Special amenities include ADA-compliant rooms, lounge, full-service kitchen, game room, and tranquility room.

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Resources We Provide

- Assignment of a recovery care team and development of a comprehensive recovery plan
- Support through the disability evaluation system (DES) process and assistance in transitioning to civilian life or return to duty
- Established relationship with Department of Veterans Affairs, Department of Labor, military treatment facilities, charitable organizations, and more

Assignment to WWBn-W

- Has injuries that will require more than 90 days of medical treatment or rehabilitation.
- Is unable to serve a function in the parent command due to their injuries or illnesses.
- Transfer by Service Record

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Benefits of Assignment

- Full-time focus on recovery
- Holistic approach to recovery care that ensures all facets of a Marine's or Sailor's health are addressed: mind, body, spirit, and family
- Camaraderie with other Marines facing similar challenges
- Counseling on returning to full duty, including Permanent LIMDU/Extended LIMDU status

Support for the FMF/SE Commands

- Subject matter experts are taking care of your Marine and their family
- Alleviates unit's administrative requirements that often accompany a Marine's non-medical care

External Support Provided

- Recovery Care Coordinator
- Transition Support
- Contact Center Support
- Family Support
- Clinical Care Advocate

Acceptance Criteria

Primary

- MEDEVAC from a combat zone
- Very seriously injured (VSI)/seriously injured (SI) all receive a recovery care coordinator (RCC)

Secondary

• Diagnosed Serious Mental Illness

Complex medical conditions

- Serious/life threatening situation (e.g., stage three/four cancer)
- Multiple non-serious/life-threatening conditions (specialized care)
- Several simultaneous conditions which require active treatment

Non-complex orthopedic/medical conditions that, by prognosis, are expected to return to full duty but require prolonged rehabilitation

Considerations for acceptance disapproval

- Adequate access to care
- Lacks medical complexity
- Incomplete medical picture
- Marine is in Physical Evaluation Board phase

Area of Responsibility WWBn-W area of operations are from west of the Mississippi River and through INDOPACOM.

Referrals Process

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- PCR triggers WWBn-W response
- 96 hours to initiate support assessment for the wounded, ill, or injured Marine

Referral Package

- Less than two weeks for determination
- Less than four weeks to arrive at WWBn-W

Complete the WWR Referral Package for unit command endorsement

Step 2 – Medical information

Complete the Medical Questionnaire and the Authorization for Disclosure of Medical and Dental Information (DDF2870)

Step 3 – Submission

Submit, via encrypted email, your completed package to Wounded Warrior Battalion-West (WWBNW_REFERRALS@USMC.MIL)

Step 4 – Appeal (If applicable)
