After being selected by Michele Obama to serve as the White House Florist, where she spent six years raising the bar by using flowers as diplomatic tools, Ms. Dowling wrote two books and has spent recent months on a tour with *Good Morning America*. She is the recipient of the American Horticultural Society's Great American Gardener Award for achievements and contributions in floristry, and is a featured speaker at leading flower shows, museums, and cultural institutions across the country. In 2016, she received the Distinguished Flower Ambassador award from the Royal Horticultural Society of Belgium at a ceremony honoring international floral diplomacy in Ghent, Belgium. A native of Chehalis, Washington, Laura received her B.A. degree in political science and M.PA from the University of Washington in Seattle.

Xavier Cortada

Miami's pioneer eco-artist, Xavier Cortada uses the power of art to engage communities in problem-solving. From the White House to the World Bank, at the North and South Poles, and across six continents, his work includes more than 150 public artworks, installations, collaborative murals and socially engaged projects.

In 2007, as a National Science Foundation Antarctic Artists and Writers Program Fellow, Cortada used the moving ice sheet beneath the South Pole as an instrument to mark time; the art piece will be completed in 150,000 years. Through the Xavier Cortada Foundation, the artist involves communities in hands-on campaigns that generate awareness and inspire action around the climate crisis and other social justice issues.

Xavier Cortada is Professor of Practice: Artist at the University of Miami as a faculty member of the Department of Art and Art History (with secondary appointments in the university's Miller School of Medicine Department of Pediatrics and School of Law).



He was recently recognized by the St. Johns Riverkeeper, Inc. as the St. Johns River Advocate of the Year. His passion for the river led him to chair a Putnam County committee to establish the Bartram Trail in Putnam County which became a National Recreational Trail. He served two terms as a governor's appointment to the Florida Greenways & Trails Council. He is pursuing the establishment of the Bartram Trail National Heritage Corridor covering all 2,500 miles of Bartram's travels over southeastern U.S.

Mike Adams is a conservation ecologist, researcher, educator, and author. He holds a bachelor's degree in biology, with studies in anthropology, and a master's degree in environmental management. He has lived and worked in Northeast Florida for 41 years, spanning roles in state government, consulting, education, and nonprofits.
