

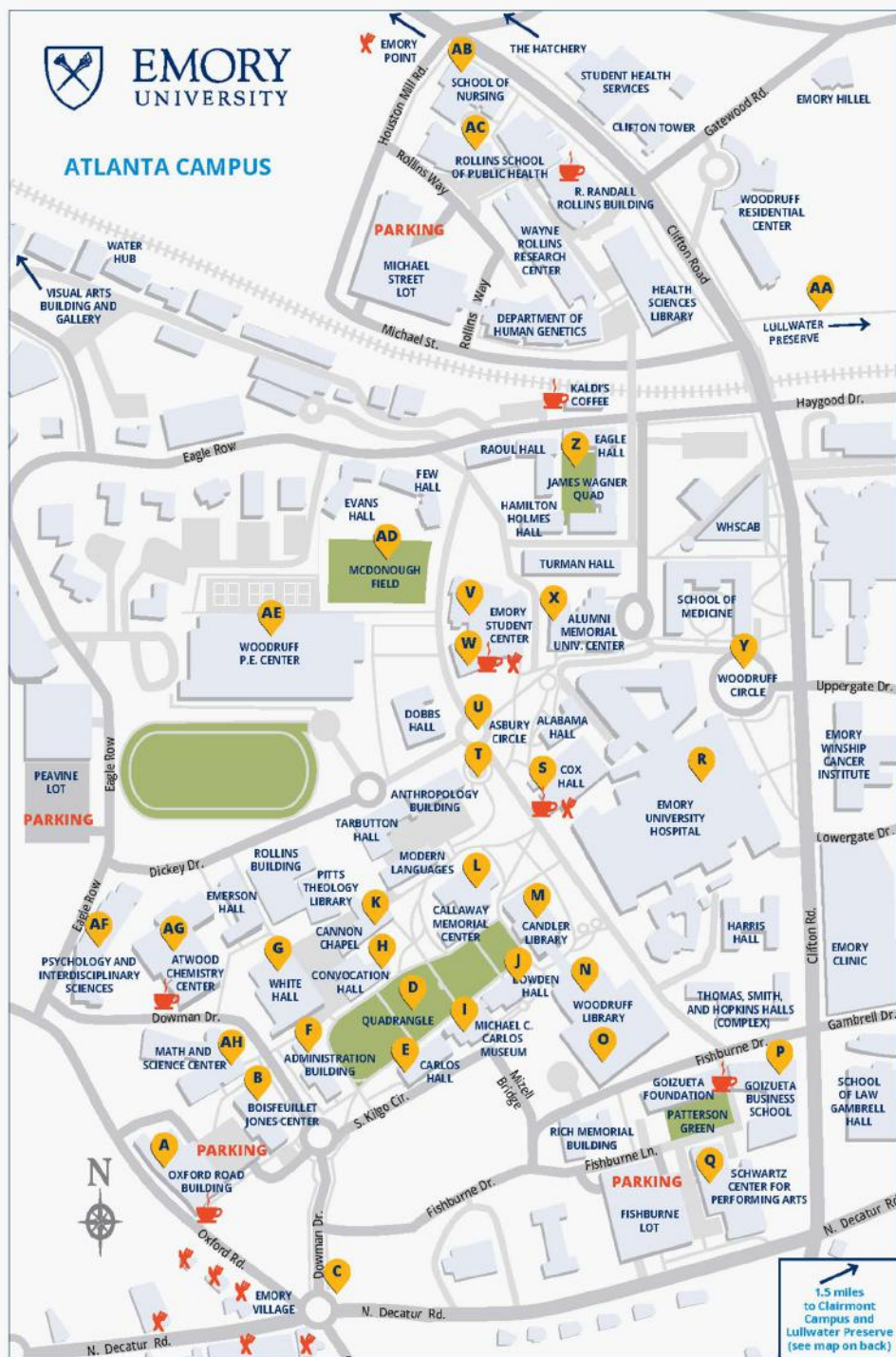

A. OXFORD ROAD BUILDING (ORB)

Home to the Office of Undergraduate Admission, a Barnes and Noble bookstore, and one of the largest collegiate Starbucks in the U.S.

B. BOISFEUILLET JONES CENTER

Hosts Financial Aid, the Bursar, and the Pathways Center—Emory's hub for career and post-grad planning.

C. HAYGOOD-HOPKINS GATE

This 1937 landmark honors Emory's Oxford roots and is a favorite photo spot symbolizing the university's history.

D. THE QUADRANGLE (QUAD)

The heart of campus life and tradition—students study, relax, and gather here. Each May, it hosts Commencement for thousands.

E. MICHAEL C. CARLOS HALL

Built in 1919, this historic building now houses Art History and classroom spaces, featuring Georgia marble and a grand staircase.

F. ADMINISTRATION BUILDING

Contains the Provost's office and core administrative leadership of the university.

G. WHITE HALL

One of Emory's main lecture buildings. While large classes meet here, the typical Emory class size is around 25 students.

H. CONVOCATION HALL

A historic venue with Italian Renaissance design. It houses the President's office and hosts major campus events.

I. MICHAEL C. CARLOS MUSEUM

A major art and cultural institution with global collections—from ancient Egypt to contemporary works.

J. HENRY L. BOWDEN HALL

Home to History and Philosophy. Named after the trustee who led Emory's legal fight for racial integration in 1962.

K. CANNON CHAPEL

Emory's spiritual heart welcomes all faiths, hosting 20+ religious groups and university events like concerts and weddings.

L. CALLAWAY CENTER

Home to multiple academic departments and the Writing Center, where students across disciplines get expert writing support.

M. CANDLER LIBRARY

Named for Coca-Cola founder Asa Candler, this building houses the Dean's Office, Matheson Reading Room, and Education Abroad, offering 90+ programs in 40+ countries.

N. WOODRUFF LIBRARY

Emory's largest library spans ten stories and offers extensive study spaces, classrooms, and digital resources.

O. STUART A. ROSE LIBRARY

Located on the 9th and 10th floors of Woodruff, this rare books library features collections from civil rights leaders, historic letters from President Obama, and more—with sweeping views of Atlanta.

P. GOIZUETA BUSINESS SCHOOL

Home to the BBA program, offering core concentrations and specializations like health innovation, arts, and environmental management.

Q. SCHWARTZ PERFORMING ARTS CENTER

Hosts 300+ public events annually across seven arts disciplines including music, theater, and film.

R. EMORY UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL AND PARTNERS

Steps from class, students engage in research, shadowing, and service at top institutions like the CDC, Children's Healthcare, and Winship Cancer Institute.

S. COX HALL

Campus life hub with a global food court, tech center, and identity-based spaces like Centro Latinx and LGBT Life.

T. DOOLEY STATUE

Emory's quirky, unofficial mascot has been celebrated since 1899. Each spring, Dooley's Week honors this "Lord of Misrule."

U. ASBURY CIRCLE

The social crossroads of campus, featuring events like Wonderful Wednesdays and a weekly farmers market.

V. EMORY STUDENT CENTER (ESC)

The sustainability-designed ESC houses event spaces, Dobbs Common Table dining hall, Kaldi's Coffee, and student life offices.

W. DINING AT EMORY

From Dobbs Common Table to the Farmers Market, meal plans offer flexibility with swipes, Dooley Dollars, and Eagle Dollars.

X. AMUC

A hub for student clubs, support services, Harland Cinema, and the Mary Gray Munroe Theater.

Y. WOODRUFF TRANSIT CIRCLE

Emory shuttles connect students to city spots, errands, and off-campus fun with ease.

Z. RESIDENTIAL QUAD AND HALLS

Eight first-year dorms foster community, each staffed by RAs and Sophomore Advisors. All first- and second-year students live on campus.

AA. LULLWATER PRESERVE

Located on Emory's Atlanta campus, this 154-acre wildlife preserve features Candler Lake, a 210-foot suspension bridge, and miles of scenic trails—no public roads, just green space and tranquility.

AB. NELL HODGSON WOODRUFF SCHOOL OF NURSING

BSN students begin their nursing coursework in junior year after completing prerequisites at Emory or Oxford College. One of the top-ranked nursing schools in the U.S., the program emphasizes hands-on learning and global service—delivering 40,000 hours of care to over 7,400 clients annually in underserved communities.

AC. HEALTH SCIENCES QUAD

Across the "biology bridge," this quad includes the School of Nursing, Rollins School of Public Health, research labs, classrooms, and a library—central to studies in biology, human health, and public health.

AD. MCDONOUGH FIELD

Nestled near residence halls and the Student Center, this recreational hub hosts intramural sports, concerts, and major campus events like Homecoming and Dooley's Week.

AE. WOODRUFF PHYSICAL EDUCATION CENTER (WOODPEC)

The heart of Emory athletics, WoodPEC features basketball and tennis courts, a climbing wall, an Olympic pool, fitness studios, and more. It's also home to Songfest, a beloved first-year tradition.

AF. PSYCHOLOGY AND INTERDISCIPLINARY SCIENCES (PAIS)

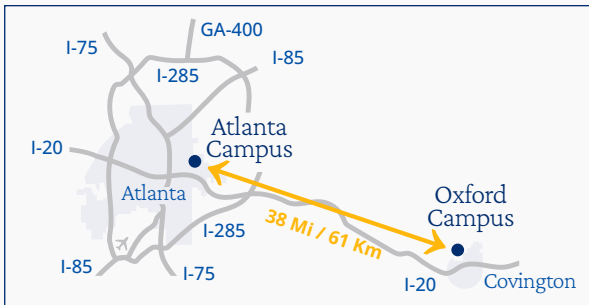
A 118,000-square-foot facility supporting advanced teaching and research in psychology, neuroscience, and interdisciplinary sciences.

AG. ATWOOD CHEMISTRY CENTER

Built to integrate classroom and lab learning, Atwood features glass-walled labs that make science visible and engaging. Its "Science Commons" atrium is a favorite study space for students across disciplines.

AH. MATH AND SCIENCE CENTER (MSC)

Home to computer science, environmental science, math, and physics, MSC includes classrooms, labs, a planetarium, telescope, library, and faculty offices—all under one roof for immersive STEM learning.
