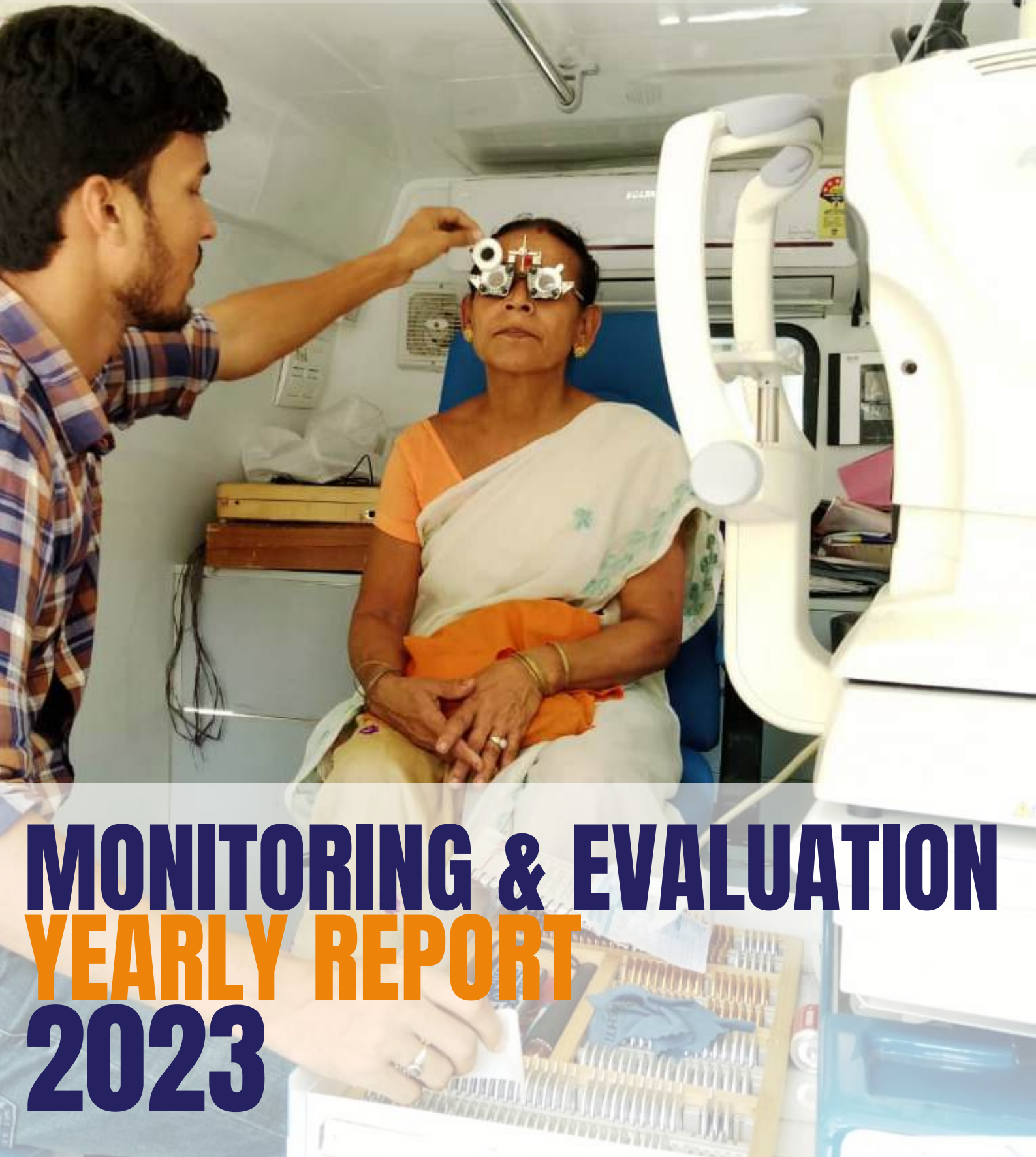

Sewa International is a Hindu faith-based, humanitarian, nonprofit service organization registered under Internal Revenue Code 501 (c) (3). Founded in 2003, Sewa International is part of a larger movement that started in India in 1989 and is active in twenty countries. Sewa serves humanity irrespective of race, color, religion, gender or nationality.

What We Do

Sewa International Inc. is actively involved in disaster relief and rehabilitation efforts. Our development initiatives primarily target family services, including child, tribal, and refugee welfare, and initiatives promoting women's empowerment, health, and education. Beyond our domestic efforts in the United States, we are also engaged in development projects spanning Colombia, Guyana, India, Kenya, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka.



Disaster Management

Working with our partners we are involved in all three stages of disaster recovery around the world: Rescue (the first 72 hours), Relief (3 months following the disaster), and Rehabilitation (work that lasts 3-5 years after the disaster).

Sewa USA has demonstrated notable achievements in education through initiatives such as ASPIRE, Sponsor a Child, Learning Centers, and other impactful programs.



Women Empowerment

Sewa International promotes community volunteerism with programs like LEAD (Leadership Development through Community Engagement), a summer Internship for high school students fostering socially conscious leadership. The organization also offers the Get Inspired summer Internships for college students.

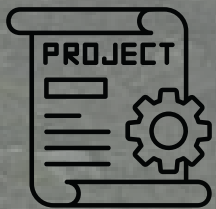

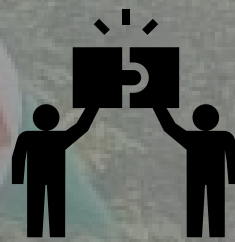

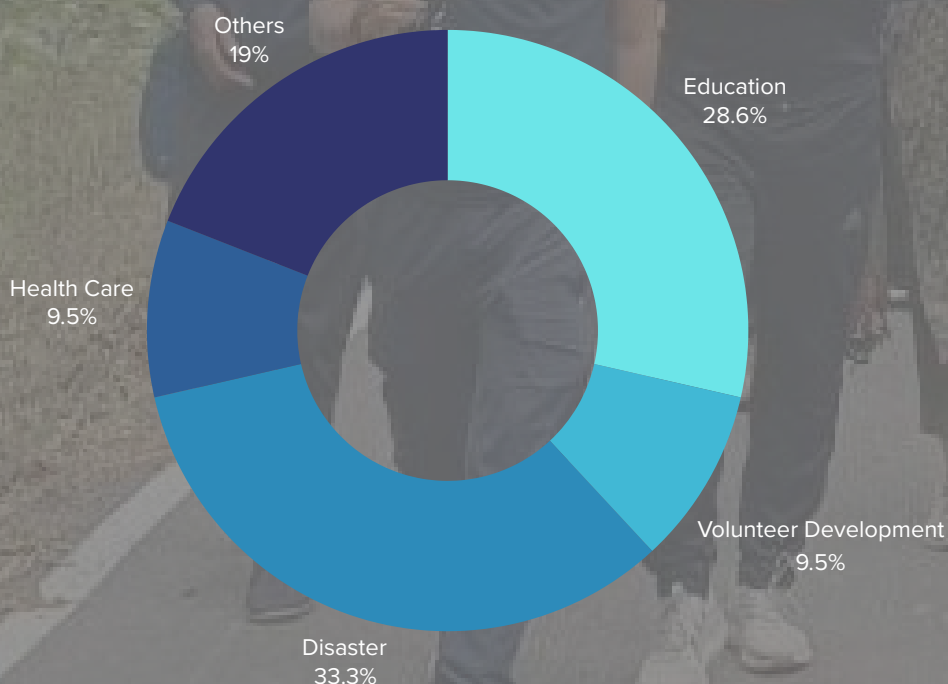

DISASTER MANAGEMENT

Disaster risk reduction is integral to various aspects and sectors of development, with 25 targets linked to it across 10 of the 17 sustainable development goals. This firmly establishes disaster risk reduction as a fundamental strategy for overall development. Sewa International USA, specializing in disaster relief since its inception, has actively supported a range of disaster relief activities in 2023, spanning from the Hawaii wildfire in the US to the Joshimath land subsidence in Uttarakhand State in India.

Crafting Solutions for Joshimath Amidst the Shifting Sands

Disaster : Land Subsidence



Due to its remote geography, overt dependence on traditional occupations, and lack of basic infrastructure, the locality in Uttarakhand ranks comparatively lower in socio-economic indicators. Additionally, Joshimath is located in one of the seismically active zones in the young Indian Himalayas. In January 2023, the hill town experienced one of its deadliest disasters when around 800 houses developed cracks, forcing residents to be evacuated and relocated to temporary shelters.

The Sewa International Uttarakhand Team was one of the first responders involved in the disaster-affected region, carrying out immediate relief operations through Essential Kit Distribution (packets containing food, clothes, medicine, and other essential items).

Cyclone Biparjoy left a trail of destruction in June 2023 as it made landfall and moved through the Kutch region and parts of Saurashtra in Gujarat. Sewa International's Gujarat team sprang into action, carrying out relief operations through Ration (essential food items) Kit Distribution drives, reaching impacted villages in Kutch District. Sewa International USA is supporting long-term intervention in Gujarat to help overcome the devastation caused by Cyclone Biparjoy.

North India Floods : Relief and Disaster Preparedness Efforts

Disaster : Floods

In 2023, India faced devastating natural calamities that resulted in significant loss of life and property. Following torrential rainfall since the start of the monsoon in early June, the northern states of India, including Bihar, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, and Jammu and Kashmir, among others, were affected by cloudbursts, flash floods, landslides, lightning, etc. Sewa's Delhi team was active in rescue and relief activities during the River Yamuna floods. The team also planned and offered disaster preparedness activities in Delhi and Uttarakhand as part of a long-term disaster relief plan.

Disasters disrupt the educational process, leading to missed classes and exams and affecting the continuity of education and students' academic progress. Schools have a tangible role in building community resilience. They are more than just education centers; they are vital institutions that play a critical role in disaster preparedness, response, and recovery. As educational institutions, they have the responsibility to deliver instruction. Thus, under this project, Sewa International will provide First Responder Training in 100 schools across Uttarakhand and Delhi NCR (National Capital Region) to student leaders and parents to build coping capacity and enable the communities to respond effectively to disasters.





The Sewa Delhi team actively participated in relief and rescue efforts during the 2023 floods in Delhi. A Mobile Medical Unit was deployed, and members of the Delhi office volunteered to distribute essential relief materials.



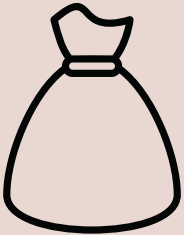

The earthquake in 2023, the most powerful in over two decades, rivaled the intensity of a seismic event in 1939, marking a devastating occurrence for earthquake-prone Turkey. The earthquake led to 50,783 fatalities, rendered 7,302 homeless, and injured more than 107,000. Sewa International was actively involved in activities to help the victims of this devastating earthquake, especially by providing essential clothes, food, and medicine to the affected.

Manipur is among the seven sister states in northeast India, with Imphal as its capital. In May 2023, a large-scale ethnic conflict erupted in the state. The conflict is primarily between the Meitei people, who form the majority in the Imphal Valley, and the tribal communities from the surrounding hills, including the Kuki and Zo populations.

BALASORE TRIPLE TRAIN ACCIDENT : RESCUE & RELIEF

A deadly train accident in Odisha in 2023 was one of the most severe in recent Indian rail history. On June 2nd, around 7 p.m., two coaches of the 12864 (SMVB-HWH) Yashwantpur-Howrah Express derailed near Bahanaga Railway Station in Balasore District, about 250 km from Kolkata and 170 km from Bhubaneswar. The derailed coaches collided with the 12841 Coromandel Express, traveling in the opposite direction on the adjacent track. As a result, about 17 bogies (rail cars) were derailed. Most of the affected passengers came from West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, and Odisha.

Sewa volunteers rendered invaluable aid to government officials in the aftermath of the accident. They provided rescue services, first aid, and sustenance to those affected. Additionally, they facilitated the transportation of the injured to medical facilities and provided care to the loved ones of passengers receiving medical treatment.

A Sewa International team visited the site and many affected passengers as a part of the need assessment survey.



HELP MAUI RISE FROM WILDFIRE ASHES !

Disaster : Wild Fires

In August 2023, a series of wildfires broke out in Maui, one of the main islands in Hawaii. Over 90 people were killed in the fires that ravaged the town of Lahaina. As many as 2,200 buildings like homes, businesses, landmarks, and community pillars, were reduced to ash.

In this volunteer-driven project focused on procuring and supplying emergency supplies for wildfire victims, Sewa recruited and coordinated volunteers to assess needs, engage with suppliers, ensure quality control, and efficiently distribute items such as particulate respirators, gas masks, handheld 2-way radios, first aid kits, tools, gloves, filters, food, clothing, medicines, and rechargeable lights.

ISRAEL EMERGENCY RESPONSE

In the context of Hamas’s attack on Israel in October 2023, Sewa was involved in the large project that assisted 248,000 displaced Israelis, prioritizing underserved communities, including self-evacuated, unrecognized, and vulnerable Bedouin populations. The project supported them amid trauma, grief, and uncertainty, addressing unique challenges, such as those faced by asylum, while meeting the high demand for assistance from specialized NGOs. Sewa supported IsraAID which leveraged its emergency expertise to assist those affected and support relief efforts: 1) Aid to displaced communities in evacuation centers, collaborating with elected committees and local organizations. 2) Support for under-served communities across Israel, partnering with community leaders and NGOs. 3) Assistance for populations affected by acute violence and trauma in collaboration with grassroots organizations. 4) Support for civil society and partners, facilitating management, coordination, and resource utilization training.

HEALTH CARE

In 2023, Sewa International USA launched healthcare initiatives aligning with the United Nations' SDG (Sustainable Development Goal) 3 – “Good Health and Well-Being”. These initiatives included a Mobile Medical Van for underserved communities, treatment supported for the economically disadvantaged, and health awareness programs. By providing doorstep healthcare and fostering preventive measures, Sewa significantly contributed to SDG 3's objectives, ensuring access to quality health services, reducing morbidity, and promoting overall well-being. These efforts epitomized Sewa's commitment to advancing global health and sustainable development.

The Mobile Medical Unit provides health care services including general outpatient department (OPD), diagnostic services, and health awareness to village residents in 24+ service points in Tripura. The primary intervention under the program is the Medical Health Check-up Camps for the target group of the rural village populations, placing a focus on vulnerable groups such as adolescent girls, expecting women, the elderly, and the physically challenged. A total of 24 medical health camps are being conducted monthly to reach out to the maximum beneficiaries and make the maximum impact.

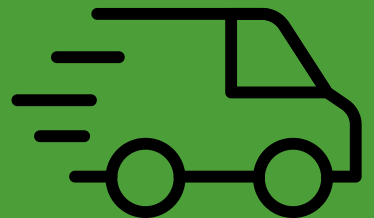

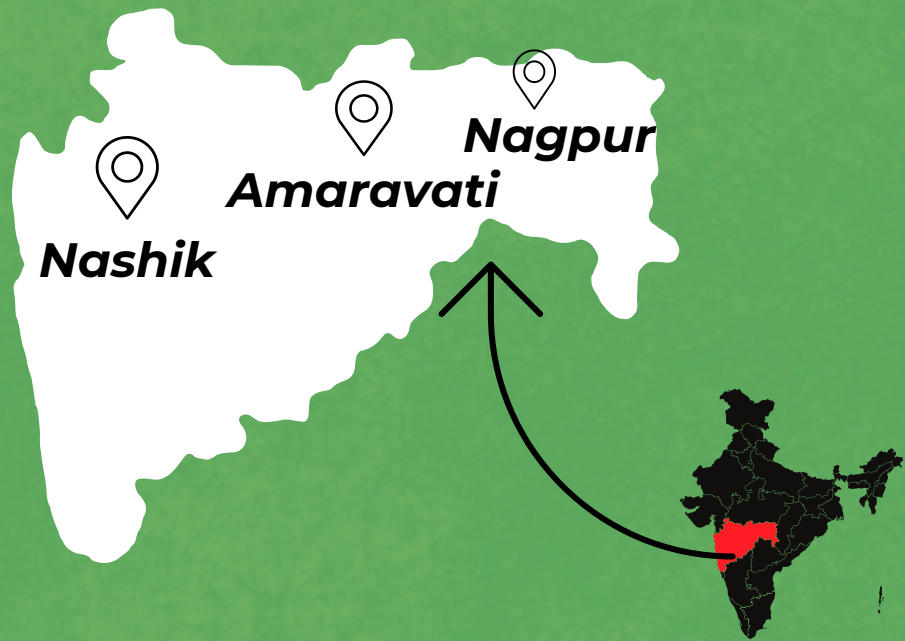

The project includes essential medical care such as medicines, outpatient department (OPD) services, dental services, and ambulance pick-up and drop-off facilities. This initiative aims to address the healthcare needs of the tribal population in Attapady, ensuring they have access to quality medical assistance without financial barriers.



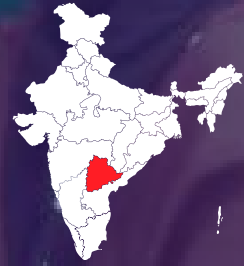

The health initiative plans a comprehensive clinic with qualified doctors, labs, and pharmacies, addressing community health needs and ensuring quality care. Additionally, empowering women by offering nurse training with stipends. Kalam Hospital endeavors to provide affordable treatment to its patients. The hospital serves an average of 25 to 30 patients every day. The medical services offered by the Kalam Hospital include treatment for various ailments such as fever, cold, cough, viral fevers, typhoid, skin conditions, and gynecological cases including regular check-ups for pregnant women, and pediatric patients. Additionally, discounted prices are offered for medicines and laboratory tests.

Nepal is a landlocked country with about 17.5 % of the population multi-dimensionally poor. Nepal is also an ethnically diverse country with more than 125 ethnic groups and castes spread across different geographical areas. The tribal populations of the country belong to the marginal sections of society. Nepal has a high population growth rate and a very high concentration of population in the age group of 1-14. Hence, it is important to work for the welfare and development of children from the marginalized sections in the country.

The primary objective behind constructing this infrastructure is to ensure the well-being and comfort of cattle. Extreme weather conditions—whether intense heat, cold snaps, or severe storms—can cause stress, illness, or even fatalities among cows. Proper infrastructure provides them with protection, thereby reducing the risk of weather-related health complications.

Prevention & Control of Sickle Cell Disease

Partner : Swami Vivekananda Medical Mission , Wayanad

Project Location : Wayanad, Bharat

In response to the challenges faced by tribal populations, Sewa International, in collaboration with the Swami Vivekananda Medical Mission (SVMM), Wayanad, has launched a targeted intervention project. The initiative focuses on controlling the prevalence of Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) among tribal communities, including Paniya, Padiya, and Katunayaka, across three South Indian states -- Kerala, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu. Recognizing the heightened vulnerability of tribal people to genetic disorders like SCD, which has been exacerbated by cultural patterns and recent gaps in public health priorities due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the project adopts a two-pronged approach. It involves early screening, detection, and treatment of SCD, as well as rehabilitation and awareness counseling for affected patients. The project aims to impact 150,000 tribal individuals through 250 medical camps, offering crucial support to 50 SCD-affected patients in their journey toward better health.
