# FREE ONLINE COURSES FROM HARVARD



#### SUPPORTING OUR SUBS

In a survey of 4,000 substitute teachers by Red Rover (2023), a staffing software company that assists with the placement of subs, they indicated that reliable, accessible, and easy-to-follow lesson plans were a number one draw in accepting assignments.

Many of the subs noted that with the amount of technology, many classes do not leave lessons but simply share that student's work on the computer or in the Google Classroom. This leaves the sub needing a clearer understanding of what the students are working on or knowing how to assist in managing the flow of the class period. Another challenge was not enough work, leaving students unengaged and a challenge to manage.

With this insight, we can look to continue to ensure a quality experience for our subs and students by ensuring we have quality lesson plans prepared, along with an emergency "evergreen" plan or two on hand.
