# MORE GRAND SLAAN SUCCESS

The recent victories by Omar Jasika and Marc Polmans mean that Kooyong Foundation players currently hold three of the eight Grand Slam junior titles.

Foundation Chairman, Peter Quinn, congratulated Marc on becoming a Grand Slam champion. "Marc has worked extremely hard at developing his game and is now enjoying the reward for his efforts," Peter said. "Omar, too, is a committed and determined young player with great potential. I'd like to think that both these young men have benefited not only from the coaching and other help they have received but also from the warm and friendly atmosphere at Kooyong."

Kooyong President Peter Carew was equally delighted with Marc's victory and the club's unprecedented achievement of claiming three Grand Slams. "Kooyong deserves its title as the 'Spiritual Home of Australian Tennis'," he said. "Our club doesn't simply provide for the needs of its members but takes a positive role in promoting the development of young players."

Marc and Jake Delaney looked long odds to win the doubles final at Melbourne Park when they crashed to a 0/6 result in the first set against Hubert Hurkacz of Poland and Alex Molcan from Slovakia.

However, they came out firing in the second set, teaming together like a well-oiled doubles combination, to claim the set comfortably at 6/2.

#### KOOYONG DESERVES ITS TITLE AS THE SPIRITUAL HOME OF AUSTRALIAN TENNIS.

The result was decided in an exciting Super Tiebreak with the Aussie boys showing coolness under pressure to triumph 10/8.

Although they had played together on occasions in the past, Marc and Jake, from NSW, came together in unusual circumstances for the Australian Open. Marc was expecting to play with South Korean Duck Hee Lee, with whom he had reached the quarters at the US Open, but on the eve of the tournament Lee told him he was playing with a fellow countryman.

> Marc seemed stuck but quickly sought out his mate Jake. "I messaged Jake on Facebook asking if he had a doubles partner and he said, 'No, let's play,' so it was great to play with another Aussie guy," Marc explained.

"We somehow drew the No.1 seeds in the first round, so we thought, 'Let's play one match and see how it goes.'

"We scraped through the super (tiebreak) and somehow just kept it rolling from there.

"Jake and I worked really well as a team under pressure and it was just great fun to play with him and win a junior Grand Slam doubles.

"It is, obviously, a great thing and to do it in Australia in front of my friends and family was a great moment." Jake said the pair had plenty of experience playing together in the under 12 and under 14 ranks, team well together and maintain a positive attitude even when things aren't going their way on court. He was full of praise for Marc's court craft. "He's the doubles specialist, I'm happy to always play with him. I don't think there are too many better doubles players out there than him. He's got some pretty unreal hands at the net.

"Some other guys I've played with, you sort of get down and the teamwork just sort of stops, that doesn't really happen with Marc."

The title capped off a great tournament for 17-year-old Marc from East Brighton. Earlier in the week he had fought through to the quarter final of the singles, finally bowing out to the Number One seed and ultimate champion Roman Safiullin, whose big serve troubled all opponents.

The Foundation also saw a number of its players progress through the early rounds of the Open. Brilliant youngster Destanee Aiava, still just 14, won two rounds of the girls singles before losing to the 17-year-old fourth seed, Aliona Bolsova Zadoinov from Spain.

Destanee, who is rated one of Australia's brightest hopes for the future, makes a habit of playing against much older opposition. Kooyong members might recall her astonishing performance a couple of years back when at the age of 12 she reached the open women's singles final of the Club Championships.

Kooyong's Andrew Whittington and John Peers were others to shine at Melbourne Park. Andrew made the third round of the men's doubles with Alex Bolt, backing up his quarterfinal run from last year. They went down 7/6 7/6.



John also reached the third round of the doubles with Scot Jamie Murray before they went down after winning the first set against the number four seeds.

John also made the quarterfinals of the mixed doubles with Casey Delacqua, losing to the top seeds.

Both Peter Carew and Peter Quinn thanked Kooyong Members and friends for their ongoing support for the Foundation. Since it was founded 13 years ago the Foundation has raised more than \$1 million, assisted more than 300 junior players and has helped to secure much of the memorabilia that is now such an integral part of the new clubhouse.

In January the Club and Foundation were recognised by Tennis Victoria for their outstanding contribution to the sport, in particular the assistance given to Omar Jasika. At a function attended by representatives of 350 tennis clubs, the US Junior Open title holder presented Peter Carew with a framed photograph of himself on his way to victory at Flushing Meadow. He also thanked Kooyong for its role in launching his career.

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### 2015 PRICELINE PHARMACY CLASSIC VERDASCO VANASCO VANASCO SECOND SECOND CLASSIC TITLE

Fernando Verdasco won his second Priceline Pharmacy Kooyong Classic title to join Michael Chang, Andre Agassi and Andy Roddick as multiple winners of this event.

The opening set of the final was an absolute thriller as both men fought out every point and pushed the set to a tiebreak which Verdasco squeaked through 7-3, before Dolgopolov conceded the match due to a right knee injury.

A Kooyong Classic champion in 2010, Verdasco said he was delighted to win a second title at the historic club. "I love playing here and for me it's great coming back every year," said the world No.33. "Alex is a good friend and I have good relationship with him and you never want something like what happened today. I don't want to win the tournament like this of course and I just wish him to recover and to be able to play next week. I'm feeling good after my week here which is the most important thing for me and hopefully I will play a good Australian Open."

In the play-off for third and fourth place, Richard Gasquet saw off 2014 champion and world No.5 Kei Nishikori in straight sets 7-6 7-6 and said his win over the world No.5 had bolstered his confidence. "I'm feeling good. I practice well this week - playing three matches in the row - so I think I'm in good form, so we will see what will happen at the Australian Open, but I think I'm ready to play well there," said Gasquet.

It was a slightly different event to past years with a full day's play being abandoned due to rain on the Tuesday. This forced the change in format which saw the two dominant winners from Wednesday move through to the final while the other two winners played off for third and fourth. With this in mind, Wednesday's schedule kicked off with Kei Nishikori taking on Australian Open Wildcard Playoff winner Jordan Thompson and the young Australian continued from where he left off at the Kooyong Classic in 2014 by serving it up to the big guns.

Nishikori took out a tight first set before Thompson responded by winning the second set and then pushing Nishikori all the way to the third set tiebreaker where he finally got over the line 6/4 3/6 7/6. Verdasco then came out firing against Frenchman Gilles Simon and quickly raced out to a 6/2 lead before Simon began to fight back but it was to no avail as Verdasco won the second set in a tiebreaker.

In the third match on court, Dolgopolov took on Serbia's Filip Krajinovic and quickly showed his class as he won in straight sets 6/4 6/3 while Richard Gasquet then battled it out with Spain's Feliciano Lopez.

This match could have gone either way but it was Gasquet that came out in front in the first set tiebreak before Lopez took the second set 6/3.


Gasquet then turned it up a notch in the final set to win 7/6 3/6 6/2 and move into the playoff for third and fourth.

With the finalists decided, Thursday's schedule included three fantastic matches as Gilles Simon got past Filip Krajinovic 6/4 6/3 before Australia's Jordan Thompson upset Feliciano Lopez 7/6 6/3.

The crowd was then treated to an exhibition match between America's John Isner and James Ward from the UK and it was the young Brit who came out on top 3/6 7/6 6/2.

## ANDRINOPOULOS WINS FIRST TITLE & BIDMEADE MAKES IT THREE

The Club Championships again proved to be a highlight on the Club's sporting calendar as more than 470 members battled heat, rain and even court surface changes for the chance to hold aloft the trophy in their respective grade at the upcoming Champions' Dinner.

Some familiar names rose to the top while we were also guaranteed a first time winner from the Ladies Open Singles final.

Annabelle Andrinopoulos and Katerina Valos played off for the title and both came into the final via starkly different paths with Andrinopoulos fighting past Isabelle Gemmel and Binasa Beslagic in three sets while Valos found a smoother path into the final after defeating Molly Polak in two tight sets in a quarterfinal and Samyuktha Rajagopalan in straight sets in the semi final.

The final was always going to be a tough match as both girls knew each other well but it was Andrinopoulos who had her nose in front throughout.

After breaking at 4 all to take the first set 6/4, Andrinopoulos continued to go for her shots and pushed hard to finish the match in straight sets which she was able to do by winning the second set 6/3 to claim her first Open Singles title at the Club.

It was a proud moment for the long time Kooyong Foundation Scholarship holder who has recently agreed to go to the University of Colorado in August alongside fellow Scholarship holder Brigitte Beck. In the Men's Open Singles final, David Bidmeade was looking to win his third title in five years while also hoping to add a second triple crown to his list of titles at the Club.

In his way was a returning junior star in James Sheppard, who had surprised a few on his way to the final but never looked out of place, and showed he'll be a great asset to the Club in the upcoming Pennant season.

Sheppard made his way past another returning player in Mitch Burman before defeating Codey Gunn in straight sets and Daniel Nickels in three sets to reach the final.

Bidmeade's tough semi final with Matthew Nickels seemed to steel him for a big final and he showed all of his experience in the final to defeat the gallant Sheppard 6/2 6/3 to win his third singles title and join the likes of Trevor Little and Wayne Cowley on the same number.

In the Men's Open Doubles, Bidmeade and Andrew Coelho lived up to their top seeding to defeat the Nickels brothers, Daniel and Matthew, in a close final 6/3 6/4 and to bring Bidmeade's match count to four for the day with the Mixed Doubles still to come. The Ladies Open Doubles final was a glimpse of the future as Samyuktha Rajagopalan and Stephanie Serafidis tried to usurp the title from the experienced duo of Laura Langmead and Kate Antosik.

The title holders were slow to get going as the younger pair took the first set in impressive fashion 6/2 but from there the tables turned as Langmead and Antosik asserted their authority on the match to win a third straight doubles title together 2/6 6/2 6/2.

In the Open Mixed Doubles, David Bidmeade his second triple crown, after also completing the feat in 2011, with a tough straight sets win with long time partner Molly Polak over Mitch Burman and Laura Rabinovich 6/3 6/4.

The Polak and Bidmeade partnership has been a fruitful one over the years having now won their fourth title together in the past five years while that made it six Mixed Doubles titles overall for Bidmeade.

The under 21's events were again keenly contested and it was great to see Katerina Valos get her hands on the silverware after again defeating Samyuktha Rajagopalan in straight sets 6/2 6/2.



The dominant performance topped off a very successful event for the now 18 year old and she looks to be set for a big year.

In the Boy's Under21 Singles it was Jeremy Taylor who took out the title after defeating Luka Cancar in the final 6/4 6/0.

Cancar had a great win over Men's Open finalist James Sheppard in the semi final but Taylor showed his huge potential with a dominant win and a great performance across his various events during the Club Championships.

Other highlights included the wins of Elizabeth Peers and Ian Anderson in the Over 50's Singles events while some of the junior events were again keenly contested and some fantastic tennis was on show by the next generation of stars at the Club.

#### TIPS ON TECHNIQUE

Spread your fingers as widely as possible to form a firm base, keep the bridge very still, and hit down on the cue ball, keeping the cue as flat as possible even so. Always aim in the middle of the cue ball, so that swerve is not imparted to the white ball. Also hit the cue ball as softly as you dare.
