Bringing storytimes into your living rooms and classrooms was such a highlight for our Youth and Family Services team this year. You sang along, learned new sight words, practiced literacy skills, and made friends with your favorite librarians over 400 times in 2021.

We took the family fun outside in June 2021, turning the Northside Library parking lot into an art gallery, an opera house, a robotics lab, and an obstacle course. Over 280 of you joined us for weekly parking lot parties, shopped at the Friends of the Library pop-up book sales, and enjoyed dinner with the Hyd'n Cheese food truck.

INVESTING IN LOCAL SUCCESS
