Zero Hunger

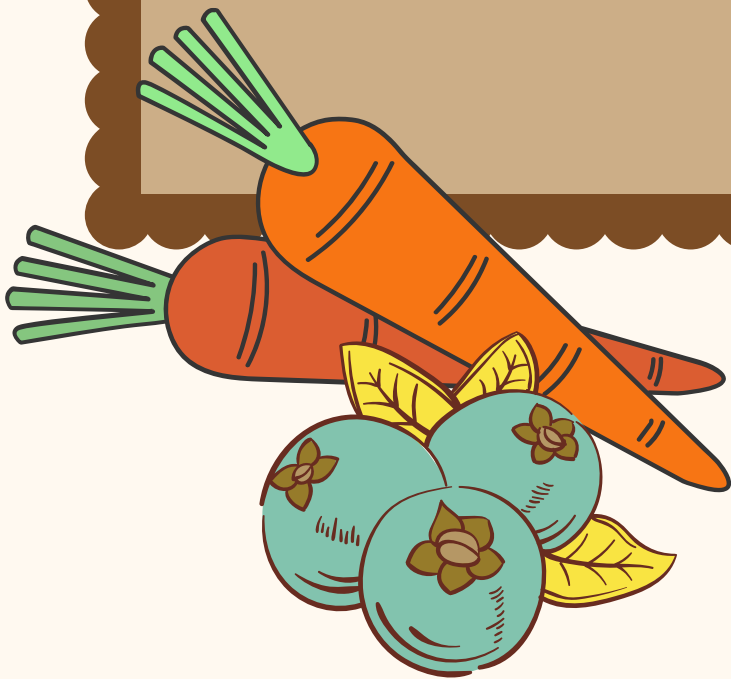

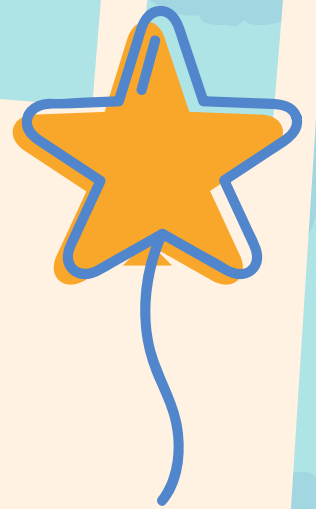
Climate Action

Dear Swara,

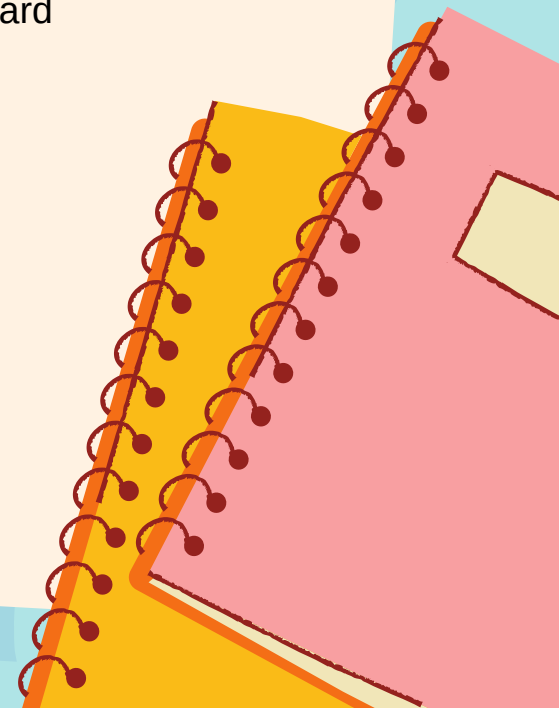
