


To Kill a Mockingbird-Harper Lee

Know your English!



Allegory

An allegory is a narrative in which characters, events, and settings represent abstract concepts or moral qualities. The story operates on two levels: the literal and the symbolic. Here are five examples of allegory:

" Animal Farm" by George Orwell:

Literal Level: The story depicts a group of farm animals who overthrow their human farmer and take over the farm.

Symbolic Level: The farm represents a totalitarian regime, with the animals symbolizing different classes and figures in Soviet Russia. The pigs represent the ruling class (e.g., Napoleon stands for Joseph Stalin), and their eventual corruption and tyranny symbolize the betrayal of the revolution.

"The Allegory of the Cave" by Plato:

Literal Level: Prisoners are chained in a cave, only able to see shadows on the wall cast by objects behind them, which are illuminated by a fire.

Symbolic Level: The cave represents ignorance, and the journey out of the cave symbolizes the philosopher's path to enlightenment and the discovery of the Forms, the ultimate truth in Plato's philosophy. The shadows represent the illusions or false beliefs that people hold.

" The Pilgrim's Progress" by John Bunyan:

Literal Level: The protagonist, Christian, journeys from his hometown, the City of Destruction, to the Celestial City.

Symbolic Level: Christian's journey represents the spiritual journey of a believer towards salvation. The various places and characters he encounters (such as Vanity Fair and the Slough of Despond) represent different spiritual and moral challenges.

" Lord of the Flies" by William Golding:

Literal Level: A group of boys stranded on a deserted island try to govern themselves, but their attempts descend into chaos and violence.

Symbolic Level: The island represents the world, and the boys' descent into savagery symbolizes the inherent evil and the fragile nature of civilization. Characters like Ralph and Jack represent different aspects of human nature and society.

" The Chronicles of Narnia" by C.S. Lewis:

Literal Level: The series follows the adventures of children in the magical land of Narnia, where they encounter talking animals and mythical creatures. Symbolic Level: The stories are rich with Christian allegory. Aslan the lion represents Jesus Christ, and his death and resurrection symbolize the crucifixion and resurrection of Christ. The struggle between good and evil in Narnia mirrors the Christian concept of the battle between God and Satan.



Vocab Voyage



"Obfuscate"- To deliberately make something confusing or difficult to understand. Parts of Speech - Verb

Example in a Sentence - The lawyer's attempt to obfuscate the facts only made the jury more suspicious.

Etymology - "Obfuscate" originates from the Latin verb "obfuscare," which means "to darken" or "to obscure." This verb is composed of "ob-" (toward, against) and "fuscus" (dark). The term passed into Middle English as "obfuscaten," maintaining the sense of making something obscure or unclear. Initially, it referred to literal darkening or dimming. Over time, its usage broadened to include the figurative sense of rendering information, ideas, or meanings difficult to understand, often intentionally. This evolution reflects a common linguistic shift from physical descriptions to abstract applications, capturing the idea of deliberately making something less clear or transparent.
