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DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Jane Austen's *Emma* is a clever comedy about manners, matchmaking, and misunderstandings. This adaptation of *Emma*, written by playwright Kate Hamill, maintains the heart of Austen's story while supercharging its silliness. The jokes are big, the mistakes are bigger, and the chaos is part of the fun.

This production resides in the Regency era with period-appropriate costumes, settings, and ballroom dancing. However, the story is updated through its language, current ideas, breaking of the fourth wall, and playful anachronisms. Watch closely and you may see a Red Solo Cup at a party, a lady wearing sneakers under her dress, or a ballroom dance that includes the Dougie.

Our goal was to pay homage to the source material while also illustrating that, 211 years after the eponymous novel was first released, love still has its own agenda. The themes of this script and the feelings of these characters are still relevant and relatable today.

Whether you're an Austen aficionado or a novice to her novels, it is our hope that this performance pulls at your heartstrings and tickles your funny bone.

I'd like to thank the Board of Directors at Twin City Players for employing their own matchmaking skills, which paired our first-time directing team with this production. I must also recognize the talented, dedicated, and fun individuals that brought this show to life onstage and off. Working with them has been a great privilege. To paraphrase a quote from our titular character, "If I loved them less, I might be able to talk about it more."
