THORNDALE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

Thorndale & Area Horticultural Society's February meeting speaker, Brian Trapp presentation 'Gardening with Dahlias and Roses' was informative & accompanied by beautiful photos of his prize dahlias and roses. He began growing dahlias in 2009, starting with only 9 plants and now has more than 700 of various varieties of dahlias, along with many roses in his 8 gardens. He also maintains a small greenhouse, riverside gardens on his property & floral patches of sunflowers. Brian Trapp has found that turkey manure compost from a local supplier in Putnam boosts the growth & flower production for both his dahlias & roses, so that over successive seasons the flower production increased by more than five times. He also found that when this poultry compost was applied to his cannas & roses, their leaves changed to a red colour & deterred the Japanese Beetles from feeding on them. Growing dahlias is Trapp's passion, and he opens his gardens in Dorchester to the public in August for everyone to come & enjoy his prized beauties. The next meeting of the Thorndale & Area Horticultural Society is set for Wed, Mar 11, 7:30pm in the Thorndale Community Center, Room 3, with another informative speaker.

Lisa Finkbeiner will give a presentation on "Tricks to Change the Colours of your Hydrangeas". The Society will be celebrating its 30th anniversary, marked by their first official meeting March 28, 1996, with cake, awards & memories shared by founding members.

\$36,800 IN GRANTS AVAILABLE

The Oxford Community Foundation is thrilled to announce the availability of \$536,800 in grant funding from The Maple Leaf Community Fund to support capital-related initiatives that strengthen food security programs—initiatives that promote dignity while building individual & community capacity across Oxford County. The Maple Leaf Community Fund was established in honour of the late Harvey & Erma Beaty of Thamesford. Harvey founded Cold Springs Farm in 1949, guiding its growth from a small family farm into a significant agri-food enterprise that later became part of Maple Leaf Foods. Maple Leaf Foods' rich history spans more than a century, rooted in the amalgamation of several of Canada's most notable food companies. This fund reflects the Beatys' enduring legacy & their belief in strong, resilient communities built around access to nutritious food. The \$36,800 in available funding will support capital-related initiatives for food security programs that promote dignity & foster long-term community well-being. Grants are intended to support initiatives aligned with one or more of the following focus areas:

- 1. Food Literacy** – Supporting access to information, knowledge, and skills that enable individuals & families to provide healthy food for themselves (e.g. nutrition education/food safety/meal planning)
- 2. School & Other Nutrition Programs** – Promoting access to healthy meals through education & direct programming. (e.g. school breakfast, lunch, or after school programs; nutrition & fitness programs.)
- 3. Sustainable Initiatives Beyond Conventional Food Bank Models** – Strengthening long-term food security & self-sufficiency (e.g. social enterprises supporting food security; community gardens; social profit enterprises offering food-related training for unemployed individuals, at-risk youth or single parents)

"This funding represents more than a financial contribution—it represents lives changed & communities strengthened," said Louise Wardrop, Executive Director of the Oxford Community Foundation. "Through the Maple Leaf Community Fund, Harvey & Erma Beaty's legacy is helping families access healthy food with dignity, supporting programs that build skills and self-sufficiency, and creating lasting pathways to food security across Oxford County." Root crops are the old-fashioned way that families get through the winter when other vegetables are scarce. As grocery prices soar due to a massive labour shortage in the American southwest, we can look for Canadian-grown root crops: beets, carrots, parsnips... And while we often think about these as boiled or roasted sides, why not consider the salads which can be made combining the first two, or even with arugala. It's available thanks to Oxford county greenhouses; it's tart taste goes well with earthy crops; Oxford's great supply of cheese makes the salad delicious. Several of Bryan Smith's acquaintances also like the sound of 'arugala' when you say it aloud. Farmers' markets and CSAs are great ways to buy Canadian foods and to eat local produce.

THE GREATS OF ZORRA- W.H. GREGORY

W.H. Gregory was a member of first council for the newly incorporated Township of East Nissouri in 1851. A pioneer who became a politician, he had the support of all his farm neighbours near & far when elected. W.H. Gregory became involved in local matters by helping his constituents incorporate better agricultural practices when farmland was being cleared from the dense woods that covered the landscape. As chairman of the one of the first agricultural societies for East Nissouri, he became well known throughout the township & was readily elected to council. At that time, in contrast to Zorra Township's elections now being held every 4 years, elections were held every year, and meetings were held in the councillors' homes. Once elected, Councillor Gregory expressed the need to improve the poor condition of the roads in the township & helped facilitate the upgrading & paving of the 10th Concession, known today as Highway 119. This caused taxes to be raised, making him unpopular at the time, but once the road was upgraded the benefits became apparent and it was considered a good decision that council had made. Today Highway 119 continues to be a main artery in Zorra Township and its history of continual improvements first initiated by W.H Gregory as one of Zorra's Greats has been preserved & made available through the Zorra Heritage Committee and the Beachville District Museum.

Electric Vehicle Charging Station in Embro
