

THREE POWERFUL HERBS FROM 'YARD

CERASEE

Cerasee, a wild variety of Momordica charantia is traditionally prepared as a tea for the treatment of diabetes mellitus in the West Indies and Central America. Today Cerasee tea is available in tea bags.

LEAF OF LIFE

Also known as the miracle leaf, life plant, Goethe plant, the Mexican love plant and as its scientific name Bryophyllum pinnatum, the leaf of life is a popular house plant that has been linked to numerous health benefits.

The plant is native to Madagascar but is grown in most tropical areas including Jamaica where it is widely used as a herbal remedy to treat respiratory conditions such as asthma, colds, coughs, shortness of breath and bronchitis. It is usually consumed as tea, blended in juices or eaten raw.



Lemon Grass/ Fever Grass

In food and beverages, lemongrass is used as a flavoring. For example, lemongrass leaves are commonly used as "lemon" flavoring in herbal teas. Lemongrass might help prevent the growth of some bacteria and yeast. Lemongrass also contains substances that are thought to relieve pain and swelling, reduce fever, improve levels of sugar and cholesterol in the blood, stimulate the uterus and menstrual flow, and have antioxidant properties.

NATURAL LEMON

You Will Need:

Natural Face Mask

The juice from half a lemon 2. I tablespoon raw honey 3. Towel

Mix the lemon juice with the honey until you get a smooth mixture.

Wash your face with a mild cleanser and pat it dry. Apply this mixture onto your face. Make sure to avoid the fragile skin around your eyes.

Leave the mixture on for about 20 minutes.

Wash it off with warm water, followed by cool water.

Pat your face dry with a towel

REMEDIES



Honey Lemon Tea

INGREDIENTS

2 lemons (thoroughly cleaned)2 piece fresh ginger (about the size of your pointer and middle finger)

Raw honey 12 oz mason jar

INSTRUCTIONS

• Slice lemons and ginger. Place the lemon and ginger slices in the mason jar, alternating layers of each.

- Slowly, pour honey over the lemon and ginger. Allow the honey to sink down and around the lemon and ginger slices.
- Fill jar to the top with honey and seal tightly.
- Store in the refrigerator.
 Over time, the mixture will start to turn into a loose jelly.

When you are in need of some soothing tea, scoop 2-3 tablespoon into a mug full of hot water—be sure to scoop whole pieces of ginger and lemon. Allow to steep for 3-4 minutes and sip away

- 1. Mix whiskey, water, & lemon juice
- 2. Microwave 1 minute (until hot)


Winston George Armstrong
