Understanding Your Medicare Basics

Medicare consists of four main parts. Part A covers hospital stays and is typically premiumfree for most beneficiaries. Part B handles doctor visits and outpatient services, requiring monthly premiums. Part C, known as Medicare Advantage, offers an alternative way to receive Medicare benefits through private insurance companies. Part D provides prescription drug coverage, either as a standalone plan or included in Medicare Advantage plans.


Timing Matters

Your Initial Enrollment Period begins three months before your 65th birthday and extends three months after. Missing this window can result in lifetime penalties for Part B and Part D coverage. If you're still working and have employer coverage, you may qualify for a Special Enrollment Period, but understanding the rules prevents costly mistakes.




