Kahnawà:ke Tourism is proud to launch Ionkhinèn:rine' ("They/She leads them"), a brand-new Youth Cultural Leadership Program designed to inspire and empower youth ages 12-17 through immersive experiences rooted in the Kanien'kehá:ka culture and heritage of Kahnawà:ke.

This exciting initiative offers participants a unique opportunity to grow as leaders while deepening their connection to Tsi Niionkwarihó:ten (our ways). Through storytelling, guided tours, artisan workshops, and hands-on community engagement, youth will build essential leadership and life skills in a supportive, culturally enriching environment.

"We want to instill pride, responsibility, and cultural understanding in our youth, while helping them become confident ambassadors of who we are as Kanien'kehá:ka," says Olivia Wakenhnhiióhstha Rice, Program Facilitator.

Olympic Lab Event: SHARING CULTURE AND SPIRIT WITH TEAM CANADA

On May 27th, Kahnawà:ke Tourism staff were honored to participate in the Olympic Team Canada Lab Event held at the Airport Marriott Hotel. The event brought together athletes and coaches preparing for the 2026 Winter Olympics in Italy, and we were very proud to represent Kahnawà:ke and share our culture with the delegation.

The day began with the opening address and land acknowledgement, delivered by Ratitsenhaí:ens Stephen McComber, who offered the Ohén:ton Karihwatéhkwen (The Words Before All Else). His words highlighted the sacred relationships between our people, the land, and one another setting a meaningful tone for the day.

Following the opening, Kimberly Kaniehténhawe Cross introduced our talented performers. Atsenhakèn:iate Lazare led four songs, accompanied by vib dancers: Nashytn Mayo, Kwena Boivin, Kaiè:wate Jacobs, Watetsensheriióstha Thompson, Shatekaièn:ton Diabo and Isabella Cross.

Their performance brought energy and emotion to the space, beautifully connecting our culture

with the Olympic spirit. The athletes responded with heartfelt appreciation, and it was a moment of true cultural exchange.

In the afternoon, Dwayne Stacey, Danny Stacey, Tyler Gilbert, and Kimberly hosted a wampum bracelet and belt-making workshop, where each participant crafted a personal replica wampum bracelet. They also contributed a strand of beads to a Friendship Wampum Belt, which was presented as a gift to the Team Canada Olympic Committee - a symbol of respect, connection, and shared journeys.

"It's meaningful and appreciated when organizations like the Olympic Committee take real steps to include Onkwehón:we voices in their spaces. It helps educate, build awareness, and foster meaningful relationships across Turtle Island and beyond."


