BLACK SHEEP MMFC TREASURE VALLEY CHAPTER

In the small town of Meridian, Idaho, where the motorcycle-to-resident ratio significantly exceeds the national average, a unique chapter of bikers has been making waves over the last three years. Established on January 24, 2021, the Black Sheep Treasure Valley Chapter, which ministers to High Desert Harley-Davidson and the InterMountain HOG Chapter, has become a nexus where faith, friendship, and the open road intersect.

The chapter's journey began with just a handful of members but has since grown to include 14 patched members and a mentee. Their mission remains steadfast: Bringing the Gospel to Those Who Ride.

How do they accomplish this?

Treasure Valley Chapter members volunteer bi-weekly at the dealership and participate in most HOG rides. They also host Bike Blessings at the dealership annually in the spring.

In 2023, they hosted the Black Sheep Regional Rally in Meridian, Idaho, attracting over 200 attendees from across the United States. Their HOG hapter led many rides, showcasing their organizational prowess and community spirit. They had the highest number of Regional Directors ever to attend a Regional Rally, underscoring their extensive network and influence.

Just months ago, in September 2024, they organized an eight-day, 2,500-mile HOG ride through Southern Utah, visiting most of the National Parks, further solidifying their reputation for adventure and community engagement.

In the broader landscape of the biker world, the Treasure Valley Chapter, with its modest 14 members, emerges as a David among Goliaths, wielding faith over size, proving that true impact is measured not by numbers but by the depth of commitment and the breadth of service to the Lord.

IS A TRIKE RIGHT FOR YOU?

WHILE NOT THE MOST COMMON MODELS ON THE MARKET, TRIKE MOTORCYCLES HAVE BEEN AROUND FOR DECADES AND HAVE A VERY DEDICATED FANBASE OF ENTHUSIASTIC RIDERS. IF YOU'RE CONSIDERING SHOPPING FOR A TRIKE MOTORCYCLE, WE ENCOURAGE YOU TO CHECK OUT OUR ARTICLE BELOW TO DISCOVER IF THIS UNIQUE MODEL IS THE RIGHT FIT FOR YOU.



IS A TRIKE SAFER THAN A MOTORCYCLE?

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), two-wheeled motorcycles accounted for 91 percent of all motorcycles involved in fatal crashes in 2019. However, two-wheeled motorcycles are still much more common than trikes, so it's hard to say definitively. Trikes certainly reduce some of the risks of riding a motorcycle. For example, a trike is harder to drop or roll than a motorcycle, especially for trikes with a two-in-front configuration. That increased stability can make navigating bad weather or uneven road surfaces easier. Because of their more prominent profile, trikes can be more visible, which can also improve safety.

BEGINNER RIDERS

If you're new to motorcycle riding, a trike may just be the perfect beginner model. These models provide a ton of stability and are great for riding long distances or making short stops around town. While they are quite bulky, trikes are often considered one of the safest models on the market and are typically easier to turn and maneuver than your standard two-wheel model.

TRAVEL ENTHUSIASTS

While trikes are great commuter vehicles, they were originally designed for long-distance travel. As a result, they come with a number of features that are perfect for long rides, including increased storage space, large gas tanks, and extremely comfortable seating for both you and a passenger.

CASUAL RIDERS

If you're more of a casual motorcycle rider, you may prefer the relaxed riding position a trike provides. No need to lean forward or side to side as you ride or exert a ton of energy. You can simply sit back and relax in the model's comfortable seat and enjoy the scenery rushing by.

WHAT IS A TRIKE MOTORCYCLE?

A trike is a type of motorcycle built on a chassis with three wheels. The standard trike has one wheel in front and two in the back. A reverse trike has two wheels in the front and one wheel in the back. Trikes started as aftermarket customizations of standard motorcycles. Many new models blur the line between motorcycle and car.

TRIKE VS. MOTORCYCLE

The most obvious difference between a trike and a traditional motorcycle is the number of wheels. A trike has three wheels, while a traditional motorcycle has two wheels. The three wheels of a trike give it greater stability on the road than a two-wheel motorcycle, but a trike is often slower in speed and unable to maneuver in tight spaces as easily as a traditional motorcycle.



REASONS YOU MAY WANT A TRIKE

Trikes are more than cool-looking types of motorcycles. With both standard and customized options, trikes are becoming increasingly popular amongst the most diehard Harley fans for the following reasons.

DO I NEED AN "M" ENDORSEMENT ON MY DRIVER'S LICENSE TO RIDE A TRIKE?

You will have to do your research on this one as every state varies. In California for example, according to chp.ca.gov two-wheeled motorcycles require an M-1 endorsement. Three-wheeled motorcycles or motorcycles with an attached sidecar require only a Class C driver license per CVC 12804.9.





BUYING A TRIKE MOTORCYCLE

Buying a trike motorcycle is an option for riders who are looking for greater stability, storage space, and comfort when compared to a traditional two-wheel motorcycle. You can buy a new or used trike motorcycle or convert a two-wheel motorcycle into a trike with a trike kit.

TIPS FOR BUYING A TRIKE MOTORCYCLE

1. DECIDE WHICH FEATURES ARE MOST IMPORTANT

Buying a trike motorcycle is an option for riders who are looking for greater stability, storage space, and comfort when compared to a traditional two-wheel motorcycle. You can buy a new or used trike motorcycle or convert a two-wheel motorcycle into a trike with a trike kit.



2. CONSIDER A NEW, USED, OR A CONVERTED TRIKE MOTORCYCLE

You can buy a new or used trike motorcycle, or you can convert a traditional motorcycle into a trike. A conversion requires buying a trike kit and could be an option for riders who already own a motorcycle. New trikes offer the most up-to-date safety features but are often more expensive than buying a used trike. Buying used is an option if you have a smaller budget or want to gain experience on a trike before upgrading. It's a good idea to test ride a new, used, or converted trike if possible.

3. FINANCE YOUR TRIKE MOTORCYCLE

Unless you have cash on hand to buy a trike, you'll likely need to finance your purchase. Financing is available through banks, credit unions, and dealerships. You may need to make a down payment, and your monthly payments are typically determined by your credit score, interest rate, and the total price of the trike. Remember, the borrower is slave to the lender (Proverbs 22:7).







PROS AND CONS OF TRIKE MOTORCYCLES

TRIKE MOTORCYCLE PROS

- **Stability**: Trike motorcycles are more stable and resist tipping over. Depending on the axle's width between the paired wheels, they can stand up independently.
- Storage space: Due to their larger size, trikes typically have more storage space than a comparable twowheeler.
- Comfort: They are less tiring to ride than standard motorcycles since they don't require as much — or in many cases, any — work to balance.

TRIKE MOTORCYCLE CONS

- Price: Trike motorcycles often cost more than a comparable two-wheeled motorcycle.
- Maneuverability: The larger size of trikes makes them more difficult to park and maneuver through traffic.
- Learning curve: The biggest drawback for motorcycle enthusiasts is that they feel different than riding a two-wheeler. Reverse trike models now exist with tilting wheels in the front, allowing the rider to lean more as they would with a typical motorcycle.

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Hollywood Dave: Rob, you seem to give a lot back to the community, what are some of your favorite ways of giving back?

Rob the Shark: You know Dave, we love to give back to the community, we love our military, we love our first responders, we love helping kids. We try to give back as much as possible during the holidays or by doing special rides, going to events, raising money, donating and doing pro bono work. The community is very important. The community supports us, and we do everything to support the community.

Hollywood Dave: Do you have investigators, or do I need to find an investigation service?

Rob the Shark: You do not need to find an investigation service you come straight to us. Shark Law Motorcycle Attorneys will provide the investigators. We have plenty of investigators that will go out to the scene of the accident, they will take measurements, they will take photographs, and they will go one extra step that the police officer might not. Why? Because they are there to help us with your case. They are part of team. We have plenty of them. You have nothing to worry about. When you come on board you have a full team behind you.

Hollywood Dave: That's information everybody should know.

Hollywood Dave: If I'm injured how do I get treatment?

Rob the Shark: That's the last thing you need to worry about. We have numerous doctors that specialize in different areas, and they will be assigned to your case. They will take care of you, they will treat you, and will make sure that you are 100% OK; and if you're not, they will make sure to set up your treatment plan for the future. That is something that's very important to prove up your case. When it comes to doctors don't worry about it we got you.

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Hollywood Dave: Have you had cases where your experience as a rider has helped you win?

Rob the Shark: Absolutely Dave. I myself have been riding for many years. If you go down while you're splitting lanes for example which is legal in California, I can understand as I've been there. I've been cut off before. I split lanes every day. In fact, I rather be splitting lanes at all times. Splitting lanes, riding in the HOV lane, all these things matter because when someone crosses the lane and hits you, I know what it's like. I have gone through that. I spent time in the hospital myself and I know what it takes to argue a case from the motorcycle attorney's perspective.

Hollywood Dave: What if I am not sure my accident is worth an attorney. How can I know for sure?

Rob the Shark: Great question Dave. Give us a call. Our consultations are free 24/7. Ask for Rob. Talk to me and I will tell you if your case isn't worth pursuing. From all kinds of different angles. And if we do decide to take the case, if we think you have a valid case you have nothing to lose because we work on a contingency fee agreement basis. If there's no recovery there's no fee.
