted the recommendation, and the bloodwork results showed elevated liver values. This led to us discovering that she had a disease causing excess copper to accumulate in her liver, creating liver damage. Based on the dog's happy, bouncy, normal behavior, we never would have guessed that she was facing this disease. Many liver diseases show no signs until

they have already caused extensive damage, and by then it is too late to do much to intervene. Because we caught this particular case early enough, we were able to get the patient on a low-copper food and proper medications. She will live a much longer, healthier life because we were able to diagnose her before she progressed to liver failure."

Although that case stands out as a strong example for why pet parents should take their pets in for preventative wellness testing, it is not unique in terms of the individualized care that dog received. At Wyllow Pet Hospital, all staff are focused on providing the best possible care for every patient. All the way from receptionists to veterinary technicians, veterinary assistance, veterinarians, and even the kennel help, it's an organization filled with passionate experts. "We all want what is best for our patients and their people," says Dr. Smith. "We always tailor our care for each individual, since the best choice for one pet may not be what's right for another."

"For example," recalls Dr. Smith, "we had a dog with mass on the back of his thigh. It was not very big, but we advised sampling the mass to find out more about it. We performed a needle sampling of the mass and advised surgical removal. Although the surgery went well, the biopsy indicated it was a cancer type that would recur. We worked with the owner and veterinary oncologists at the University of Wisconsin Veterinary


> Hospital to provide radiation and medical therapy for the cancer. That patient has now been cancer-free for 2 years and is doing



## The Joy of Pet Adoption: A Look at Dodge County Humane Society

Whether you've driven by the building in Juneau or simply come across a post on Facebook, you may be familiar with the Dodge County Humane Society (DCHS). Their mission is to promote animal welfare by providing care and shelter to animals in need, by facilitating adoptions and by educating the public. Their purpose includes ensuring all animals are treated humanely, finding homes for all adoptable animals, promoting spaying and neutering to control pet overpopulation, and more.

The Humane Society is run by an experienced staff that have been cross-trained in all facets of the job. "From general animal care to vaccinations to adoption counseling to troubleshooting animal issues, all our staff are experts and true ambassadors of our mission," explains Executive Director Kensie Drinkwine, who has been in her role for nearly 10 years.

In addition to a dedicated staff, the shelter utilizes volunteers for a variety of tasks as well. This includes cleaning, animal socializing, dog walking, laundry, lawncare, and animal transportation. There are also volunteers who take the time to create and run fundraisers or special events.

The Humane Society hosts two key fundraisers each year: Puppy Prom and Pet Palooza. Puppy Prom is held in January as a fun night of celebrating the animals and the community. The event includes dinner, entertainment, raffles, and the famous Mutt Strutt, where two of the four-legged guests are crowned king and queen. Pet Palooza is held in July and offers the only opportunity each year for the public to tour the entire shelter. It's a family-friendly event that features music, food, games, basket raffles, a bake sale, and adoption specials.

You may have seen photos of some of these events on the Humane Society's Facebook page,



where they are active in posting photos and descriptions of pets available for adoption. "Facebook and other social media outlets are instrumental in getting our pets into homes," Kensie says. "Every like and share increases the chances of a pet being seen by their future forever-family."

There are four main ways a pet typically ends up at the Humane Society. First, they may be a stray animal; these are found outside with no apparent owner or identifying information. Second, they may be a surrendered animal; these are animals whose owner is no longer able to keep them, so they are surrendered to the shelter to find a new home. The third option is a transferred animal, which comes to the shelter via a rescue partner. These partners include rescue groups like Lola's Lucky Day and various other Humane Societies around Wisconsin. The fourth option is a seized animal, which comes to the shelter through law enforcement. Sometimes these animals need to be rehomed, while other times they just need to be held until the owner can reclaim them.

In fact, one of Kensie's fondest memories of her time at the Humane Society involves seized animals. In January of 2022, the team spent a Saturday night celebrating at Puppy Prom. However, they were called into action early Sunday morning when their services were required for a home outside Beaver Dam. Unfortunately, the owner had passed away and left 20 dogs running around the home and property. Even though they were on very little sleep and it was the weekend, the entire staff came together to help these animals. It was a long day, but they were able to transport all the dogs to their facility, where they received the grooming, vaccinations, and vet care needed. Every single dog ended up finding a great home.

"Our staff work really hard," Kensie explains. "Everyone is basically on the clock all the time. It can be a dirty, emotional, and hard job, but they all do it because they are dedicated to these animals."

Beyond providing basic care for the pets at the shelter, DCHS staff take the time to get to know the personalities of the animals in their custody. They learn each animal's traits and preferences, and then they get to know the people who are looking to adopt a pet. With patience and knowledge, the staff thoughtfully suggests pets that will meet the adopters' specific lifestyle needs. The outcome is a pet who is placed in the care of the right forever-family, where they will flourish and bring joy and love to their family—and be loved in return.

For community members looking to support the shelter, there are a variety of ways to help out. People can support the Humane Society by making monetary donations at the shelter or on their website, or they can donate pet supplies. Beyond making donations, people can show their support by simply sharing, liking, and commenting on the shelter's social media posts in order to amplify the animals' stories. They can also get involved in things like the fundraising events or even becoming volunteers—walking dogs, socializing cats, or folding the never-ending laundry! The Humane Society also recently launched an online apparel store where people can purchase merchandise to show their support.



"We really appreciate all the support we receive from the community," explains Kensie. "Dodge County is very supportive and generous, and we're proud to be a part of it."

And if you ask around the county, you'll find plenty of people who are thankful for the presence of the Dodge County Humane Society. They have facilitated the fostering and adoption of countless happy pets, and their tireless staff plans to continue this work into the future. It's a mutually beneficial relationship—for the shelter, the community, and the pets.

My husband and I had unexpectedly lost our 12-year-old boxer Lily back in June of 2024. A short time later, my husband suggested we visit the Humane Society to "just look." We spoke with Samantha, an amazing staff member who took the time to listen to us. She suggested Murphy, a dog that was not able to be adopted but was looking for a foster home as he was awaiting an upcoming heart surgery. He had just arrived at the Humane Society that day, and she thought he'd be a great fit for us. Well, she was more than right! We have had him since December 14th and absolutely plan on adopting him once his health is strong enough for him to be adopted. Our experience was incredible, and the staff was amazing. They took the time to understand us and our household, and they were knowledgeable enough to give suggestions on which animals would be a good fit. 

- 2. Vitamin D Particularly important for those who live in regions with limited sunlight (Hello Wisconsin!), vitamin D is crucial for bone health, immune function, and mood regulation. Many people are deficient in vitamin D, especially during the winter months, so a supplement can be an easy solution.
- 3. Omega-3 Fatty Acids These essential fats, found in fish oil, support heart health, brain function, and reduce inflammation. If you don't eat fatty fish regularly, consider adding an omega-3 supplement to your diet. This is the most important to have a high quality supplement. If you tend to burp up your fish oil, it's usually not high enough quality.
- 4. Probiotics Beneficial bacteria in the gut are essential for digestion, immune health, and mental well-being. A quality probiotic supplement can help maintain a healthy balance of gut flora, especially if you've recently taken antibiotics or have digestive issues.
- 5. Magnesium This vital mineral supports muscle function, bone health, and helps manage stress. Many people don't get enough magnesium from their diet, especially those who consume a lot of processed foods.

Supplements are not a one-sizefits-all solution, but they can play an important role in ensuring we nourish our bodies and thrive. By selecting high-quality supplements and making informed choices, we can fill nutritional gaps, support our health, and enhance our overall wellbeing. 

## Physical Therapist & Water Skier Extraordinaire

Gabbie Taschwer, PT, DPT, at Prairie Ridge Health (PRH) in Columbus, has been water skiing for as long as she can remember and on March 21, celebrated her third time competing with Team USA at the 2025 World Ski Show Championships in Mulwala, Australia.

"I believe my first time on the water was at 18 months in my dad's arms, and I started skiing by myself when I was three years old," said Taschwer, who grew up in McFarland, Wisconsin by Lake Waubesa. "My parents were professional water skiers who performed all over the United States and passed down their passion, turning water skiing into a family sport."

Taschwer's water ski career includes over 20 years with the Mad City Ski Team in Madison, Wisconsin, eight years with Tommy Bartlett's Ski Team in Wisconsin Dells, one year with Holiday Park Ski Team in Germany, and two years at SeaWorld in San Antonio, Texas.

"I love that water skiing has no limit and is unique. You can always learn something new, advance a skill in some way, or create your own trick. I love that it is a family-based sport that has allowed me to travel with my family all over the world," said Taschwer. "Water skiing brings together individuals of all different backgrounds and skill sets. I enjoy the challenge of finding everyone's strengths to be able to create the best possible show."

As a Physical Therapist, Taschwer brings this skill set with her to the work environment. "I value feedback from my coaches in water skiing, so I try to replicate that in the physical therapy department for my patients, so I can give them the best care possible," she explained. "No patient is

the same. I can be creative with the exercises to personalize them to the patient and assist those who participate in unique sports."

Taschwer, who started at PRH in 2023, received her Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology from the University of Wisconsin – Madison and her Doctorate of Physical Therapy from Rosalind Franklin University of Medicine in North Chicago, Illinois.

"We have a good medical support system on the ski team," said Taschwer. "We have an occupational therapist and a physical therapy assistant on the team as well. On our home team and Team USA, we lead stretches and warmups. It's nice to help our teammates and make everyone ready for action. It's been awesome building my skills and sharing knowledge with other athletes."

Team USA consists of 35 skiers (17 female and 18 male) and 5 support staff. The competition starts with an individual competition (swivel, jump and doubles) with Taschwer competing in the Women's Freestyle Jump.

"Team USA will be trying to set a world record by having the first all-female four-person front flip off the jump ramp. We have successfully completed this in practice, and we are hoping to execute it in tournament," said Taschwer. "Over the past five years, I have worked alongside several of my teammates to advocate for more opportunities for female jumpers on the jump ramp. We have created an environment where women can compete in freestyle jumping, something that was previously unheard of. This has been a very rewarding and challenging process, and it's exciting to see opportunities for female water skiers grow."


The final days of the competition, March 22-23, include a show ski competition involving a 60-minute themed show performed by countries including Belgium, Canada, Australia and the United States.


And what's next for Gabbie Taschwer after Worlds? She plans to continue using her passion for water skiing with her home team in Madison and within her career as a physical therapist with her team at PRH. "I feel grateful that I have these skills to assist my teammates and my patients. And I'm so grateful for the support PRH gives to its workers who have other passions in their careers. I think that builds a really strong community in the hospital."

The Mad-City Ski team performs Memorial Day through Labor Day on Sundays at 6 p.m. at Law Park by the Monona Terrace in Madison. The shows are free for all ages and are family friendly.

#### **Directions**

Remove ham from oven and let rest, 15 minutes, then slice. Serve with pineapples.



When it comes to the best sunscreen for your face and body, it is most important to use a broad-spectrum sunblock of 50 SPF or higher and then make sure you reapply it.

It can't be stressed enough that the best thing people can do is find a sunscreen they like and get in the habit of applying it. Once they are in the habit of using it, they'll start to recognize the moments when they forget to apply it.



#### Reapplying sunscreen

After you initially apply your sunscreen, it is important to reapply. Read individual directions for reapplication instructions.

Some like to use a cream or lotion in the morning before hands and body are sweaty from the heat. Then, they can reapply.

Waterproof and sweat-proof sunscreens also should be reapplied, because regardless of sunscreen claims, anything applied in the morning will be gone by afternoon.


#### More sun block tips

## Sandi Paws to the Rescue!

When Victoria (Vicky) Timreck of Fond du Lac lost her 16-year-old dog Sandi, she mourned the loss terribly. But, from that sad experience, a noble cause emerged. Vicky founded a dog rescue operation she named Sandi Paws Rescue. Launched in 2014, Sandi Paws Rescue began on the front porch of Vicky's home. During the first 10 years, 9,000 dogs and cats have been adopted by eager families.

Six years later, Vicky's husband Ron Timreck passed away. "He helped me so much with Sandi Paws Rescue, and his wish was that I, along with my co-founder Nancy Ward, would keep the program going."

"My husband was my soul mate, and Sandi was my dog soulmate," Vicky said, noting Sandi was a female Shetland Sheepdog (Sheltie). As a therapy dog, Sandi visited places like nursing homes, prisons, children's hospitals, and schools with Vicky. "The day we put her down, we were at the library and the kids were reading to her. She couldn't see or hear them anymore but she knew where she was. She knew the kids were around her in a circle, and she would put her paw on the pages."

Her husband's passing and his wish made Vicky more determined than ever to take Sandi Paws Rescue to new heights.

In memory of her husband, Vicky established Papa T's Pet Pantry. The idea is that people struggling financially to feed their pet, can come and get pet food for free any time of the day. A pet pantry is outside the building.

Eventually, Sandi Paws Rescue moved from Vicky's home to a building on Main Street in Fond du Lac. At the start of this year, a building was purchased on West Ninth Street. None of the locations are used to house the rescued dogs and cats. Instead, the buildings are used for offices, supplies, donations and equipment. Eventually there will be a dog bath and dog classes on site.

As a foster-based, non-profit, all-volunteer run organization, Sandi Paws places the dogs and cats with foster families until they are adopted. Large adoption events such as those held monthly at the Fond du Lac County Fairgrounds may result in a dog or cat getting adopted on the spot. But those not getting adopted at an event are fostered by pet-loving families in the area and around the state.

"We have an amazing group of volunteers and foster families," Vicky said. We are 100% volunteer-based, and there are no paid employees."

While some of the dogs and cats at Sandi Paws Rescue are "owner surrenders" pets that come from owners voluntarily giving up their pet for valid reasons – most are dogs and cats rescued from Alabama and Mississippi. Many are pets that have been abandoned.

"Down south, some run loose or people dump an unwanted pet



off in the middle of a wooded area," Vicky said. "We have found a basket of puppies along the side of road; a dog tied to tree, puppies struggling without a mother, dogs rescued because people just desert them."

"Some come with issues we work really hard to fix," Vicky said. "One of my own dogs is terrified of pick-up trucks. Some literally have to be carried into homes until they feel safe."



"Sometimes they are fine. Once they know they are safe, they blossom into a wonderful family member. We get them to wherever they need to be before we find them the right home. We don't pick and choose. A dog in need, is a dog in need."

One happy dog owner, Nicole Rindy, from the Madison area, got her forever dog, Cobbler, from Sandi Paws Rescue in 2021. "We always had a family dog growing up and I wanted a furry friend to keep me company while living on my own after college," Nicole said, noting she also knew having a dog would help get her out of the house and live a more active lifestyle due to daily dog walks.

Browsing on the internet she found Sandi Paws Rescue and started looking at photos and the background story of the dogs up for adoption.

"There were so many cute balls of fluff, but one really caught my eye," Nicole said. "It was this adorable 4 month-old cream colored boy with blue eyes, a pink nose, and floppy ears. His name was Cobbler. I wasn't originally looking for a male dog, but he was too cute to resist."


She applied immediately and heard back from Sandi Paws Rescue the next day. "They explained that Cobbler was coming up to Wisconsin from Alabama in a van with a bunch of other furry friends and that I could meet him when he got here in a couple of days."

Nicole picked up Cobbler from a foster family in Fox Lake who had him for just the first night after he arrived from Alabama - a day late due to a snow storm that delayed the trip.

"I was fairly certain I wanted to adopt Cobbler, but meeting him at the foster family's home sealed the deal," Nicole said. She notes that Cobbler, who turns 5 this October, enjoys going for walks, swimming, hiking, playing fetch, and doing zoomies in the snow. "And he howls when he hears emergency sirens."

As Sandi Paws prepares to move into their new location in Fond du Lac, Vicky said volunteers are stepping forward to help. Donations to Sandi Paws and fundraising by the organization enabled Sandi Paws to purchase the Ninth Street location.

"It will allow our organization to consolidate operations and provide a location for animal adoptions that occurs outside of monthly intake events," Vicky said, noting that volunteers are needed to help finalize the laundry room, the dog wash (which will be open to the public) and the landscaping. 
