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

THE SUN FISH



Sunfish develop their bullet-like shape because the back fin which they are born with simply never grows. Instead, it folds into itself as the enormous creature matures, creating a rounded rudder called a clavus. Mola being the scientific name are found in temperate and tropical oceans around the world. They are frequently seen basking in the sun near the surface and are often mistaken for sharks when their huge dorsal fins emerge above the water.



Mola fish are the largest bony fish, with some growing up to 4m tall and 3m wide, weighing almost 2.5 tons. When at a height of roughly 1.7m their skins thickness can be 15cm in width already. Ocean sunfish can get heavily infested with skin parasites, leading them to attract small fish or birds to feed on them. They may even leap up to 3m above the water and splash down to rid themselves of the parasites. They spend most of their time at depths between 300m and all the way down to 1000m but will often come up to the surface for basking.

MOVEMENT & THREATS TO SURVIVAL

They move awkwardly in the water, wriggling their massive anal and dorsal fins and using their clavus for steering. Though they will also consume little fish, massive amounts of zooplankton, and algae, jellyfish are their preferred meal. Although they are not harmful to humans, they frequently approach divers out of curiosity. Its population is thought to be in a vulnerable state and has a decreasing population trend. Sunfish are often entangled in drift gill nets and may choke on marine debris, such as plastic bags, which mimic the appearance of jellyfish.

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN OPEN, SEMI-CLOSE AND CLOSED CIRCUIT







OPEN CIRCUIT REGULATOR

When a diver inhales, they breathe from a compressed gas a cylinder. This is known as a demand system. When a diver exhales, the breath vents into the water and bubbles to the surface i.e. exhaled air is released directly into the water. It means that the path of air from the cylinder terminates when it is exhaled into the water.

SEMI-CLOSED CIRCUIT

The diver inhales, from a bag or counter-lung, and the exhaled breath cycles through a system that removes waste carbon dioxide and returns it to the counter-lung. It replaces consumed oxygen by employing a slow steady flow of oxygen into the counter-lung resulting in a slow, small stream of bubbles.

CLOSED-CIRCUIT

The inhaled breath comes from a bag/counter-lung, and when exhaled, is then cycled through a system that removes waste carbon dioxide and replaces the consumed oxygen, then returned to the bag. There are no bubbles.

AIR ENDURANCE

The steps needed to calculate your air consumption before and during a dive

For any dive, it is vital that a pre-dive plan is drawn up. It is paramount that you plan your dive in detail and brief the dive with your fellow divers before hand. This includes taking into account your air consumption before and after a dive, we can use the SAC rate to calculate our overall air endurance for a dive.

HOW DO I CALCULATE SAC RATES:

Firstly, there are some things one must take into consideration.

- cylinder size
- start air pressure
- end air pressure
- average depth
- dive duration

For reference

- a dive to 27 meters
- for a duration of 42 minutes
- on a 15 litre cylinder
- with a start pressure of 212 bar
- and an end pressure of 53 bar
- and an average depth of 21.56 meters

To calculate an SAC rate:

- Start by subtracting your start and end pressure.
- In this case, it would be 212-53, which gives us 159.
- Multiply this answer with the size of the cylinder, 159x15 which equals 2385.
- Next, divide this by the dive duration. 2385 divided by 42 equates to 56,79 litres per minute under water.
- Lastly, taking into consideration the absolute pressure, which in this case would be 3,7
- Finally, divide your air consumption underwater with your atmosphere pressure, 56.79 divided by 3.7 equals 15.34 litres per minute.
- Therefore, your SAC rate would be 15.34 litres of air consumed per minute.

OUR AIR ENDURENCE:

To calculate our air endurance we use the formula: air endurance = total air-reserve air

SAC x absolute pressure




Ears in Diving

OUTER EAR

The outer ear is the part that sticks out your head and catches all the sound, it is connected to the ear canal which travels to the eardrum.

 When we dive or swim, the ear canal is filled up with water which causes no damage if the ear drum is healthy and there are no holes or tears in it, therefore no water will flow into the middle ear.



MIDDLE EAR

The middle ear contains the eardrum which vibrates when sound waves come into contact with which then goes to the inner ear which allows us to hear.


- The middle ear is connected to the back of the throat by the Eustachian tube. When we pinch our noses and blow, it forces air from the lungs up the Eustachian tube which then balances the pressure in the ear.
- When descending If you do not equalize your middle ear and too much pressure build up, you can suffer a middle-ear barotrauma (MEBT). This occurs when the pressure difference causes the eardrum to bulge inward, leading to pain, fluid buildup, and potentially a ruptured eardrum.
- Symptoms of MEBT include ear pain, muffled hearing, dizziness, and in severe cases, bleeding
- The best way to prevent this is to simply equalize early and often and not only when you feel pain.

INNER EAR

The inner ear contains a lot smaller and more delicate parts than the rest of the ear, its what allows us to hear and and equalize as the Eustachian tube is part of it.

- When blowing (equalizing) against a blocked nose, it raises your internal fluid pressure, including the fluid pressure in your inner ear, which may rupture your "round windows." So don't blow too hard, and don't maintain pressure for more than five seconds.
- If you do not equalize on descent, the pressure on the eardrum will transfer through the middle ear ossicles to the oval window resulting in the round window to bulge outwards. If there is excessive pressure either the oval or round window may tear and inner ear fluid will leak into the middle ear.
- This may result in symptoms like hearing loss, off balance, vertigo and tinnitus.

MASK Water in mask



Some of the causes for a leaking mask include a torn skirt, improper fit, leaky purge valve, hoods, and hair under the skirt.

SOLUTION

Visual inspection, check the straps for cracks, ripped skirt, and other anomalies. inhaling to test before dive.

SNORKEL Unable to clear



CAUSE Some causes may include a leaky self drain, or it is incorrectly placed on head or in mouth

SOLUTION

be sure to do a pre dive check before and after entering the water to make sure it is indeed functioning.

FINS Cramp



CAUSE We've all experienced cramps, but do we know the cause of said cramp? Some causes include fins that are to large or stiff, foot pocket to small, and strap or bootie too tight.

SOLUTION

Check fins for fit, comfort, and adjust prior to dive.

REGULATOR Free flow



CAUSE A common problem among divers, some causes may be due to poor maintenance, a dented cover, foreign mater in regulator, and freezing.

SOLUTION

proper routine maintenance is key, as well as servicing and using anti-freeze provisions. What also helps is keeping the second stage inside clear.

BCD Overly Buoyant



CAUSE Its common for new divers to become overly buoyant, some of the causes for this include having air in the suit, or being underweighted. However, it mainly just comes down to practice and skill.

SOLUTION

Check if you are properly weighted as well as know and maintain your gear. Test before dive.

WET SUIT Breathing difficulty



There is a simple cause for having difficulty breathing when wearing a wet suit, it may be too tight.

SOLUTION

Much like the cause, the solution is also simple, check for a suit that properly fits you when buying a wet suit.
