Since 1981, Hinds Hospice has been a trusted name in compassionate end-of-life care. For many years, though, our work has quietly expanded far beyond hospice. From supporting children living with life-limiting conditions to helping families heal after tragic losses, our mission has always been to meet the community where it hurts and offer hope, comfort, and connection. Today, we take a bold step forward to reflect that wider mission. We are proud to reintroduce ourselves as Hinds LifeCare.

"At Hinds Hospice, we've been recognized for our endof-life care, but our mission reaches beyond. We walk with people through every stage of serious illness, grief, and loss, helping them live with dignity and purpose. Whether through our pediatric palliative program, Angel Babies, or community education, our goal has always been to serve every stage of life, not just the end of it," Interm CEO Lilika Stratigos shares.

Nancy Hinds' founding vision was never confined to a single service. As Executive Director of Counseling and Support Services, Kathy Cromwell explains, "The goal has always been to find a need in the community and do our best to fill it, even if it has little or no connection to hospice." That spirit continues today through unique programs like our LOSS Team, (Local Outreach to Suicide Survivors), which works with Fresno County to support families and first responders immediately after a suicide death, Fresno Survivors of Suicide Loss, working to support those impacted by suicide loss, and HALO (Healing After a Loss by Overdose), offering critical grief support for those grieving a loss by overdose.

These programs matter. They are changing lives.
Families like Jim and Lynn Horton, who lost their son
Zachary to overdose, found strength and support
through our Center for Grief & Healing and HALO
program. Parents in our Hinds Kids Pediatric Program
receive concurrent care support for their children while

they continue to pursue curative treatment. Angel Babies families find comfort and memory-making support in the brief but beautiful lives of their infants. From the Circle of Friends to Pregnancy After a Loss Support Groups and Teen Grief Support, each story reminds us that grief does not begin or end at hospice, and neither should our care.

As Nancy Hinds puts it, "Hinds LifeCare allows us to tell the full story about all the ways we support people through the hardest parts of life." Our new name reflects what we've been doing all along. Because we're not just a place where life ends. We're a place where life, through every stage, is honored, supported, and held with care.



How Hinds LifeCare Supports Families Like Mohammad's

When people meet Mohammad, they see a boy who radiates joy, cracks jokes with strangers, and never misses a beat in his wheelchair races with his twin brother, Adam.

What they don't see, at least at first, is the miracle behind the smile. Six years ago, his mother sat at his hospital bedside and was told to prepare for the worst. But Mohammad had other plans.

His mother, Reema, still remembers the moment everything changed. "We were living in Palestine, and life was great. Then everything changed," she says. "The day before Mohammad's fourth birthday, he suddenly became paralyzed."

Doctors diagnosed him with unexplained ischemia of the spine, a spinal cord injury without trauma. They didn't expect him to survive 72 hours. "But he did," Reema says,

her voice full of both pride and awe. "From that moment on, we knew we had to give him the best chance at life."

Mohammad's medical needs quickly outpaced what was available in Palestine. Reema made the brave decision to leave her home and support system behind. She brought Mohammad and Adam to the United States. They were admitted to Valley Children's Hospital and lived there for four months while she searched for answers and a future for her boys.

Reema's family helped her find long-term care options and eventually a home. Her husband Imad, and the rest of her children soon joined them, reuniting a family that had been through more than most could imagine.

"Mohammad is a fighter," Reema says. "He's joyful, resilient, and looks out for everyone. His spirit never changed. But at first, it was incredibly hard. Adam didn't

understand. Our whole lives changed; how we ate, how we went out, how we communicated." Just when Reema thought she might be completely alone in navigating this new world, a staff member from Hinds Kids Pediatric Program reached out to her. "Hinds called to offer support, but I didn't want to hear it at first," she admits. "We were literally in the car on our way back to the ER when they called. Fortunately, they followed up, and I'm so grateful they did."



Through the Hinds Kids Pediatric Program, Mohammad and his family found more than care. They found a team. "From music therapy that brought him joy, to regular nursing visits from Katie, his RN Case Manager, who helps manage medications and jumps in when there's a gap," Reema recalls. "Once Mohammad had a serious reaction, and Katie helped us avoid the ER by coordinating care and getting us meds that same night. What a blessing to avoid the hospital."

Reema says one of the hardest parts of transitioning from the hospital to home care was the fear that something could go wrong at any moment.

She thought she'd be the only one responsible. "I was terrified to take care of him at first. Scared I'd miss something," she says. "Hinds gave me confidence. Support. Relief. We have a team now. A nurse, a social worker, even Mohammad's favorite aide, Mark, comes for his bath. They laugh. They tell jokes. It's not just care. It's connection."

Six years after Mohammad's diagnosis, the fear of emergency hospital runs is still real, but with Hinds by her side, Reema says her family doesn't feel alone anymore.

Caring for the Whole Family and the Future

Hinds Kids Pediatric Program is about more than medicine. It is about meeting children and families where they are, physically, emotionally, and spiritually, and walking with them every step of the way. Hinds Kids offers concurrent care, which provides the support of hospice while simultaneously continuing medical care.

Dr. David Steinhorn, the Hinds Kids Medical Director, is an internationally recognized pediatric palliative care physician, he leads this vision with compassion and clarity. "We're not just here to care for children at the end of life," says Dr. Steinhorn. "We're here to support their quality of life, every single day. We aim to put more life in each child's days and more days in their lives whenever possible."

His plan for the Hinds Kids Pediatric Program is bold and deeply needed. The goal is to create a national model for integrative, whole-person pediatric palliative care. "We're expanding therapies like music, massage, and play therapy because children deserve joy and meaning in their lives, even in the hardest moments," says Dr. Steinhorn. "And so do their families. In particular, young children and those with developmental disabilities benefit most from developmentally matched services, such as therapeutic play, art, music, aquatic therapy, and comforting touch."

One key focus is transitional care, ensuring that families feel safe and supported when children transition

from hospital to home. "When parents first come home with a medically fragile child, there's fear," Dr. Steinhorn explains. "They need a team they can trust. One that doesn't just show up in emergencies but walks with them day after day.

That's what Hinds Kids provides."

He also emphasizes the importance of respite care and volunteer support so caregivers like Reema can rest and recharge. "Parents are the heart of pediatric care," he says. "We have to take care of them, too."

A Vision of Hope: The Future Children's House

Perhaps the most exciting part of Dr. Steinhorn's vision is the creation of a dedicated children's house. It would be a home-like space for transitional and respite care, where children with incurable conditions could receive care, therapy, and play in a nurturing, medically supported environment. "This would be a sanctuary," says Dr. Steinhorn. "A place for symptom management, therapeutic play, family support and training, and transitional stays when the hospital is too much but home isn't quite ready. It is a space that blends comfort and care. A physical expression of Nancy Hinds' mission to ease suffering."

Dr. Steinhorn knows that this vision will only become a reality with the support of the community. "This kind of care doesn't happen without donors, volunteers, and healthcare partners," he says. "Every contribution helps ensure that no child or family walks this journey alone."

That includes investing in education. The Hinds Kids Pediatric Program welcomes medical students, pediatric residents, therapy interns, and adult hospice trainees. The goal is to help build the next generation of pediatric palliative care professionals and general pediatricians who recognize the importance of providing excellent care for this unique group of children. "We want to teach compassion as much as clinical skill," Dr. Steinhorn says. "Because that's what makes the difference."

The Reason We Do This

When asked what she would say to someone thinking of supporting Hinds LifeCare, Reema doesn't hesitate. "You're not just helping a child. You're helping a family breathe again," she says. "You're helping a mother sleep at night, knowing someone has her back. Hinds Kids gave us hope when we didn't know what would come next."

Mohammad, now ten, still rolls through life with his trademark grin and contagious joy. He continues to inspire everyone who meets him, not because of what he's lost, but because of how fiercely he lives. And behind him, every step of the way, is the Hinds Kids team. They show what is possible when care is built on love.







Hinds LifeCare Services



Programs and services of Hinds LifeCare

Our community support allows us to give a higher level of care, and offer enhanced family support. Our goal at all times is to respect your wishes. The care we provide reflects a partnership between you, your family, and the Hinds LifeCare team. We pride ourselves on our mission to ease suffering, and we are here to help care for the mind, body, and spirit of you and your loved ones as you navigate this journey together.



Patient care services

At Hinds LifeCare, most patients are seen in their homes or in residential care facilities throughout Fresno, Madera, and Merced counties. Our hospice interdisciplinary care team includes nurses, home health aides, medical social workers, chaplains, medical directors, spiritual care providers, and counselors who assist with anticipatory grief. Patient Care Volunteers visit patients where they live, making sure they are as comfortable as possible, and they also provide respite for caregivers and companionship for patients who need it most.



Hinds Hospice Home

The Hinds Hospice Home is staffed with registered nurses and hospice aides 24 hours a day, and at least two patient care staff members are on duty at all times. In addition to a full-time nursing staff, dietician and cook, the Hospice Home has a designated full-time social worker, and a chaplain is always on-call after hours.



Center for Grief & Healing

The Hinds LifeCare Center for Grief & Healing is unique in that it serves not only hospice families but also the community at large with grief support services. The professional staff is available to meet with individuals and families to provide grief counseling. Licensed clinicians are specially trained in dealing with sudden and traumatic loss. The Center for Grief & Healing offers a variety of grief support groups serving both adults and children. The staff also provides workshops and training throughout our community on specific topics of grief and loss.



Angel Babies Perinatal Hospice and Bereavement Program

The sudden loss of a baby in pregnancy or the news of an unborn baby being diagnosed with a life-limiting condition is heartbreaking. As part of the Hinds LifeCare Center for Grief & Healing, Angel Babies/Bebitos Angelitos offers a perinatal palliative care program for families facing a devastating loss. Our team connects at the time of diagnosis or loss, responding to offer support, resources, and comfort.



Hinds Kids Pediatric Program

Children require different care than adults. The Hinds Kids Pediatric Program provides seriously ill children comfort and quality of life as they navigate this journey. The Hinds Kids Program offers families the support of hospice services while still allowing for curative care.



Prison Hospice

This program educates and trains inmates at area prisons to provide hospice care and grief and loss support for fellow inmates. Nancy Hinds believes in equal care for everyone, and that no one should die alone.



Thrift Stores

Hinds LifeCare Thrift Stores provide discounted clothing, household items, and furniture to those in need in the communities we serve, while helping sustain the agency's primary mission of care. These thrift stores are our way of giving back to the community, and they also act to offset the costs of care that Hinds LifeCare provides.



Physician and Medical Professional Education

In an effort to increase physician awareness of what hospice and palliative care can provide to patients and their families, Hinds LifeCare provides specialized end-of-life care training locally to doctors, nurses, and residents from UC San Francisco Medical School, UC Davis, Fresno State, and Fresno City College.



Multicultural and Inclusive Outreach

To support the Central Valley's diverse population, Hinds LifeCare has developed a comprehensive program that strives to provide culturally sensitive services to patients and their families, reflecting the diversity of the communities we serve.




Global Outreach

Through our service and strong social conscience, we believe in sharing our hearts and experiences with those in the global community who have the greatest needs. Nancy Hinds is the interim president of Hospice Africa.



Volunteers

Trained patient volunteers provide respite time for caregivers, and comfort to patients where they live. Their training, talents, and skills are matched to fit every family's unique needs. Hospice Home volunteers answer the door to visitors and handle incoming phone calls for staff, patients, and their families. They also perform light upkeep duties such as folding laundry, replenishing cookies and coffee, and talking with visiting family and friends. Volunteers also help at the Hinds LifeCare Thrift Stores, assist with special events, and provide clerical support.



We Honor Veterans Program

Today, one in four dying Americans is a veteran. These men and women often carry experiences from their military service that present unique psychological and physical challenges at the end-of-life. Hinds LifeCare has the skills needed to serve our veterans. Special staff and volunteer training programs have been established to accomplish that mission.

We Honor Veterans (WHV) is a program that provides resources and guidance to hospice professionals to help dying veterans have a more peaceful end-of-life experience. The program is a partnership between the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization (NHPCO) and the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).



LOSS Team - Local Outreach to Suicide Survivors

The LOSS Team, part of the Hinds LifeCare Center for Grief & Healing, has been a crucial resource since its inception in 2019. The team provides immediate support to individuals impacted by a suicide loss. The team includes a clinician and a volunteer who respond to suicide losses in Fresno County, providing support and resources. These volunteers have also lost a loved one to suicide, and their supportive presence offers hope to the newly bereaved.



HALO Program

Healing After a Loss by Overdose (HALO) is a lifeline for families in Central California and is specifically designed for those navigating the journey of grief associated with an overdose death. Recognizing the escalating occurrence of drug overdoses in the Central Valley, HALO is a beacon of solace. The program offers a variety of support services, offering a compassionate space for shared experiences and providing valuable tools to navigate the complexities of grief.

their stories, and at the end, they released white doves. We were in tears."

The Briscoes have supported A Time to Remember every year since 2005. But for them, it has never been just about giving. It is about standing with families and helping bring healing where it is needed most. "We hope our support encourages others to get involved," Jim says. "There are so many ways to be part of what Hinds is doing."

Over the years, the Briscoes and the Valley Iron Team have watched Hinds LifeCare expand to meet the growing needs of the Central Valley. From pediatric hospice care to grief support for adults, they have seen how each service brings hope to more families.

"Looking back, we are proud to see Hinds reach more people," Jim reflects. "Angel Babies is still close to our hearts. The care Hinds gives to families facing unimaginable loss is truly special."
