When you see a man wearing the fez of a Shriner, know that he is first a Master Mason. He is a member of one of our 206 Masonic lodges in Kansas. Freemasonry provides its members with an uncommon camaraderie and a zeal for charity expressed in three basic, but profound tenets: Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth.

We have established a longstanding tradition of serving our communities through quiet philanthropy, advancing the welfare of others, particularly children and senior citizens. This week, it has been all about the children served by Shriners Children's Hospitals.

On behalf of the Masons of Kansas, thank you for taking the time to attend this Kansas Shrine All-Star Event. On and around the arena of competition, the outstanding young athletes know that this is much more than a game. They compete so other children can walk. We are grateful for their participation and your support for this great cause.

As Masons, our mysteries and symbolism have profound significance and teach immeasurable lessons to men of all walks of life. Its principles and ethics are based on the belief that each man has a responsibility to improve himself while being devoted to his family, faith, country, and fraternity. If you have a Masonic Lodge in your town, you are most fortunate to have the greatest and most enduring fraternal organization close by. The Masonic fraternity is comprised of adult men, age eighteen and older, of good moral character from every country, religion, race, age, social strata, education, and opinion, who profess a belief in a Supreme Being.

Masons will not engage in recruitment. If you are interested in becoming a Mason, you must first seek out your local lodge or any Mason, knock on their door, and ask for more information. Start your quest at kansasmason.org or on Facebook at facebook.com/kansasmasons.

The Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine for North America is an international fraternity of approximately 610,000 members who belong to 191 Shrine Temples throughout North America. Thirteen Masons founded the Shrine in New York City in 1872 on the basis of the Masonic principles of brotherly love, relief and truth. They adopted the requirement that only a 32nd degree Scottish Rite Mason or Knights Templar York Rite Mason can petition to become a Noble of the Mystic Shrine.

The basic organizational unit of the Shrine is the Temple, or local chapter, which is governed by an elected board called the Divan. The Divan is headed by the Potentate, who is the presiding officer of the Temple. All Shrine Temples are subordinate to the Imperial Council, which meets annually. The Imperial Council is composed of Representatives elected by each Temple, past and present Imperial Officers, and Emeritus Representatives. The Imperial Divan, the Shrine's governing board, is headed by the **Imperial Potentate and consists of 13** elected officers. A new officer is elected to the Imperial Divan each year and moves up one rung in succeeding years. Only the Imperial Treasurer and Imperial Recorder do not move up but are generally re-elected to their current posts.

The Shrine's best-known symbol is the distinctive red fez that Shriners wear at official functions. The fez derives its name from the city of Fez, Morocco, and was chosen as part of the Shrine's Arabic (Near East) theme, which was developed by the two men who were the driving force behind the new order: Walter M. Fleming, a prominent New York physician, and Billy Florence, a popular actor. Both men knew the fledgling fraternity needed an appealing backdrop against which the color and pageantry of the Shrine could be played out.

Legend has it that Florence conceived of the Arabic theme when he attended a party in Marseilles, France, hosted by an Arabian diplomat. At the

end of the party, guests became members of a secret society in an elaborate ceremony. Florence realized that this might be the ideal vehicle for the new fraternity, and he made copious notes and drawings of the ceremony.

When Florence returned to the U.S., he showed his material to Fleming, and together the two mean created the rituals, designed the emblem and costumes, and formulated the salutation. The first Shrine Temple -**Mecca Temple - was organized in New** York City, and the new fraternity was on its way. The turn of the century brought a dramatic increase in Shrine membership and a growing desire for an official Shrine philanthropy. Individual Temples had always supported various charitable causes, but now the Shrine was ready for its own philanthropic cause. Thus was born, in 1922, the first **Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children,** dedicated to providing excellent medical care to children with orthopedic diseases and injuries, at no cost to the patients, their parents or any third party.

The concept was so successful, and the potential for helping children so great, that additional Shriners
Hospitals followed the first, and the hospital network had expanded to the point that the Shrine separately incorporated its philanthropy, creating a wholly distinct charitable corporation to distinguish its philanthropic activities from its fraternal activities.

During the 1950's, Shriners began looking for other ways they could help children, and they became aware of the lack of medical expertise in burn care. Each year, thousands of children are injured, disfigured, or killed by this tragic hazard of childhood.

Thus, 40 years after opening its first Shriners Hospital, the Shrine opened its three Shriners Burns Institutes, each with the three-fold purpose of helping children, conducting burn research, and training medical personnel in the treatment of burns.

Today, there are 19 orthopedic **Shriners Hospitals and three Shriners Burns Institutes located throughout the** United States, Canada and Mexico. In 1996. Shrine Representatives voted to change the name of the Shrine's official philanthropy to Shriners Hospitals for Children, reflecting the wider range of services provided by these special hospitals. In 2020, Shrine Representatives voted to adapt the new name of Shriners Children's and specialize in care for a range of orthopedic issues, as well as care for burn injuries, craniofacial conditions, spine care and spinal cord injuries, colorectal and gastrointestinal care, and sports medicine.

All 22 Shriners Hospitals adhere to the principles laid down in 1922 - providing high-quality specialty medical care to the children under 18 and families who come to us, regardless of their ability to pay or insurance status.

Today, the Shrine and its hospitals, while maintaining their separate legal and financial identities, are inextricably linked through the Shrine's continuing support of Shriners Hospitals, which have become known as the "heart and soul of the Shrine."

Shriners Children's™ is a unique healthcare system with a reputation for finding answers and giving families hope. To fill a need in the field of pediatric burn care, in the 1960s we established programs focusing on children's burn injuries and related conditions. Shriners Children's continues to be a pioneer in pediatric burn treatment.

In the early 1980s, our organization began the nation's first pediatric spinal cord injury rehabilitation programs, which offer patients a complete range of services to help promote recovery to the fullest extent possible. Shriners Children's also offers comprehensive care for children with cleft lip and palate and craniofacial conditions.

All of our patients receive individualized care plans. Our multidisciplinary teams offer hope and healing to families by finding ways to help patients meet their goals and reach for their dreams.

GROUNDBREAKING RESEARCH AND DISCOVERIES

Shriners Children's is committed to staying at the forefront of pediatric research. What began as a small research effort with a budget of \$12,000 is now a sophisticated, multimillion-dollar program with international recognition. Over the years, our researchers have made significant breakthroughs, including in burn care, congenital neuromuscular disorders, craniofacial conditions, orthopedics, spine care and sports injuries. We're breaking ground in some of the most innovative areas of healthcare, including genetics and motion analysis. 

KERRIGAN'S DRIVE TO WIN LED TO LIFE-CHANGING DIAGNOSIS

A thank you is never enough for what the Shriners Hospital for Children did for me.'

errigan is a competitor. She knows that to be true, down deep in her bones.

That competitive nature is, in fact, how she became a patient of Shriners Children's St. Louis. She was playing basketball during her freshmen year of high school when a ball was loose on the hardwood. She went after the ball aggressively. However, at that same moment, so did an opponent. Kerrigan

was pushed down onto the court and felt her back "pop."

After the game, Kerrigan laid down to stretch and realized she was stuck. An emergency room visit offered what would become a misdiagnosis that led to a year and a half of misguided physical therapy. Her condition worsened.

On her worse days, Kerrigan couldn't even get out of bed.

Eventually, Kerrigan was diagnosed with scoliosis, spondylolisthesis and pars defect of the spine (stress fracture of L3/L4/L5 vertebrae).

That's when she landed 650 miles from her hometown of Goodland, Kansas, at Shriners Children's St. Louis. It was an experience that changed her life, and her heart. "I saw kids missing limbs smiling and laughing all over the place. These kids were facing more than I ever had or ever would," said Kerrigan.

Spine specialist Michael Kelly, M.D., confirmed her



diagnosis and she was quickly fitted for her new back brace, which she cleverly named BOB. For years, she wore "BOB" for four hours a day.

Thanks to that treatment plan, one fracture is completely healed today. The other two fractures will require surgical intervention. Kerrigan will have to decide, in the future, if she wants to undergo surgery. "I still live with pain every day. However, the pain is nowhere near

the level I was dealing with," she said.

She is thankful and eager to give back. Every year, she sends gift cards to the hospital, to be used by patient families. Kerrigan also served as a Patient Ambassador at the Kansas Shrine Bowl, helping to host the "hospital experience." It's a way for football players, cheerleaders and marching band members who are involved in the event to make a connection to the Shriners Children's mission.

"A thank you is never enough for what the Shriners Hospital for Children did for me," said Kerrigan.

After high school, Kerrigan went on to play golf at Ft. Hays State University in Hays, Kansas. She had a successful three years with the team and will spend her senior year focusing on finishing her elementary education degree and student teaching requirements.

Her dream is to teach in her hometown (alongside her parents who are also educators) and coach high school golf.

Damon Parker took over the Washburn Rural boys wrestling program in 2011. From 2019-2021 he coached the boys and girls wrestling teams, and in 2021 Washburn Rural became the first school in United States history to win a large-class boys' and girls' state championship in the same season. Coach Parker and his wife/head assistant coach Lindsay have led Rural to four girl's state championships in the past five years and have a 46-1 dual record with the girls program. Coach Parker left the field of education in 2022 to lead The Jones Project, a nonprofit organization focused on teen mental health and suicide prevention.

Jay Johnston began his coaching career as an assistant coach for Warsaw High School from 2005-2006. Coach Johnston joined the coaching staff at his high school alma mater at Leavenworth High School in 2006 and was named the head men'swrestling coach at Leavenworth in 2008. Coach Johnston led the Leavenworth program from 2008-2015. In 2017, Coach Johnston was named an assistant coach for Basehor-Linwood High School, and was shortly thereafter named the Head Women's wrestling coach at Basehor-Linwood in 2018. Coach Johnston led Basehor-Linwood to a fifth place finish at the 2024 girls state tournament, including five state medalists. Coach Johnston is a three-time United Kansas Conference coach of the year ('20, '22, '24) and the 2024 KSHSAA Region A Girls Coach of the Year.
