Building Bridges

In 2023, our endeavors to build community took many forms, from the serene gatherings at our sunset soiree and the hopeful spark of Ignite Hope, in partnership with Vivo Alliance, to the insightful exchanges at Small Talk Big Change. Our grant writing program became a cornerstone of support, channeling \$3.15 million into local organizations and achieving a remarkable 40.6x return on investment. Simultaneously, our fundraising sponsorship project yielded a 10x return. These milestones are a testament to the power of strategic philanthropy and the indomitable spirit of our community.

As we stand on the threshold of the next five years, our vision is clear. We have a call to action: an invitation to be part of a movement that transcends boundaries and builds bridges. IMPACT STRATEGY

Compounding ROI (Return on Impact)

Just like venture capital has compounding interest, charitable donations should have compounding impact. To achieve this ROI, we accelerate growth and empower local causes and organizations through grant writing, fundraising and capacity building.

Social Entrepreneurship

We believe our support shouldn't create a dependency cycle. Hence, we support nonprofit organizations with seed capital grants to kick off income generating ventures.

Visibility

Impacto Puerto Rico is our platform to provide smaller grassroots organizations with access to resources and networks bigger organizations usually have.



THREE GUIDING PILLARS

We co-create innovative alliances that serve as catalysts for social, environmental, and economic change. Each of our projects tackles one, two, or three of these:

- We aim to reduce inequalities, provide access to information and education, and foster awareness of local social issues that impact Puerto Rico's residents, flora and fauna.
- We aim to foster the inclusion of natural infrastructure, to help food security become prevalent, create new approaches and awareness to biodiversity conservation, and the climate crisis.
- We aim to reduce poverty in Puerto Rico, increase professional opportunities to retain local talent in the archipelago, and develop strong capacity-building programs.

100% of donations

BUILDING FUTURES, TOGETHER

In 2023 we applied for **24 grants** for the following organizations

Vitrina Solidaria

Vitrina Solidaria, an organization that accelerates social ventures, established two social entrepreneurship businesses that will support their sustainability and create local jobs.





Vieques Conservation and Historical Trust*

The VCHT, an organization that promote, protect, and conserve the environmental, archaeological, and cultural resources of Vieques. One of the main objectives is to preserve and study the bioluminescent bays found on the island.



De Frente Al Alzheimer

Facing Alzheimer's, Inc. (DFAZ) is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to raise awareness and educate about Alzheimer's, as well as to create an economic fund to support patients with limited financial resources in Puerto Rico.

Mentes Puertorriqueñas en Acción

Mentes en Acción, is an organization committed to building a community of diverse young leaders who want to change Puerto Rico through spaces of formation, civic action, and positioning that will generate effective projects for the transformation of Puerto Rico.

PRoTechos is a non-profit founded with the dual mission of rebuilding damaged roofs in under-served communities throughout the island while providing residents with basic carpentry training, addressing both housing needs and the shortage of skilled construction workers in Puerto Rico.

Grant Writing Spotlight



Following hurricanes Irma and María, the ecosystem of the Vieques Bioluminescent Bay Natural Reserve was severely damaged.



O1 Protecting Puerto Mosquito Bay

• The mangroves and corals suffered extensive destruction. As the brightest and most pristine bioluminescent bay in the world, preserving the Puerto Mosquito Bay's conservation became crucial. To fund the project, the VCHT would have to commit personnel and hours that they couldn't spare so they could immerse themselves fully in the grant-writing process.

92.9 Million Grant with FSCG Support

 We provided grant-writing support by subsidizing the services of the Federal & State Consulting Group (FSCG). VCHT secured \$2.9 million grant from the federal government's Coastal Zone Management Habitat Protection and Restoration Grants program.

The funding will enable the organization to implement comprehensive restoration efforts, focusing on mangrove and coral reef rehabilitation, thereby enhancing ecosystem resilience and benefiting the local community.

Grant Writing

Spotlight 2

Integro's Community Grant enabled Vitrina Solidaria to establish a social store within the rehabilitated Coca Shack.

The store serves as a platform for local entrepreneurs who have graduated from Vitrina Solidaria's programs and workshops in solidarity economy. By selling their products through the store, Vitrina Solidaria generates revenue, which is reinvested to support the organization's ongoing initiatives. This strategic support from Integro allows Vitrina Solidaria to expand its impact, promote entrepreneurship, and foster tourism in the eastern region of Puerto Rico.

Building **Community**

In 2023 we held some key collaborations to build community: We sponsored Asesores Financieros Comunitarios's annual nonprofit Summit and sponsored 8 scholarships to nonprofits in their accounting and operations training workshops.

We also sponsored Fuckup Nights: a global movement and series of events where stories of failure are shared. Here in Puerto Rico, the Fuckup Nights are brought by Causa Local and Piloto151, where each month three or four people face a room full of strangers to share their own fuckups. Stories of businesses that go bust, partner deals that fall out, products that have to be recalled, and other fuckup stories.

From Small Talk Big Change to Impacto Showcase

We also launched our own series of events. After holding our second Small Talk Big Change, we decided to launch Impacto Showcases! As we build the personality of these event series you have been part of our journey to define what it will become





Spotlight De Frente Al Alzheimer

In November, 2023 we sponsored Camina Por tu Héroe: A walk at Parque Luis Muñoz Rivera to raise awareness of the hurdles that caretakers go through when attending Alzheimer's patients. The event raised \$210,000 which will be used by DFAZ in 2024 to subsidize costs related to taking care of patients.
