I'd like to nominate the Devils Aspiring boys - these players all had a tough shift in getting to Strathallen Every Monday for Training which was a trek even from Dundee never mind the players coming from Aberdeen and Inverness!

The boys trained with intensity and commitment throughout the year and the progress we saw was very pleasing. These boys go above and beyond to attend BRAVE academy because they feel it supports them in their progress - that for me demonstrates what we ask of our athletes to make positive choices about their development.

THUNDER EMERGING GIRLS

The Thunder Emerging girls went on a huge journey last cycle - from not understanding the requirements to train at the required level for Brave academy to making the BRAVE Cup final and understanding the performance levels required to perform consistency at the top level.

Through the cycle the players got better at recognising the qualities we are looking for in our players and they knitted together as a group and started to push each other much further in the 2nd part of the year. Performance and intensity improved and their willingness to get out of their comfort zone and take risks.

COMMUNITY CLUB OF THE YEAR

Uddingston runs a schools programme in South and North Lanarkshire, and has a youth programme with over 300 members. They also have walking hockey initiatives to reach the less able members of the community.

The club has a significant in-school programme with community coaches visiting eight schools. Hockey is provided to 2000 state school children per year as part of this programme.

The club houses a men's shed to assist with the effects of mental health in men, and engaged with local retired group, Uddingston Pride, who use club facilities to host meetings and grow plants. Uddingston also runs a foodbank drive for our local foodbank.







PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Alan has taken Hillhead boys hockey from single digit numbers at training to over 70 boys

from P4 upwards. A driving force behind engaging and inspiring other volunteers within the

club to support Futures sessions and U16 squads at Festivals, SH cup, and into league hockey.

He makes a hugely positive impact in the community by engaging parents at all stages, resulting in a positive culture change around hockey in the community reducing focus on football or rugby and making hockey a first choice for boys of all ages.

DUNCAN SERVICE

Duncan is the secretary for Falkirk and Linlithgow Hockey Club as well as the secretary/treasurer and umpire convener for East District. He has been doing all three roles at East District for many years. For the last 10 years he has made huge commitments to the grading and development of level 1 umpires. Not only does Duncan present the online level 1 course, he is also the main person who co-hosts the practical level 1 training session and is part of the small team of

assessors who assess the level 1 umpire candidates. For the Brave Academy events he has arranged for senior umpires to work alongside new level 1 umpires to give them some extra training and has secured umpires for several youth events that have taken place in East District.

VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR

ARTHUR ROBERTSON

In his role as Falkirk and Linlithgow Head of Youth Development, Arthur has been at the forefront of efforts to engage with schools and provide opportunities to children across the catchment. He worked with Active Schools in 2 local authorities to deliver in school taster sessions to primary schools, ran and supported hockey leader courses as part of the high school coach academy initiative, and liased with Scottish Hockey to organise CPD for club coaches.

Arthur has also supported the club's absorbing of hockey activities at Linlithgow Academy, working with the school and parent committee to ensure a smooth transition.

Under him, the clubs youth section has grown to 150, and more children in the Falkirk and Linlithgow catchment have opportunities to participate in hockey than ever before.



INCLUSION AWARD

UDDINGSTON HOCKEY CLUB

Uddingston Hockey Club has a pathway for all regardless of if you want to play professional or social hockey. The club identified it was missing a more accessible paced session therefore created a walking hockey group to ensure it could incorporate all demographics. The sessions have proven very popular with approx. 15 - 25 people in attendance each week, followed by coffee/tea and cake and an essential blether.



The club's in-school programme included a participant who was blind and very keen to participate. So, the club found an inclusive solution using sounds to ensure there was no barrier to playing hockey.

HILLHEAD HOCKEY CLUB

Hillhead is the only hockey club registered with LEAP Sports Scotland, a leading charity promoting LGBTI+ participation and ending LGBTI+ phobia in sport. It actively engages with LEAP throughout the season - hosting its annual tournament open to all, engaging its rainbow laces and rainbow captain's armband programme, hosting a stall in cooperation with LEAP at Pride Glasgow events. The junior section also hosted a LEAP Sports Family group for gender diverse children and their families.

The club promotes inclusion in the community by running a hockey stall at the Glasgow Mela in Kelvingrove park, the largest multicultural festival in Scotland.

Club coaches engage in honest and open discussions around mental health with players and quardians, and the club partnered with charities Common Wheel and Rookie Minds.

MASTERS TEAM OF THE YEAR

HILLHEAD MEN'S 2S

Hillhead HC 2XI won the league and cup double in 2022-23. They won 13 and drew 3 of their league matches and won all four rounds of the District Cup.

The team had a classic mix of youth and experience, with 11 of the squad homegrown products of Hillhead's junior development.

Some key members of the team also help coach other teams within the club and at their Futures and Juniors sessions. This underlines the strong development ethos we have at the club, with players giving back to the club.





WATSONIANS LADIES

During the 2022/23 season Watsonian's Ladies 1s won the domestic clean sweep. The team's outdoor success between 2021 and 2023 saw them go on a 41 game unbeaten streak and last season, they won 21 matches which included at 17 game winning streak, 1 draw and 1 loss scoring 146 goals and conceding only 16 goals.

Throughout the indoor season, they played 12 games, won 10, drew 2 and lost none, scoring 99 goals and conceding only 18. This ultimately led them to winning the National Indoor Title for the first time in the club's history.

The team went on to win every game of their European campaign winning the gold medal at the EuroHockey Club Challenge and earned promotion to the 2nd tier of European Hockey, the European Club Trophy.


