DISTRICT FINANCIAL UPDATE

At its January 29 meeting, the AWLS Board of Education approved a Financial Recovery Plan that was submitted to the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce (DEW). This plan includes a proposed operational levy that will appear on the March 19 ballot, along with budget reductions in an effort to eliminate the negative cash balance projected for FY25 and FY26.

REQUESTED REVENUE INCREASE

The District is asking voters to vote on a five-year, 2.42-mill operational levy that would generate \$3.3M starting in January 2025.

APPROVED EXPENDITURES

- 1. The District has approved the following reductions in expenditures the 2023-24 school year: ~\$492,000 in materials and supplies, purchased services and contracted services with the ESC of Lake Erie West.
- 2. The District has approved the following expenditure reductions for the 2024-25 school year, <u>regardless of whether or not the levy passes</u>:
 - ~\$394,000 in cost savings due to certified and administrative attrition.
 - The reduction of an administrative position.
- 3. The District has approved the following expenditure reductions for 2024-25 <u>if the levy does not pass.</u> The reductions listed above plus:
 - The implementation of pay-to-participate for grades 7-12 athletics.
 - Decreasing the number of extracurricular supplemental positions filled.
 - Eliminating six custodial service positions and one media center aide position
 - Reducing bus transportation by eliminating service to students who reside within one mile of their school and eliminating extracurricular transportation.
- 3. The District has approved the following expenditure reductions for 2025-26 <u>if the levy does not pass.</u> The reductions listed above plus:
 - Additional material/supplies and purchased services reductions.
 - Additional administrative position reductions
 - Decreasing safety services at FTMS.
 - Eliminating field trips.
 - Further reducing bus transportation by eliminating service to students who reside within two miles of their school and eliminating extracurricular transportation.

Watch for more opportunities to stay active with your families and colleagues as the weather starts to warm this spring!














LAUREN RADWAN INDUCTED INTO HALL OF FAME

Lauren (Soldner) Radwan, Intervention Specialist at Waterville Primary was inducted into the Gannon University Athletics Department Hall of Fame on Saturday, Feb. 3. Lauren was a pitcher for the Gannon Golden Knights softball team where she led her team to three NCAA appearances. She ranks second in program history with 65 career victories and ranks third with 566 strikeouts. Lauren is the program's career leader in pitching starts, appearances, single season starts and single-season appearances.

Lauren was also a standout in the classroom. She was a threetime ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Selection and made the GLIAC All-Academic Team several times.
