Learn to lead and manage programs in the outdoor recreation and tourism industry. Study fundamental concepts to launch an outdoor business or develop a career in parks, recreation and tourism. Explore best practices in outdoor skill development, risk management, and guiding operations. Spend up to a full semester on a for-credit wilderness-based NOLS expedition in remote locations across the world.

Majors can also choose to live at CWC's Alpine Science Institute near Sinks Canyon State Park in Lander. In the foothills of the Wind River Mountains, student cabins offer opportunities for reflective solitude and easy access to: trout streams, world class rock climbing areas, and a variety of hike and mountain bike trails.
