Church service has been donated, death certificate has been released so she can receive the \$900 for his burial. The discussion was whether to give the money directly to Scales Funeral home or to her. Keith Prather made a motion to give Mrs. Jackson the \$250. TK Kast seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Veterans & Military Support (V&MS) Programs




- Unmet Needs: Is there to help America's military families who have run into unexpected financial difficulties as a result of deployment or other military related activity or injury.





A Tribute to PVT Frank Acquavia


Joey King (American Legion China Post 1 member as well as AMVETS Tennessee Post 325 Commander) was at Champy's in Smyrna back in January of this year, when he saw the attached sign hanging in the establishment. He contacted me because not only does this sign identify an American Legion Post, but more importantly, the Post was a memorial dedicated to an WWII Soldier who died in captivity and his remains have not been found. I have included some information about PVT Acquavia we found during our search. As best we can tell, he has no actual connection to Tennessee. It just so happens that PVT Acquavia's birthday is May 28th, just after Memorial Day.

Veterans in the Murfreesboro American Legion Post 141, AMVETS Post 325 and VFW Post 4575 believe that it would be a fitting end to the observance of Memorial Day to gather at Champy's in Smyrna on his birthday about 7:00 pm and toast PVT Frank Acquavia. We have contacted the Smyrna Champy's Manager and she also supports the idea. We would like to invite all Veterans and supporters to Champy's , 835 Isabella Lane, Smyrna, TN at about 7:00 pm for an informal, short celebration of PVT Aquavia's short life.

Acquavia, whose body was never recovered, died May 10, 1942, as a prisoner of Japan. He had been serving with the 59th Coast Artillery Regiment, according to the book "No One Forgets," which was written by George Burns III and Richard Titus. Acquavia lived at 53 E. Second St., and was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Rocco Acquavia.

He was captured in Corregidor during the opening days of the war in the Pacific, right after the attack on Pearl Harbor. "The Japanese herded some Americans down to a seaplane landing area," the book noted. "Frank went to retrieve or find food that was hidden at their battery. A Japanese guard spotted him and opened fire with a machine gun killing him instantly. This was witnessed by Jim Rossoto of Fredonia."

Former American Legion Post 1344 in Dunkirk, New York was named after him.



VA LOAN MYTHS DEBUNKED!

Myth: VA loans require a down payment.

Fact: VA loans typically do not require a down payment, offering a significant advantage for eligible veterans and service members.

Myth: VA loans are only for single-family homes.

Myth: You can only use your VA loan benefit once.

Fact: You can use your VA loan benefit multiple times throughout your life, as long as you meet the eligibility requirements and have remaining entitlement.
