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

TEEN VOLUNTEER RAISES £3,800 FOR WILLOW WOOD HOSPICE

Fifteen-year-old Neev Patel from Ashton-under-Lyne has raised an impressive £3,800 for Willow Wood Hospice through a charity event she organised at Ashton Rugby Club.

With over 100 attendees, the Year 11 student from Hulme Grammar School managed the entire event, securing raffle prizes including a £200 Booking.com voucher, and hosting an auction where one prize fetched £300.

Neev has been volunteering at Willow Wood's Waterloo shop since she was 13 as part of her Duke of Edinburgh Award. What started as a three-month commitment turned into two years of service, as she continues to donate her time each weekend.

Her connection to the Hospice runs deep, having been introduced to its work through her mother, a local nurse.

"I've always felt a bond with Willow Wood, especially after it helped my grandad," Neev shared. "Volunteering has taught me so much, from social skills to building friendships with fellow volunteers, some in their 70s."

Neev encourages other young people to volunteer, highlighting the personal growth and skills she's gained. With plans to pursue marine biology, she is committed to continuing her charity work alongside her studies.

"Willow Wood is a lovely place, and everyone there is so kind," Neev concluded.

EBAY STORE

Support patients in our care and bag a bargain not just in our charity shops, but online too! Our eBay sales raised a record £49,550 in 2023/24.

Since launchina in 2007, our eBay store has sold over 42,000 items and built a following of more than 4,000 people.

Based at our Ashton-under-Lyne Distribution Centre, our online sales team, including staff and volunteers, ensures prompt service, posting items within a day and maintaining our top-rated seller status on eBay. "We list 30 to 50 items daily and sell 100 to 150 items a week." said Nicola DePetrillo. Online Sales Assistant.

The team sets ambitious goals, with Dave Sadler noting: "We've grown from 600 to nearly 2,000 active items. It's all about list, list, list for us."

Items are sold worldwide. with some standout sales including a Psion Executive PDA Organiser for £299 to a U.S. buver and a signed Manchester United shirt for £2,000. Donations from the local community fuel our eBay success, with clothing, books, electronics, and more being sold.

Our eco-conscious team reuses packaging and welcomes donations of boxes and bubble wrap. Additionally, sellers can support the Hospice by donating a percentage of their eBay profits to Willow Wood. Beyond eBay, we generate income through Vintage Cash Cow, Ziffit, and Discogs, maximising the value of every donation.

Lindsay Patchett's story

'MY HEART IS FILLED WITH LOVE WHEN I THINK OF WILLOW WOOD'

The Patchett family had long supported Willow Wood Hospice before they needed our vital services. Lindsay Patchett's uncle Harry received end-of-life care last year, and soon after, her husband Andy did too.



"We are lucky to have Willow Wood in Tameside. The services are free, and even a short session can make a huge difference. It's crucial it stays open."

When Andy was diagnosed with an incurable disease, visiting the Hospice felt natural to see the facilities and meet the team who would care for him in his final days. It brought comfort amid uncertainty, allowing Andy to focus on living rather than worrying about the end.

Andy, a joiner, was injured at work when a ladder broke. While leaving the hospital, a nurse noticed one of his pupils was larger than the other, leading to scans that revealed a brain tumour in July 2022, just weeks before a planned family holiday to Florida.

"Andy and I couldn't go, but by the time my son, daughter-in-law, and granddaughter Alice returned, we'd learned Andy had an incurable glioblastoma with about 14 months to live," said Lindsay, 62, from Dukinfield.

After radiotherapy, they discussed Andy's end-of-life wishes. Andy and Lindsay visited Willow Wood and met Wellbeing Practitioner Mandy Jones, who went to school with Andy.

Mandy's tour dispelled Andy and Lindsay's misconceptions about hospices. "We thought a hospice was for end-of-life care only, but it offers so much more. Andy joined the men's group, sometimes finding it overwhelming, but the chaplain was always there for support," Lindsay shared.

They both enjoyed complementary therapies like Reiki, which provided a peaceful escape, to add to their sense of wellbeing.

Lindsay was able to access counselling from our Family Support team. "I started counselling with Beth from the Family Support team as I struggled



more because we were losing our future, we hadn't retired and had plans to tour America," she said. "Beth was such a great support."

As Andy's illness progressed, the NHS specialist palliative care nurses based at Willow Wood stepped in to provide care for Andy at home. "It felt like a weight was lifted from our shoulders," Lindsay said.

Nicola and Beth from the occupational therapy team also provided invaluable help. "Andy was 6ft 4in, so moving him was difficult, but they showed me techniques that made life easier."

In November 2023, Andy was admitted to the Inpatient Unit at Willow Wood. Lindsay described it as "like coming home" and felt her family was "surrounded by love."

The nurses supported her in liaising with social workers, and Mandy even organised a wreath-making class for Lindsay and her sister, providing much-needed respite. "The staff knew I was upset but pitched it just right to help me take a break," Lindsay explained.

Eighteen months after his diagnosis, Andy died at the Hospice on 6th December 2023, aged 63. "He wanted to be at Willow Wood, and I promised he would be there," said Lindsay. "He felt safe at the Hospice, and so did we. The staff looked after us amazingly during our five weeks there."



The Willow Wood team also supported Lindsay's wider family, including her eight-year-old granddaughter Alice. "I wanted her to remember the Hospice as a happy place. We walk around the gardens, and she loves the sundial and wind chime. Alice had children's counselling sessions with the Willow Wood Family Support team before and after Andy died, which helped her cope. She still loves visiting Willow Wood."

Lindsay is "forever grateful" for Willow Wood's support and plans to volunteer there after retiring. She continues to support fundraising events and receives counselling from the Family Support team.

Andy has a Memory Stone in the Hospice gardens' fountain, where his family recently attended a Butterfly Memory Release, dedicating a butterfly to Andy. "When the choir started to sing, the butterflies were released. Our butterfly flew towards the flowers around the fountain. Alice loved seeing it and later spotted it near home," Lindsay recalled.

Lindsay remains passionate about Willow Wood and urges community support. "We are lucky to have Willow Wood. The services are free, and even a short session can make a huge difference. It's crucial it stays open. "Despite the shock and feeling of a robbed future, our experience with Willow Wood throughout Andy's illness made everything easier." she concluded.

Upon visiting the 22-bed inpatient hospice, which first opened in January 2006, she discovered how they administer palliative care with very limited resources.

Mary Ann said: "It was a privilege to look around, meet some of the staff and patients, and my presentation seemed to go down well. They really are doing

amazing work for the most vulnerable people with very little.

"Hospices in the UK are really struggling right now, but it really pales in comparison to what they are working with over there."

She hopes her visit can herald the start of a lasting relationship between Willow Wood and Jaffna hospices.



At Willow Wood Hospice, we are best when we collaborate, innovate and educate.

Our dedicated staff and volunteers are working together to help shape our strategic aims as an organisation for the next five years.

By actively involving our workforce in this process, we ensure that our future direction is both informed and inspired by those who are integral to our daily operations.

Led by our CEO Tracy Minshull, engagement sessions held in The Hive have seen groups of people from all areas of the Hospice take part, from Retail and Wellbeing Support to the Inpatient Unit and the Board of Trustees.

Split up into small teams, they consisted of members from different departments which contributed to a broad and diverse range of views being discussed.

A fun ice-breaker tested teams' knowledge of the Hospice before they individually identified what we need to become an outstanding Hospice and how these ideas could be grouped together into key themes to form our strategy for 2025 to 2030.

Guided by members of our Senior Management Team who acted as facilitators, each team reported to the wider group a summary of their discussions, which will help to determine our short-term, medium-term and long-term priorities moving forward.

This approach is testament to our commitment to collaboration, innovation and excellence, paving the way for a brighter future for the Hospice and the communities of Tameside and Glossop we serve.







Collaboration is at the heart of hospice care

At Willow Wood Hospice, collaboration isn't just a word - it's the foundation for how we work.

Our mission is to deliver high-quality, multi-professional specialist palliative care, support and education to those in our local community living with a life-limiting illness.

We achieve this through close-knit teamwork that puts our patients and those closest to them at the centre of everything we do.

For years, our dedicated staff have worked closely with the Community Specialist Palliative Care (CSPC) team. This collaboration is more than a partnership – it's an integrated approach to care.

Every day, nurses, who are part of the CSPC team, from Tameside and Glossop Integrated Care NHS Foundation Trust join our daily triage meetings and engage with all of our clinical teams – from Wellbeing Support to Therapy Support.

They provide specialist support in a patient's home environment, as well as education and support to staff within the local community – such as GPs and district nurses.

Since 2019, the community palliative care and respite teams have made the Hospice their home, while the hospital palliative care team joins us weekly, representing the multidisciplinary team.

This regular interaction enables us to provide holistic care to patients and those closest to them from across our community, ensuring they receive the services and support they need when they need it most.

Zoe Price, on behalf of the Community Specialist Palliative Care team, said: "We carry out joint visits if required and are always liaising with all teams, ensuring a patient receives the right service at the right time.

"We have a close working relationship with the Hospice teams. Daily conversations and communication help make our patients' experience the most positive it can be during a difficult time.

"We are continually sharing information, sometimes on an ad-hoc basis, which we may not have the opportunity to if we were not in the same environment."

Rebecca Stimson, Community Services Therapy Lead at the Hospice, commented: "Working collaboratively with the Specialist Palliative Care nurses ensures that the needs of all patients and those closest to them are assessed holistically.

"We work closely with the Specialist Palliative Care nurses and patients are supported by this, as they know their needs are being addressed."
