The priesthood is a calling to serve God's people in a religious community or a diocese. A priest carries on Christ's ministry in the world through His Church by leading the people in prayer and administering the sacraments.

The blessing of living a single life is another path to fulfilling one's calling. Here, God is allowing individuals to dedicate their time to serve Him base on their unique lifestyle.

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# GREETINGS

My dear Parishioners,

Peace and Easter blessings be upon you.

During the Easter season, we reflect on the sacrament of baptism, where we are given a fresh identity as children of God and a calling to lead a life influenced by our connection with the Lord.

Our shared vocation as baptized Christians is to a life of holiness, striving to be like Our Lord Jesus Christ.

How we live out our baptismal call is unique to each person. Pope Francis eagerly reminds us that no single mission is the same: we each have our own part to play in building the Kingdom of God.

The word 'vocation' appropriately applies to marriage, priesthood, consecrated life, and some forms of single life because each of these represents a wholehearted commitment that we make in response to an invitation from the Lord.

The Fourth Sunday of Easter better known as Vocations Sunday or Good Shepherd Sunday, is marked as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The focus of this day is to fulfil Jesus' instruction to "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:38).

The Church, while valuing all vocations, emphasizes the importance of vocations to ordained ministries (priesthood), diverse forms of consecrated life (including male and female religious life, societies of apostolic life, consecrated virginity, and secular institutes), and missionary work.

Today, we need to earnestly pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, religious life, apostolic societies or secular institutes.

In recent years, there has been a significant decline in the number of individuals pursuing vocations in priesthood and religious life. This trend is expected to worsen in upcoming years, leading to a drastic shortage of priests. The aging clergy are not being replaced, resulting in excessive workloads, isolation and burnout in our existing priests.

This trend carries strong implications to the church's future and should not be taken lightly for its consequences are grave!

Without priests, essential aspects of our faith life such as the Eucharist, sacramental absolution and spiritual guidance for many believers, be it young or old in seeking Christ's presence will be affected.

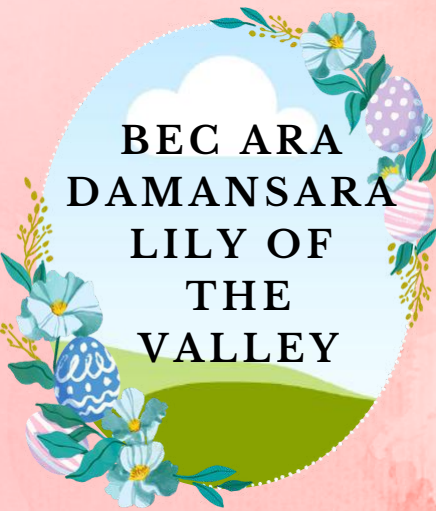
#### **6 ways we can support our priests ....**

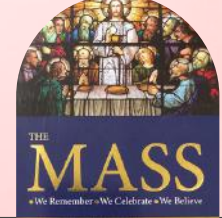

# TALK: THE MASS EXPLAINED



Held on 2nd Mar 2024 at the SIC rooftop, this session is the first of its kind to be conducted by our very own priest, Fr Lawrence Ng, CDD, with an impressive 200 attendees.

Fr Lawrence's talk was in reference to the book published by the late Fr Ignatius Huan (1941-2018) entitled **"The Mass: We Remember, We Celebrate, We Believe"**



In the 2.5 hours, Fr Lawrence did an amazing job in touching on some basics of The Mass.

This included the four main pillars of the Mass, the liturgical cycle, parts of the Mass, gestures and postures during Mass and the different colours of the vestments & what it symbolises.

Many expressed satisfaction with the session and were keen on having follow-up sessions.

# PASCHAL TRIDUUM

'Triduum' is a Latin term (meaning three days) used by the Catholic Church to denote the three days from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. It is a moveable observance recalling the Passion, Crucifixion, Death, Burial, and Resurrection of Jesus.

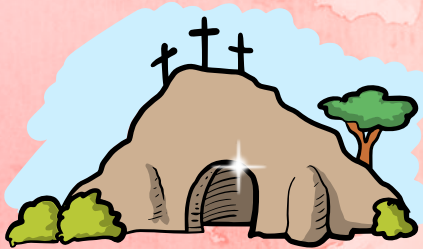

# EASTER - A 50 DAY CELEBRATION

## UNDERSTANDING THE SEASON OF EASTER

**What Is the Octave of Easter?**

The period from Easter Sunday through Divine Mercy Sunday is an especially joyful time. These eight days known as the Octave of Easter, reminds us that the mystery of the resurrection of Christ is at the heart of our entire Christian life!



**How Many Days Does the Easter Season Last?**

Because Easter is the most important feast in the Christian calendar, even more important than Christmas, the Easter season continues on for 50 days, through the Ascension of Our Lord to Pentecost Sunday, seven full weeks after Easter Sunday!

## FAMILY ACTIVITIES TO CELEBRATE THE EASTER SEASON

Each week just pick a few ideas

1. Use a special candle at family meals to recall the light of Christ.
2. Every day, read together from the Easter story: Matthew 28; Mark 16; Luke 24; John 20-21.
3. Plan fun family activities—one for every week of Easter.
6. Add an “alleluia” song—or three alleluias—to your grace before meals.
7. Talk about baptism. Tell stories of family members’ baptisms.
8. Just before his ascension, Jesus blessed the disciples. Pray Numbers 6:24-26 together as a way of communicating his blessing to one another.
9. Learn a prayer to the Holy Spirit to use in your family prayer time.
10. Recite the Divine Mercy Chaplet or the Rosary.

# SR ANGELINE POH'S VOCATION TESTIMONY

Hello, I am Sr Angeline Poh, FMM (Franciscan Missionaries of Mary). My perpetual vows were made at St Ignatius Church on 17 September 2017, after which I relocated to a different community in PJ and then to another mission in Kota Bharu. Recently, I returned to PJ and to SIC.

My birth took place in Kota Bharu, Kelantan, where the FMM sisters were the sole religious congregation. The FMM charism involves being present where Christ is less known, hence the FMM sisters' establishment in the East Coast of Kelantan, Terengganu, and Pahang upon their arrival in Malaysia. Understanding the meaning of charism made me realize that God had chosen FMM for me, my family, my birthplace, and all the experiences of growing up in Kelantan.

Around the age of 9, I fervently prayed the rosary, nurturing a hope that Mother Mary might appear to me as she did to the children at Fatima if I prayed wholeheartedly.

I would request my dad to take me to church before music or school exams to pray at the grotto. Staring deep into Mother Mary's eyes at the grotto was essential, as if grace would elude me otherwise!

During my teenage years, I would seek the church keys from the FMM sisters and quietly sit in the dimly lit church, just being with the Lord. It wasn't my actions or thoughts about God that led to my religious vocation, but in retrospect, I believe God instilled in me the desire to draw close to Him. Although the idea of becoming a religious nun crossed my mind at 9, I had completely forgotten about it until I joined the FMM.

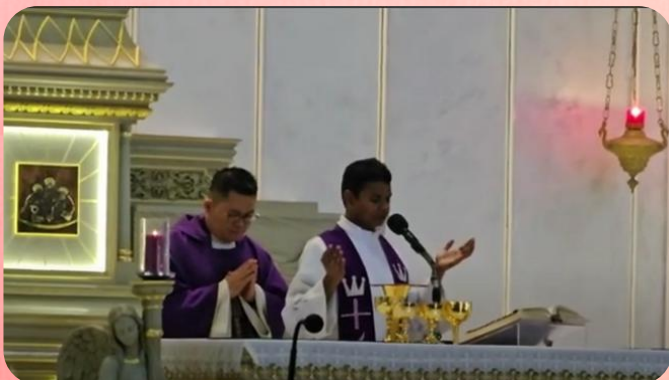
I arrived in Kuala Lumpur on February 22, 2024 and spent three memorable weeks at St Ignatius Church.

# FINDING MY WAY IN GOD'S VINEYARD

4th Year Theology, St Peter's College, Kuching

I had a simple philosophy towards life, formed over the years as I grew into adulthood. Learn to enjoy life, and as you journey through it, meditate on and understand it. Most importantly find GOD in it. I'd like to offer you a glimpse into my personal journey, where I've had to reflect on life events, contemplate them, and recognize the guidance of God directing me on the path I should take.



Monsignor Anthony Thomas was the priest at my First Holy Communion on 21/11/1999. He was someone who could not be easily influenced and humility was his greatest asset. His immutable belief in our Lord Jesus was what questioned and challenged my conviction of my faith life as a Catholic.



Following in the footsteps of my two older brothers, I joined the Altar Servers in the Chapel of Our Lady of Good Health, Kampung Pandan. Serving at Holy Mass and watching the celebrant going through all the prayers and rites left an impact on me. My dad sensing my desire for the priesthood, enrolled me in Sekolah Menengah Stella Maris.

In 2008, Father Christopher Wilvaraj Soosaipillai, who was my Parish Priest and the Vocation Director of the Archdiocese exposed me to various discernment camps that helped open my mind to the various vocations in life - marriage, single blessed, and Holy Orders.

# FINDING MY WAY IN GOD'S VINEYARD

As I moved on, I started to question myself on the very reason for our existence here on earth. In my search, I found some great answers that eventually fine-tuned my life to seek for a greater understanding of GOD and His plans through Jesus Christ.

I remember one incident during the vocation stay-in at Good Shepherd Church in early 2016. We were to spend time in front of the Blessed Sacrament in the newly renovated chapel. The chapel was beautiful with fine graphic architecture.

I knelt for the half-hour and could not pray because tears were just flowing from my eyes non-stop. I tried to control it, but I failed. Eventually, I ended up not praying; but filled with a feeling of joy, thankfulness and peace.

From this came another affirmation of my longing for a life with GOD, and walking in the footsteps of His Son Jesus through a life of service to His people, the Church.

This incident greatly inspired me to join the priesthood, to carry out His mission in the way of the early apostles and disciples.

What lies ahead of my journey? I am open to whatever God has planned for me.

I draw strength and hope from what is etched in my mind forever, the words of Saint Pope John Paul II - "Be Not Afraid." (Matt 14:27)

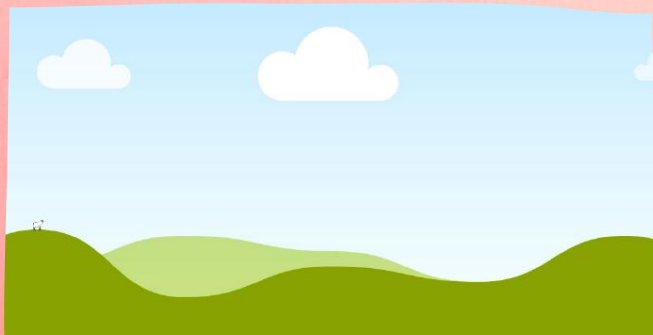
# BEC HOME MASS & MOTHER MARY'S VISITATION
