Speaking of the Golf Shop, we are excited to have less delivery issues this season with our golf shop vendors and products. We have a well stocked Golf Shop featuring industry leading brands. Our goal is always to offer you exciting golf and lifestyle options.

Some of our current featured brands include G4, Draw & Fade, Travis Mathew, IBKUL, and Stitch along with the traditionally solid name brands of Peter Millar and Foot-Joy. Please stop in to allow the staff to help you with your golf and lifestyle purchases.

Now that you have been out playing, it is a good time to review your equipment. My staff and I do equipment review and custom club fitting. This is an easy process that takes as little as 30 minutes or as much as a couple of hours to review the entire bag. Custom fit clubs make such a huge difference with your performance and enjoyment of the game. Please call or email the Golf Shop to schedule a consultation or fitting at golfshop@sycamorehillsgolfclub.com or 260.625.4397.

As we head into the warm summer months, the course and practice facilities see a significant increase in usage. Each member can do their part to help with course care, traffic wear and turf recovery. For example, cart traffic is controlled by following the golf car rule of the day including our blue & white post system used when golf cars are allowed to cross at 90*. With divot repair, please always replace the divot as the first option. If the divot is not retrievable, please fill the divot with the sand provided on the golf car. When filling the divot with sand, please smooth and level the sand filled divot. Fixing a ball mark you make along with any additional marks always is a good practice when playing and helps limit green scarring. Lastly, please be careful on the practice range to either leave spacing between divots or take divots in a straight line. This straight line method will heal much quicker than removing a square patch from the practice tee. Growing up, I was always advised to leave the golf course in at least as good of condition as it was found. If we follow the guidelines mentioned, we are well on our way to continued experience of impeccable course conditions.

FROM THE GROUNDS SUPERINTENDENT

TWO NEW RESIDENTS MOVE TO SYCAMORE HILLS

Last fall and early this spring, our Team noticed that every once in a while, they would see a Bald Eagle flying around the course. It got to the point where we would see them most mornings out fishing in our large irrigation pond on #12. On multiple occasions, I have witnessed one diving down from the sky, talons out, snatching up a fish from the pond. During our standard course spring cleanup, one of our crew radioed in and told me I needed to get down to the main drive to the Clubhouse asap. To our amazement, we realized we had a pair of Bald Eagles nesting in a pine tree along the creek across from the south-end bridge to the practice facilities. This ended up being a test nest, the nest they chose as their permanent home is on the back nine of our course.

With more activity at the Club due to the winter weather breaking and our crew starting their spring cleanup, I contacted the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to see if they had any advice about Bald Eagles. Our main concern was scaring them away from their new nest as business started to ramp up at the Club. DNR was very helpful as they got me in contact with the United States Fish and Wildlife Services (FWS). Being a Federally protected bird, the FWS has jurisdiction over Bald Eagles, and they couldn't be more excited that I called.

FWS gave us various reasons why we ended up with an adult pair of Bald Eagles. They explained that the cold winter froze over most Indiana bodies of water this winter. Apparently, the ice was very thick this winter, and it was some of the best ice fishing we have had in Indiana for some time. This drove the Eagles to water that wasn't frozen or were the first bodies of water to thaw from the cold winter temperatures. The Aboite River was one of the first to unthaw, so they picked a location near the river to build a nest.

They also explained that with the high winds we experienced this winter, many of the Eagles' habitats had blown over, and many nests were destroyed, causing the Bald Eagles to look for new areas to call home. These Eagles most likely came from the Salamonie Reservoir, according to the FWS.

A Sycamore Hills site visit was planned by FWS. Their goal was to identify the Bald Eagles by the following scenarios...

The first scenario is that the Eagles nested at Sycamore are young Eagles that have branched out to start their habitat. Many do not know this, but a Bald Eagle will return yearly to its nest to lay eggs. An American Bald Eagle can live up to 20 years. If the pair lays eggs this year, we should see them back yearly.

The second scenario is that these are older Eagles that, likely, their nest blew over this winter and are looking for a new home. The Eagles' age will depend on how long they are around. Bald Eagles acquire their pure white head and tail at the age of 5 1/2 years. Due to both our Bald Eagles having acquired their signature white head and tail, most likely, scenario 2 was how they ended up here on property.

FWS also impressed upon us how important it is to treat these birds with respect due to their federally protected status. They said the Eagles are there to look at and experience without interaction. Even their feathers are federally protected. The official from FWS told me stories about people finding or taking Eagle feathers, giving them to say, a grandchild, who takes them into a show and tell at school. Word eventually spreads around, and someone inevitably reports it, then FWS has to get involved, which they said is never fun for either side.

I know some of you must be thinking—how did the storm affect our pair of Bald Eagles? We are still figuring out the answer to that question. They knew the right tree to pick because it survived the storm. However, most of the trees around their tree ended up coming down, so they aren't as hidden as when first building their nest. We will see if they return to this nest, build another nest on the property, or move off the property altogether.

We hope this Bald Eagle pair calls Sycamore Hills home for many years.

Here are some Facts about Bald Eagles:

- Eagles can detect prey 2 miles away
- They are not bald
- Male Bald EAgles are smaller than females
- Eagles lay between 1-3 eggs
- Eagles mate for life
- Eagles learn to fly at three months of age
- Bald Eagles are at the top of the food chain
- Eagles eat mainly fish, rabbits, and yes squirrels!

I will keep you updated on any developments and information I receive on our pair of Eagles at the Club.
