

GENOCIDE IN GAZA





The ethnic cleansing and genocide of Palestinians in Gaza is by far one of the most tragic humanitarian crisis that FIANZ has encountered in our forty-six years as a national Muslim umbrella organisation.

As an all-volunteer organisation, our approach to respond to this tragedy has been based on a planned strategic pathway with a baseline of pragmatism (what we can do given our resources) and outcomes-oriented (what can be achieve realistically).

Facilitated Direct Talks Between NZ Government Agencies and the Palestinian Community

Soon after Oct.7, FIANZ contacted a number of prominent Palestinian organisations and individuals and ranged for a meeting in Wellington with senior officials from the Prime Minister's Office (DPMC), Security Intelligence (NZSIS), NZ Police, Foreign Affairs (MFAT), Immigration (MBIE), Ethnic Ministry (MEC) and DIA.

The meeting was the first opportunity for these officials to get firsthand information from the Palestinians. Thereafter FIANZ agreed that all matters in this scope will be directly between the Palestinians and the government




Media Watch - Focus on Balanced Reporting

From the outset of the genocide, FIANZ started daily monitoring of every news (mainstream) and compile research on bias and inaccuracies. We then lobbied for more balanced news and published our analysis for all formal agencies.








Discussions with Prime Minister and Foreign Minister

FIANZ met with both the Foreign Minister and also the Prime Minister and represented our views on the unfolding genocide in Gaza and the Humanitarian Crisis.



PART OF STRATEGIC APPROACH:

Raising our concerns and ensuring responses from government.

Example: Our research showed that NZ had Cooperation agreement with Israel on technology. We wanted this to stop. We received the following. It was not 'in force' meaning it was not implemented.

With respect to humanitarian assistance, the New Zealand Government has announced \$10 million in funding to humanitarian partners, responding to appeals to address urgent humanitarian needs in Israel, Gaza, and the West Bank through the World Food Programme (WFP) and the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC).

- New Zealand supporting the <u>UN Security Council Resolution on 15 November</u>, (https://press.un.org/en/2023/sc15496.doc.htm) which called for an urgent and extended humanitarian pause to enable unhindered humanitarian access and for the protection of civilians and children, as well as the immediate release of hostages, and delivering a https://www.mfat.govt.nz/en/media-and-resources/united-nations-general-assembly-informal-plenary-meeting-on-the-conflict-in-israel-and-the-occupied-palestinian-territories/) to reinforce our position; and
- New Zealand supporting the <u>UN General Assembly Resolution of 27 October</u> (https://news.un.org/en/story/2023/10/1142932) calling for an "immediate, durable and sustained humanitarian truce leading to a cessation of hostilities."



International Humanitarian Focus - Ensuring NZ Muslim views were directly represented to overseas governments and organisations

Example: The Foreign Ministry of Palestinian National Authorities: The Deputy Foreign Minister, Geneva, praised our efforts and submitted our document directly to the government.


