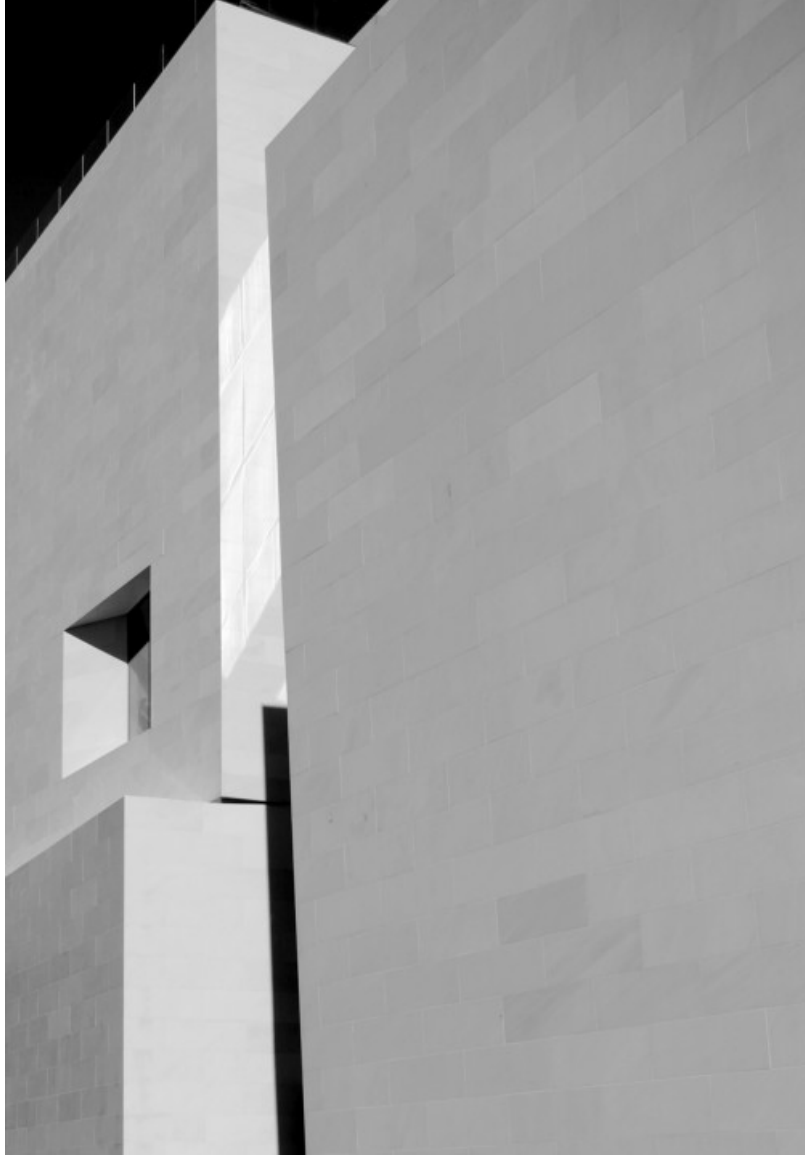

Architecture and custom interiors by Pritzker Prize-winning architects Herzog & de Meuron. Located in Tribeca, 56 Leonard is a 60-story expression of sculpted surfaces and sparkling glass with an original Anish Kapoor sculpture at its base. The 145 unique condominium residences, each with private outdoor space, have soaring 11'- 14' ceilings and breathtaking panoramas of the cityscape, rivers, bridges and beyond. The 17,000 square feet of amenities include a 75' lap pool with a sundeck, gym, screening room, lounge, private dining room and playroom. A Global Landmark redefining New York living.

Our approach to lighting in this project takes advantage of the sculptural and material qualities of the space to re-think the concept of residential lighting with tools ranging from a spectacular neon installation to filtered beams of light.

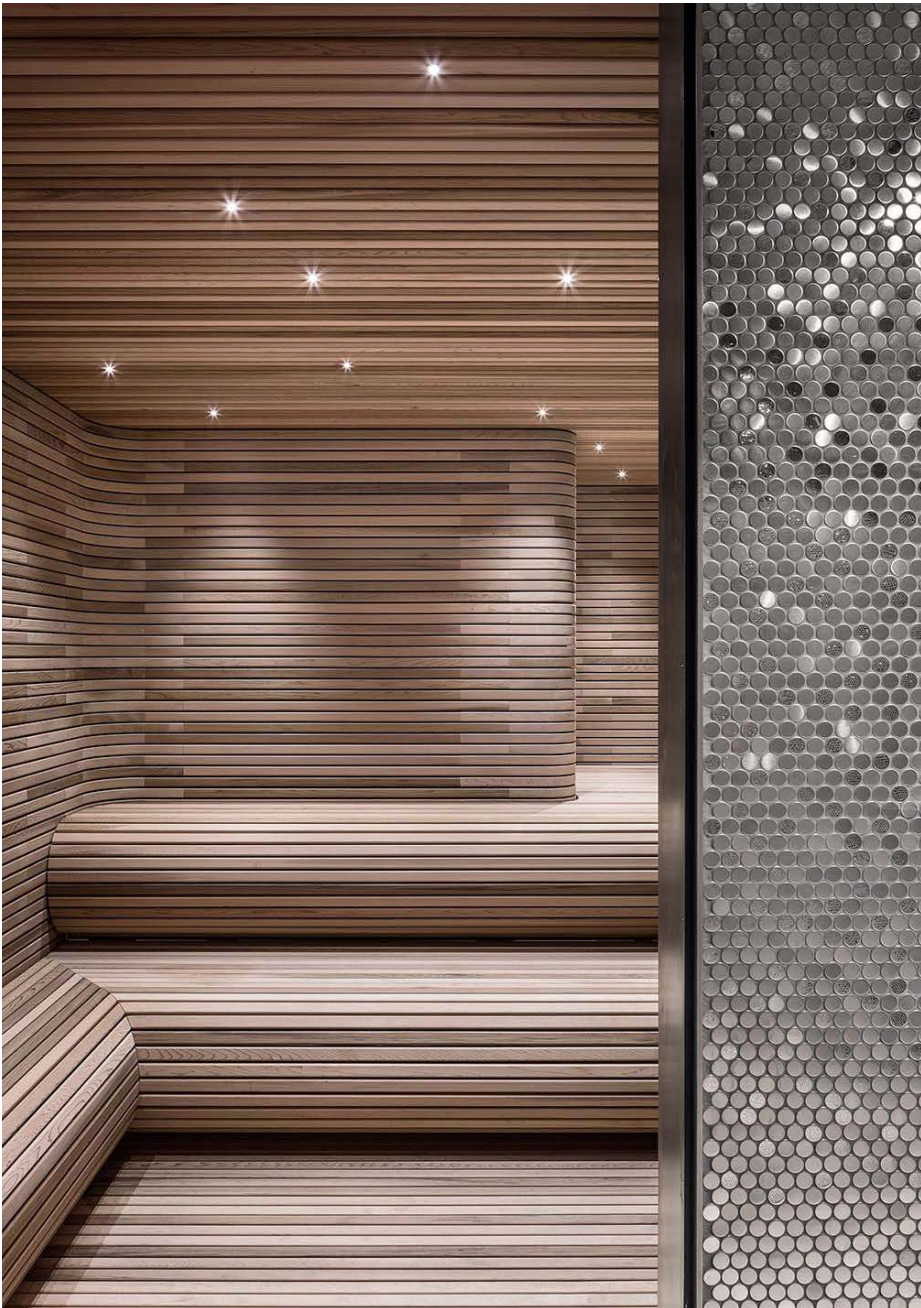

The flagship for Seoul-based women's specialty store Boontheshop comprises 55,000 sq ft spread over seven floors. Located in the prominent retail district of Cheongdam, largely characterized by its dense cacophony of architectural styles, the developed project of an austere massing comprising two polished angular volumes in white marble serves as a powerful, calming statement. Our lighting strategy emphasizes the geometry of the volumes, creating sharply contrasted edges that facilitate the visual understanding of the form.

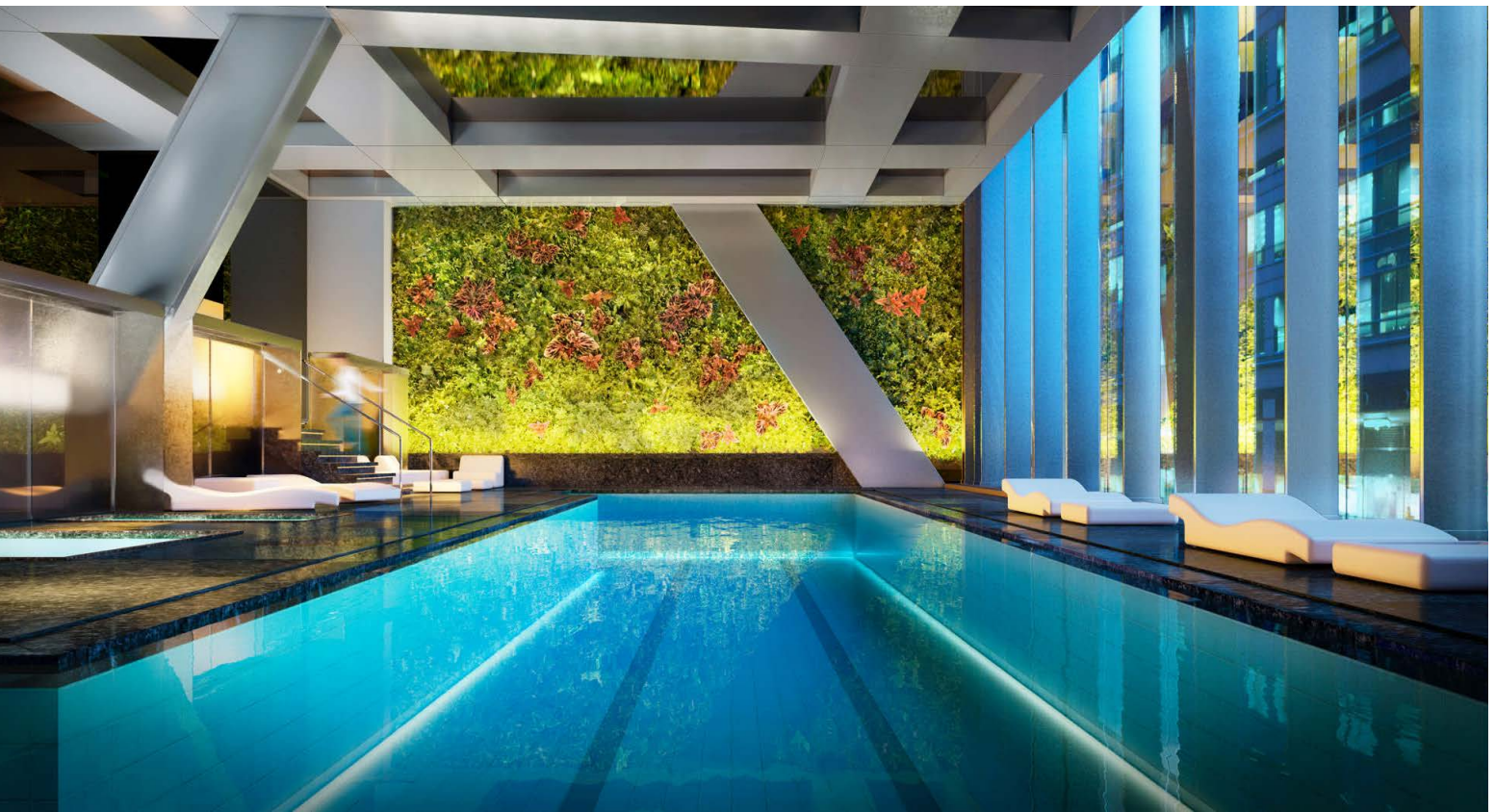

53W53 is the most architecturally significant addition to the New York skyline in recent years. A gracefully tapered, 1,050-foot-high tower rising above The Museum of Modern Art, 53W53 represents a bold artistic and technical achievement by Pritzker Prize-winning architect Jean Nouvel.

The elegant, refined interior spaces of the private residences are designed by noted architect Thierry Despont. Complementing Nouvel's innovative design, these homes offer a 21st century vision of the gracious urban living for which New York is celebrated.

Our approach to lighting this masterpiece takes inspiration from Nouvel's contemporary form and Despont's material palette. The result is a building that is fully-integrated in the skyline at night and an interior space that is warm and inviting.

TOMMY- BAHAMA

Located in the Fred F. French Building, an art deco landmark skyscraper on New York's Fifth Avenue, the 13,000 SF Tommy Bahama Restaurant, Marlin Bar, and Store are conceived of as an urban resort. Feature elements in the store include window louvers of salvaged Coney Island boardwalk Ipe wood, campaign style fixtures and custom lantern pendant lights in the atrium. The bar features reclaimed, weathered oak siding, a custom, bent metal, back lit bar screen, a hand-painted mural and a monumental blackened steel and Ipe spiral staircase with solid brass "rope"-wrapped railing that links the Marlin Bar to the Restaurant above.

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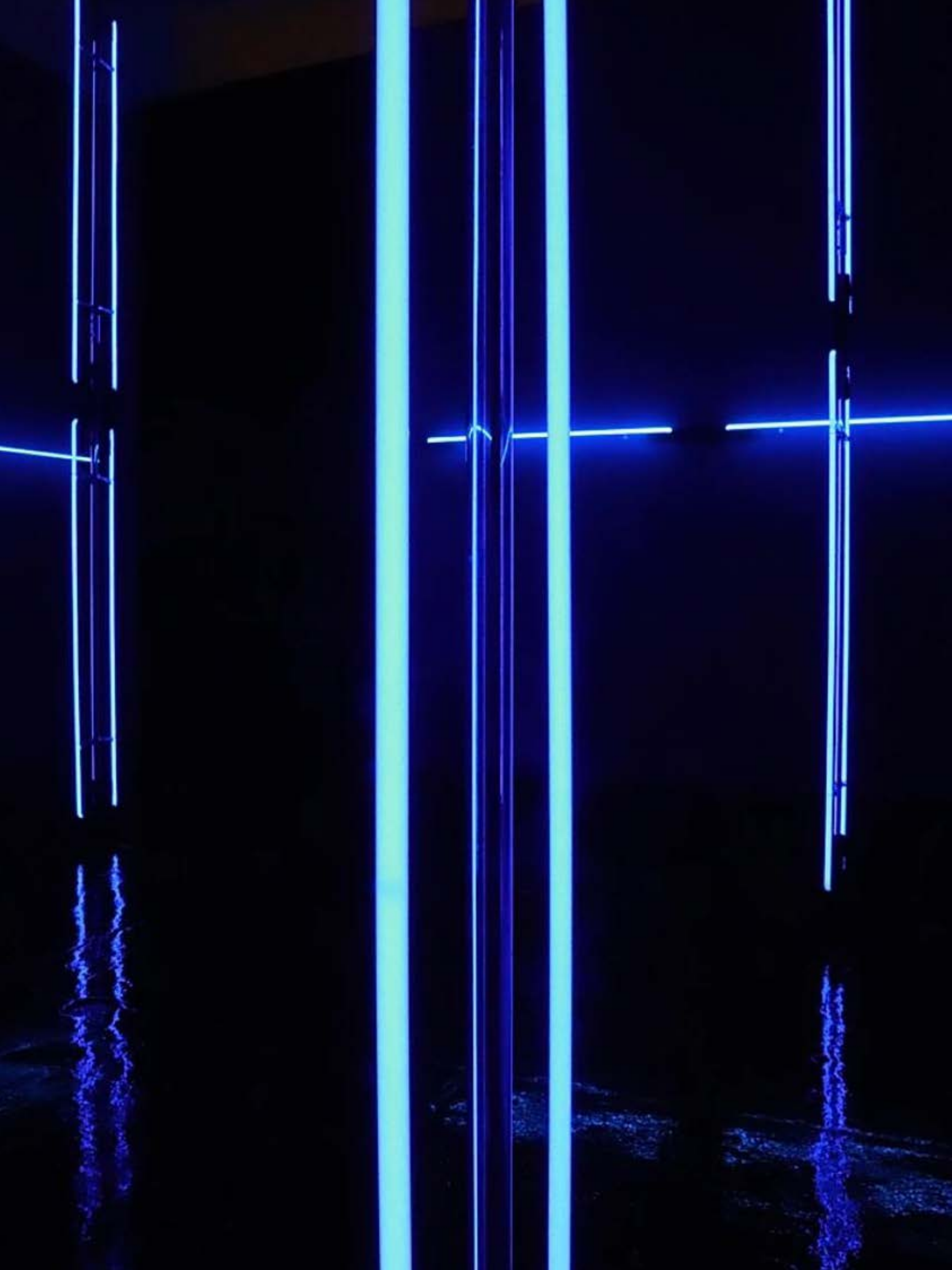
SLGALLERY

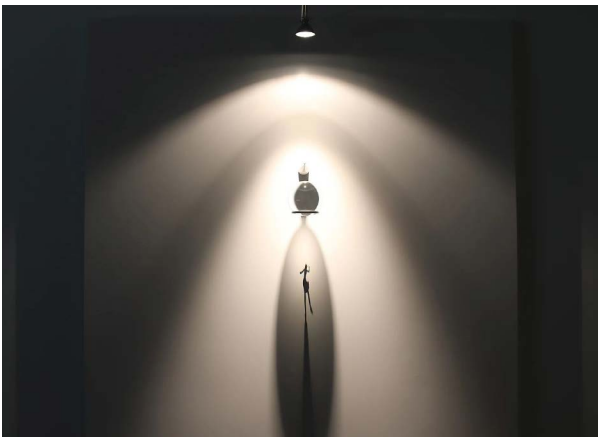




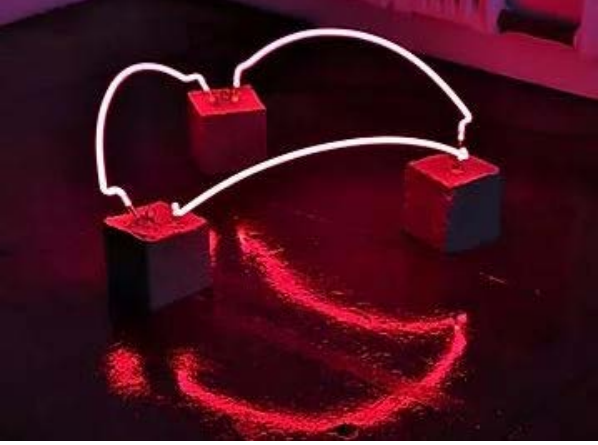
