

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PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

It is sad to report tonight about the attack on education and educational institutions by the media and other third parties. The newspapers have been full of issues that have happened at different schools during the year. Principals and schools have been under fire and there has been a lot of talk about "schools in crisis". I am happy to report that Bryanston High School is not in any crisis, in fact we are a school performing well above what the norm is for Government Education. In actual fact a lot of visitors often ask the question if this is a private school or

It is the important role played by the parents and the School Governing Body that has made all the difference. I would like to thank Mr Hillebrand and the School Governing Body for all their support and assistance during the past year. Without their guidance the school would not be able to achieve all the goals we set for ourselves.

Our matric results for 2015 were of the best in Gauteng, we had a 100% pass rate with a record number of distinctions. Our Academic staff and Heads of Department worked hard over the past year and with the introduction of Academic Council certainly have set new goals to be achieved. Again, I would like to remind parents that Bryanston High School employs 28 additional teachers and this is made possible by our parents paying school fees. Without these additional teachers class sizes would be unmanageable. I would also like to thank my staff for their dedication to the school.

We were for the sixth year in a row the top Northern Suburb School as rated by the GDE. We hope our current group of Matrics will follow this trend and that they may even improve on the past results.

One issue that is becoming harder and harder to manage at all schools is staffing. In District 9 which is our district 914 teachers left the profession this year. It is sad to report that Bryanston has also lost a few teachers this year, mainly due to immigration. Miss Ives left us to take up a teaching position in Korea, Mr and Mrs van der Merwe left to take up teaching positions in Australia. Mr Hallendorff and Miss Dhlamini have left teaching to join the corporate sector. Miss Markantonis will be leaving at the end of the year to take up a teaching position in America.

I would like to highlight some of our superb achievements in 2016.

- In Athletics we not only managed to survive the A-league but, in actual fact, came second.
- Boys hockey did superbly well in the hockey league although they struggled in the Aitken tournament.
- Boys squash team won many leagues this year
- Our cultural tour to Europe and Eastern Europe was a huge success.
- English and Biology Departments were rated as top in our district again.
- Who will forget the 2016 Major Production? What a success!

The staff and I sincerely believe that an educational environment must always be kept neat and tidy and that is why we spend a lot of attention on our grounds and buildings. The school is almost 50 years old and maintenance of structures is not always that easy. We had to spend R200 000 on severe structural damage to our East Wing that could endanger learners' lives. Unfortunately over the next few years we will have to repeat this exercise in our Central and West wing.

Other improvements around the school:

- · Flooring of classrooms
- · Upgrading the School Network
- Upgrading Computer Centres
- · New Gardens
- · Ongoing painting projects
- Refurbishing Biology and Science Centres

One of our biggest challenges is the lack of involvement from our parent body and I would like to urge all of our parents to get involved and support their children in their endeavours. I remember the good old days when Derby Matches meant anything from 4000-5000 people attending. We have initiated new incentives this year and hope to draw back the crowds we used to have.



t the end of 2015 I made mention of the excitement I could feel in the air for the year ahead. 2016 has been a phenomenal year. The buzz has been quite palpable and without doubt we have been challenged in 2016 as well as seen the rewards of our labours.

On the financial side of the school. 2016 has been an exceptionally tough year. The general state of the economy has been reflected in our ability to collect fees and this has necessitated us having to dip into our 2015 reserves. This position is unsustainable and it is imperative that we as parents realise that without all parents paying their fees, the quality education we all want for our children is just not achievable. Please can I implore on you to consider the effect not paying fees has on our ability to equip your sons and daughters for their lives ahead.

As always, our first function of the year was our staff long service awards with numerous staff being recognised for reaching various milestones in their chosen careers. We welcomed 4 new "young" academics, 1 administrative staff member and 1 sports administrator. These new staff members continue to add to the mix of youth and experience that we see in our staffroom.

Shortly after our long service award evening, Bryanston High was once again recognised by the GDE as the "Top School" in the northern suburbs. We have won this coveted award for six successive years. While in 2014 we just missed out on a 100% pass rate, 2015 saw that change. We achieved the coveted 100% pass rate with a 74.46% bachelors pass. Cameron Matthews got an awesome 8

distinctions, two learners got 7 distinctions, two learners got 6 distinctions and six learners got 5 distinctions. Without doubt this was aided by rolling out the successful academic council to all grades. After two years' academic council has gained tremendous traction and our learners are reaping the rewards of this programme.

Our Grade 8 learners for 2016 have surpassed our initial expectations in both numbers and their enthusiasm for the institution. The new young additions, together with their grade controllers, have proven a driven and energetic lot. We look forward to their input over the next 5 years.

While we acknowledge we are first and foremost an academic institution, we do strive to provide a holistic education which includes cultural, sporting and social responsibility programs. On the cultural side we found ourselves in the middle of an amazing production of "Disco Inferno". For those of us who were brought up in the 70's and 80's it was an incredible trip down memory lane. Our learners and staff spent many hours in rehearsal prior to presenting it to their parents, friends and the broader Bryanston community. Our thanks to the many staff and parents for their tireless mentoring, passion and commitment to the learners who gave of themselves to entertain us. The production set exceptionally high standards and brought out talent in our learners that many parents and friends did not believe existed. Well done to our learners and staff for an entertaining and uplifting night out.

On the sports field we continue to see improvement year by year. We have upgraded our cricket nets and now boast a truly impressive facility. The nets have been reconditioned and resurfaced with TruBounce. Every team is rotated through this facility during the weekly practice rotation.

Our win ratios in almost all sporting codes have risen yet again this past year with success rates of 60 - 70% no longer being the norm but rather expected. This is not without hard work from our sportsmen, sportswomen and their coaches. Training like never before, teams continue jockeying for space on the fields in the first and second terms all of them at 6am in the morning in preseason training, let alone the regular afternoon practices. On some mornings there were as many as 6 different codes all putting the in the hard yards. Let's not forget the coaches who were also out there at 6 am most mornings with their teams and then still putting in a full day's teaching, followed by an afternoon of coaching and then preparing for the next day in the evenings.

Last year I single out our Athletics Team. After having won the C League in 2014, they were promoted to the B League in 2015 and set themselves the lofty goal of winning the B League. As with setting goals, the hard work paid off and they won the B League. Being in the A League was quite a challenge and 2016 was about staying in the A League. To their credit they performed wonderfully and came a brilliant second at the Inter High beating our traditional northern suburb rivals.


Charities have benefited, enabling those who are less privileged to share in the rewards of your efforts.


2016 Was a big year for Bryanston High, with many highlights. Not least of which was the opening of our very own Sports Recovery Centre.























The 2016 season flew by! A very busy season yet again between League and Derby days.




Each Year I am amazed by the dedication and inspired logic that takes place through the Mathematical Olympiad.




