


As the end of the 2024/25 academic year approaches, applications-wise it is a positive picture looking

WULFRUN SHOPPING CENTRE SEASONAL EMPLOYMENT SCHEME

Retailers in the Wulfrun Shopping Centre have called upon the college to help recruit staff for the busy Christmas period following the success of a







similar scheme last year.

Leading retailers Primark, Poundland, Warren James and Banana Republic have worked with the college and the Department for Work and Pensions to develop a free two-week training programme to equip local people with the skills and knowledge needed to work in the retail sector.

Sessions will cover an introduction to customer service and retail, teamwork, communication, behaviours in the workplace, safeguarding, equality and diversity, as well as producing a CV, searching and applying for vacancies, preparing for an interview and experiencing 'real-life' scenarios through the use of BodySWAP AI technology.

All those completing the programme will be guaranteed an interview with the participating retailers for a range of seasonal roles.

PROMOTING CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Students got a taste of the wide variety of employment opportunities available when they complete their course at a Careers Day at the Paget Road campus.

Representatives from the Army, animal care, engineering and healthcare sectors, as well as higher education training providers and careers advisers attended the event to share their experiences and give advice on the qualities needed to work in a range of roles or progress to the next level of study.

This event was hosted in collaboration with Innovate UK and Skills West Midlands & Warwickshire.


Members of the business, learning and technology team have written a book to help businesses navigate the latest advancements in artificial intelligence.




shape learning, future careers and daily life, looking at how it is currently used in college, how it might help to personalise learning, improve online safety and support ethical decision making.

Students working towards qualifications in performing arts attended a religious literacy workshop to look at how faith and belief are part of further education.


Four of the students then provided character voiceovers for an animation on the subject of religion which is now available on OpenLearn, the Open University's free learning platform.
