OUR VISITORS



Between 1897 and 1908 friendly matches were played by a team from Langford against other local villages. Home games were at Boot Meadow, a couple of hundred yards from "The Boot" a former public house which still stands at the south end of the village.

Langford Football Club was formed in 1908 and competitive football began with entry into The Biggleswade and District Junior

League for the 1908-1909 season. On Saturday 12th September we played our first match, beating Shefford Town 6-2. We finished 10th of 11 teams, with only Shefford below us. Two years later Shefford were top and Langford runners up.

We finished second for four years out of five, and won our first ever trophy, The Beds Junior Cup, in April 1914 with a 4-1 victory over Luton Rosedale. Sadly three of that cup winning team, and one of the reserves, died during the First World War.

From 1919-1925, and again from 1935-1949, our home ground was at Vicarage End, next to the River Ivel, at the far north end of the village. In between, from 1925-1935, we played at The Leys, which was much more central. The building of a new housing estate at The Leys forced our return to Vicarage End.

The inter-war years were not very successful, despite the team having some good players, several of whom served us for more than ten years. We won the Bedford and District League for the first time in 1931-1932, and after three defeats in the final of The North Beds Charity Cup collected that trophy in 1928, and also in 1931.

In 1949 we moved grounds again to the new King George V Memorial Playing Field

in the centre of Langford, and gained instant success on the improved surface. A wonderful season bought us the "double" of The Bedford League Championship and The League Cup. Our league record was P26 W20 D5 L1 F121 A35 Pts45. We scored two 10s, three 8s, and two 7s, and Johnny Gabitas (league) and "Dud" Dudley (cup) each scored 6 goals in a game, both club records.

We then won nothing until 1969 when a 7-0 defeat of Brache Sparta secured us the Beds Intermediate Cup. The managerial skills of two former LutonTown winners, Billy Waugh and Roland Legate, bought us a succession of trophies between 1969 and 1976, and only Steve Norris has surpassed them.







Our visitors continued

Steve's 1988-89 team repeated the "double" success of forty years previously, albeit at the much stronger level of the South Midlands League Premier Division. As of today, this is the highest league (level 5) in which we have competed. Over the last 20+ years we have suffered a few relegations and enjoyed our promotions and many cup successes.

Thanks to the vision and hard work of our former Chairman and President, Mr Ted Rutt, assisted by his hard working committee, we were able to move to our own ground at Forde Park in 1984. This is at the south end of the village just over the parish boundary with Henlow, and where we still play today. We purchased the Freehold from Mid-Beds District Council in 1991. A new 106 seater stand was opened I December 2007, and standing accommodation for another 100 spectators a year later.

The pitch was levelled and re-sown in the summer of 2006, and is now one of the best in the league, thanks to the continuing efforts of a number of committee members. We are pleased to have also won the League's Sportsmanship Cup, which covers hospitality as well as conduct throughout the club, on five occasions between 2000 and 2011.

After a successful end to season 2016/2017 season 2017/2018 was a difficult anticlimax.Rob Bates and Paul Donnelly took over the team management full of confidence and apart from a heavy defeat in the FA cup had some reasonable wins in the FA Vase. Unfortunately Rob and Paul decided to call it a day and were replaced by Rob Verdia and Martin Wells, with latter eventually taking the reigns as first team manager in February 2018. Martin continued in the position of Manager for season 2019/2020 assisted by Kylrn Brook-Lynch.

Due to the COVID pandemic the 2020/21 season was cut short, thus resulting in the league becoming null and void. At the end of the 2020/21 season it was mutually agreed that Martin was to be replaced as manager and the club would seek out a new management team. The newly appointed management consisted of Robert Russell (manager), Chris Howells (manager), Stuart Robertson (coach) and Graham Reynolds. The new management came in full of desire and ambition to return the club to winning ways.

During the 2021/22 season the club got off to a good start, winning four out of the first seven games. However, as the season progressed the results began to fluctuate. After multiple disciplinaries and fines the club took the step to replace Robert. The successors of the two managers were Stuart Robertson and

Graham Reynolds. Stuart and Graham displayed an interest in taking over the management role as they are familiar with the club set up already, and had already established a good rapport with the players. Stuart and Graham aim to set a high standard for their players while also upholding the high standards and values of the club.



ASK any manager or coach, proven goalscorers are so desperately hard to come by these days, so, to see not one, but two, Non-League striker legends hang up their scoring boots, it's only right their achievements are celebrated.

Both Sam Higgins and Dave Tarpey have bowed out of the game these last few weeks with their legendary status intact. Stacks of goals wherever they've played and trophies gleaming in the cabinet back home/ When Sam Higgins first stepped into Non-League football as a fresh-faced 17-year-old, little did he know he would forge a career to bring joy to so many.

After nine years at the Millwall academy and a brief stint at Southend United, Higgins dipped his toes in Non-League waters and the rest was history.

In 16 years, Higgins established himself as one the part-time game's most decorated figures, scoring a whopping 403 career goals and picking up an unrivalled haul of collective and individual accolades along the way. Undoubtedly, his highlight was an iconic first spell at East Thurrock United, which yielded 275 goals and no fewer than four Golden Boots, at Steps 2, 3 and 4. He also won the Isthmian Premier and North division titles and steered

At Hornchurch, he lifted the FA Trophy at Wembley and Isthmian Premier title as well as a Player of the Year and Golden Boot double.

the Rocks to a first-ever Essex Senior Cup success.

With further success came at Chelmsford City (two spells), Bromley, Canvey Island, it's no wonder Higgins made such an impact in and around his native Essex

But, last week, after picking up a heel injury while playing for Hashtag United, the 35-year-old finally called time on his glittering career, to a social media fanfare from past clubs, managers, teammates and fans.

From his first loan spell at Fisher Athletic to his last hurrah at Hashtag United, Higgins was highly regarded by all and will go down as one of Non-League's all-time greats.





"It's been a very long time and, at some point, it had to come to an end, unfortunately," said Higgins, before admitting he has no burning desire to return to the game in a coaching

capacity.

"It was a tough decision, but it felt like the right one. I've had quite a few injuries over the last few seasons and a couple of weeks back I had a heel injury which is probably going to take a few months to recover from.

"Having a lot of injuries can be mentally draining so to be able to come out of it with a sense of achievement is something to be proud of.

"The thing I will miss most about the game is the people. I've met friends for life; managers, players and the people working within the game. Those are the best relationships, ones to last a lifetime."

Tarpey, meanwhile, has a similar tale to tell.

A hat-trick of promotions, a deal to become a professional footballer and a record-breaking goalscoring season, the 35-year-old too boasts a CV that many aspiring footballers could only dream of.

Tarpey announced his retirement last week after rupturing his ACL for a second time, while playing for Marlow against Biggleswade Town in the FA Trophy. Starting at Basingstoke Town and then Hampton & Richmond, the skilful forward also enjoyed a spell at Farnborough before taking his game to a whole new level at Maidenhead United, scoring 44 goals in their National League South title winning season – still a league record.

That earned him a two-year pro deal at National League high-fliers Barnet but Tarpey suffered a serious knee injury on his home debut, prompting a lengthy period of rehabilitation.

A stint at Woking saw him rediscover his form before Bracknell Town and Leather-head led him to a promotion-winning season at Marlow under manager Mark Bartley before his latest injury.

"I always said over the last few years, as long as I can stay injury free I'll keep playing," Tarpey told the Maidenhead Advertiser.

"I've got three children and a fiancé at home who have had to put up with me travelling up and down the country for the last 13 years.

"I got three promotions, won numerous county cups and I can retire and say for the level I've played, I feel I've had a great career with what I've done.

"Some people don't get promoted at all in their career, to say I've won three is a great achievement."

CLUB HISTORY

Buckingham Football Club is a football club based in Buckingham, Buckinghamshire, England. Formed by a merger of Buckingham Athletic and Buckingham United in 2023, they are currently members of the Spartan South Midlands League Division One and play at Stratford Fields.

The club was first formed in 1933 as **Buckingham Juniors**, but it was three years before a ground was found, allowing the club to enter the Brackley and District League. When they got their ground, it was originally called Timm's Meadow, before later becoming Stratford Fields. In 1939 the club adopted **Buckingham Athletic FC** as its name. It then took the club 27 years to win its first trophy when in 1960–61 they won their first trophy, the North Bucks League Shield.

In 1965 they applied and was accepted to the Hellenic League where they played in Division 1 finishing a creditable mid-table position in their first season but also won the Berks & Bucks FA Junior Cup. Their success continued and in 68/69 was promoted to the Premier Division after finishing Division runners-up.

The late 60's brought about some good success for the whole club with the Youth, Reserve and First teams all picking up trophies with the First winning the Buckinghamshire Senior Cup for the first team.

After a steady decline in fortunes in 78/79 the club returned to the North Bucks League and it wasn't until the mid-80's that further success was achieved

This was the start of a successful period for the club and after winning the North Bucks Premier League title they moved to the South Midlands Division 1 in 1985 winning the league at their first attempt, losing only 3 games throughout the season.

However, success came too quickly, and the ground facilities were not ready for promotion to the Premier Division so they had to remain in Division 1. The following season they were once again knocking on the door of the Premier League as they finished runners-up but a last minute hold up on planning permission once again stalled promotion. However, promotion was achieved the following year when they did the league and cup double andwith correct ground grading in place the club was promoted to the Premier League for the first time.

Throughout the 90's all the teams in the club consistently won trophies

although the highest the first team achieved in the Premier League was in 97 when they finished 5th.

The late 90's the club struggled financially, and they made a very difficult decision to drop out of the top flight and they were placed back in Division 2. A level of stability was brought about the club and in 2003 they were promoted back to Division 1.

Once again ground grading held the club back as in 2004 they finished runners-up in Division 1 and promotion back to the Premier league was denied.

Since 05/06 a huge amount of work has taken place to upgrade the clubhouse and football facilities but unfortunately success on the field has been sparse.

In 2023 Buckingham Athletic started talks with Buckingham United to bring the two clubs together with the sole purpose of having one senior football team in the town.

Buckingham United FC were formed in 2011 with the sole aim of providing local grassroots football. This began as a single Sunday side playing in Deanshanger due to a lack of local facilities. After the first season the club moved to Tingewick but it was not until 2016 when the club finally moved into Buckingham to the new Lace Hill Sports and Community Centre. The club joined the North Bucks and District League before joining the South Midlands League Division Two in 2019. Here the club grew quickly providing grassroots football across various levels and abilities which peaked with eight teams by 2021, this included Saturday First and Reserves, Sunday League A & B sides, Veterans, Ladies along with an Under 21s and Under 18s.

The club reached many cup finals across the teams including winning the North Bucks and District League Division One shield in 2018. In the final season under Buckingham United the ladies side really gave the club a wonderful finally winning the Northants Premier Division Title and League Cup double.

As a result of many meetings between the clubs, both Buckingham Athletic & Buckingham United formally agreed to pass the motion to combine both clubs, creating Buckingham Football Club, which now has one of the largest offerings of adult football in the region with a structured youth pathway with our strategic partners Moretonville Junior FC.


This is not an end to Buckingham Athletic or Buckingham United, this is very much a continuation in the story of these clubs and football within the town. The history of which won't be forgotten.
