MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD CHAIR AND CEO

While we end another incredibly difficult year, we move forward with the knowledge that despite the challenges we have faced, there is much to celebrate. Community disability service providers have shown strength, resilience, and commitment to ensuring individuals with disabilities have been supported throughout the pandemic. And we are grateful for your continued trust in us to support you in these exceptional times.

Your trust is especially noteworthy as we mark ACDS 50th anniversary this year. At this milestone, we reflect on our organization's strengths: a trusted, credible, and influential member association with over 145 members. The strong foundations built over the past 50 years allow us to provide the impactful programs and services we offer today, and our members are an essential part of this foundation.

In 2021-22, we supported our members with the ongoing challenges related to the pandemic by: producing clear and consistent communications and resources; advocating on critical issues, such as vaccine eligibility and funding; conducting research to inform our work; and establishing key partnerships and opportunities for collaboration through the Service Provider Partnership Committee with Community and Social Services as well as with other Ministries, such as Health. Some successful outcomes of these efforts included: extension of the CWB to all disability workers; adjustments to public health orders reflecting the needs of PDD homes; and the funding of Project Blueprint CDS, towards the development of a comprehensive strategy to address chronic workforce issues.

In addition to our COVID-related work, we continued to enhance and successfully deliver core programs and services. In September, we introduced new CET Standards. The new Standards were well received by the organizations that piloted them. We also coordinated quality virtual accreditation surveys, while resuming in-person surveys. As well, in response to demand, we expanded our training and development offerings, and leveraged partnerships to introduce new courses.

As we look ahead to the next year, we will build on our momentum on some key issues, such as the rising costs in the sector. Our advocacy on this front gained significant traction following our release of The Perfect Storm report. We also look forward to creating a robust, sector-led strategy for a skilled and sustainable workforce through Project Blueprint CDS. Finally, we are excited to host our first conference since 2019: Recharge: Let's Come Together at the ACDS Conference, will bring disability sector workers from all levels together again to re-ignite our passion for this work and inspire us to new heights.

We strive to be proactive and strategically driven in all our work. This year, the Board of Directors developed our strategic priorities and actions for 2022-2025. We look forward to engaging with our members as we progress on this ambitious vision for ACDS.

Reflecting on the past year, we have never been more cognizant of the critical role our members play in the success of ACDS through the investment of time, energy, and insight. Whether that is sharing your experiences, participating on committees and initiatives, or serving on our Board of Directors, we thank you for your continued commitment to our organization's success as we work collectively to strengthen the CDS sector.

From the receipt of government funding for policy advocacy in 1982, to being a trusted partner for developing evidence-based policy solutions today


ADVOCATED AND INFLUENCED CHANGE

RAISED PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS THROUGH ACCREDITATION

2021-22 Highlights

Introduced the 2021 edition of the Creating Excellence Together (CET) Standards

- The 2021 Standards reflect what we heard and what we learned through the most comprehensive review process undertaken since CET's inception in 1999
- The new Standards have been very well received by the organizations that piloted them

Coordinated a record-number of surveys and improved the survey process

- Successfully coordinated 80 accreditation surveys and resumed some in-person surveys
- · Introduced new digital survey tools to support the survey process

The 2021 CET Standards:

- Are more relevant to participating service providers and the individuals they serve
- Involve a more streamlined process for participating service providers pursuing accreditation
- Will have impact. The new standards will ultimately ensure quality services for individuals with developmental disabilities


