Red Tide Retreats from Gulf and Bay

Good news on the water front. Red tide has retreated over the past according to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC).

In a most recent report, the FWC says the red tide organism Karenia brevis was detected in 76 samples collected from Florida's Gulf Coast. That figure was down from 85 on Oct. 30. "Bloom concentrations (>100,000 cells/liter) were present in 18 samples," FWC added; the Oct. 30 figure was 21.

Country Club Shores Milling & Paving Project begins Wednesday: Watch for traffic backups

The Nov. 1 report listed the number of such samples and the associated county, as follows: 3 from and offshore of Sarasota County, 2 offshore of Pinellas County, 4 offshore of Charlotte County, 8 offshore of Lee County, and 1 offshore of Collier County.

FWC then noted that, in Southwest Florida over the past seven days, Karenia brevis was observed at background to high concentrations in and offshore of Sarasota County, background to medium concentrations in and offshore of Pinellas County, very low to low concentrations in and offshore of Manatee County, background to high concentrations in and offshore of Charlotte County, very low to medium concentrations in and offshore of Lee County, background to medium concentrations offshore of Collier County, and background concentrations offshore of Monroe County.

Fish kills suspected to be related to red tide and respiratory irritation suspected to be related to red tide was also reported, as well, during the preceding seven days. Those reports came from

In order to finalize the information packet, I had a follow up conversation with Ashley Mitchell and Darryl Gipson from FDEM. There has been conversations on assisting condo-

miniums and private property owners but currently there is not an avenue at which the state works with FEMA for debris removal reimbursement for commercial properties and private owners.

Ashley and Darryl have been informed:

- 1. Regarding the information provided during the FEMA meeting with Kimber Kipp, FEMA reps, LBK Mayor and town employees.
- 2. The Town will not enter into an agreement or MOU with condominiums and private property owners to remove debris.
- 3. The Town will not be participating in a sub recipient agreement with condominiums, private property owners, or their contractors.

4. The Town of Longboat has submitted our Notice of Intent and ROEs for Helene and

Milton. No additional PPDRs will be submitted on the behalf of a non-governmental entity. Ashley Mitchell has offered his availability for a call tomorrow to discuss additional options available for private property owners. Ashley will also attempt to have a FEMA representative present for discussion.

Please advise if you are available for a call between the above time ranges. I will provide any documentation needed to disseminated to the residents based on FDEM suggestions.

Sips best prepare us for the meal


our era of gigantic Martini glasses, supersized wine glasses, and hefty steins of beer, the art of drinking small sips of alcoholic beverages has fallen out of fashion. We hope to revive the pleasures of sipping little pours of wines, liqueurs, and spirits.

Don't get the wrong idea about the sumptuous dinner parties in 19th century France, the seven course menus with

a glass of wine paired with each course.

Seven glasses of wine during a dinner might suggest besotted guests nodding their heads dangerously close to their fine Saint Armand dinner plates. Not so. The wine glasses of the time held not much more than an ounce of the carefully curated wine. Sipping seven small glasses of wine would merely add a dimension of taste to each course.



In our era of gigantic Martini glasses, supersized wine glasses, and hefty steins of beer, the art of drinking small sips of alcoholic beverages has fallen out of fashion. We hope to revive the pleasures of sipping little pours of wines, liqueurs, and spirits.

The drinks that add a dimension to a dining experience have special characteristics and strong tastes. A light pour of a 2023 Corte Vigna Pinot Grigio from the Provincia di Pavia



(ABV 11%) cleanses the palate before tasting a shellfish or light finfish course, and its sharp acidic finish stimulates gastric juices that aid in digestion. On a bargain shelf the Corte Vigna Pinot Grigio costs less than \$5 for a 750ML bottle. We use wines like this in cooking and to pour in small qualities to enhance fish dishes.

Sipping a Sherry, Port, or Madeira in a small glass better prepares us at times for a robust meal better than a whiskey or Gin cocktail. Among our favorites, the non-vintage Henriques

y Henriques Rainwater Meio Seco (medium dry) Madeira (-\$20) has a light caramel and hazelnut taste.

We have written at length about Amari Aperitifs and Digestifs, and won't repeat ourselves. We'll move on to higher alcohol after dinner drinks. Brandies figure prominently in this category. The ABK6 Cognac VS (\$30) from the Cognac Commune in the Abecassis region of France \$40) has the smooth taste imparted by at least two years of aging in French

Cognac shares a similar taste profile with Madeira, but with more heat. A Grappa, a spirit distilled in Italy from what's left over after making wine, has a strong taste. Small sips of the Alberti Strega Grappa di Aglianico, Campania, Italy (\$48) taste best. Vodka infused with all types of flavors has become popular; less so, and neglected as we see it, Aquavit from Scandinavia infuses caraway seeds and perhaps dill, fennel, star anise, and coriander as well into a neutral distilled spirit. The Lysholm Linie Aguavit (\$38) from Norway uses oak barrels for aging, including months at sea in turbulent waters. The Linie Aquavit has a grainy texture with hints of rye bread.

S. W. 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
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
