What We Do

Auxiliary Services is a self-supported unit within the Division of Student Affairs. We provide best-in-class services for students and the campus in the areas of housing, dining, retail, event management, and card services.



What Our Work Means to the Campus

As a support unit, we provide the campus with a myriad

of services that help the campus and community achieve their mission and goals. We support the campus' enrollment goals by supporting admissions' yield activities with housing guarantees and student services that attract students to UCI. We provide state of the art meeting facilities, high quality dining and retail experience for students, campus partners, and community to gather, connect, and thrive.

Major Accomplishments

Student Housing

- Completed a 1,054 bed graduate student housing project. Verano Place 8 is anticipated to receive LEED Platinum status.
- Received regental approval Mesa Court Phase 7, slated to open in Fall of 2025. The project, totaling \$92.7 million, received \$65 million in grant funding from the state and UCOP.
- Opened a dog park for the Graduate and Family Housing Communities to further support residents with support animals. This is the first of its kind dog park for student residential communities in the UC system.
- ▶ In collaboration with ACC, provided housing for 16,389 UCI students.

- Facilitated short-term basic needs housing for 34 students facing homelessness.
- In collaboration with CARE, provided emergency housing for 21 students.

Student Center & Event Services

- Started major restroom renovations in the Student Center and Cross-Cultural Center
- Replaced the roof on the Student Center

Student Housing Expansions ≻

In August 2022, Student Housing unveiled 1,055 new grad student beds in LEED and FITWELL-certified Verano Place Towers. The department also awarded the construction contract to build 400 new undergrad beds in Mesa Court (opening Sep 2025). And in anticipation of increased demand for Fall 2023, Housing converted 50 Las Lomas West apartments or 186 beds to student use.

We've had to adjust and change course at a moment's notice, create new approaches to our regular duties and activities, and discover new ways of connecting with one another. We continue to face these challenges head-on with commitment and resilience, achieving unexpected and even extraordinary things with the resources at hand.



What Our Work Means to the Campus

The Office of the Vice Chancellor, Student Affairs supports the division's goals and objectives through events and activities that promote student engagement. Our work is vital to the student experience ensuring that students have access to the full range of services offered by the division. Our work complements our students' academic experience by providing meaningful activities that meet students' interests while fostering their personal growth and development. In short, we strive to develop the whole student in preparation for life after UCI.

Major Accomplishments

In addition to providing leadership and support to programs and units in Student Affairs, notable efforts for the year included:

Commencement Ceremonies – For the second year in a row, we managed December Commencement in addition to our 10 June ceremonies.

Strategic Plan - Last year, we embarked on a strategic planning process in order

for the division to plot the course for our work for the next 3 years. For this project, we acquired the services of NASPA Advisory Services and assembled a Strategic Plan Advisory Board. Additionally, we were intentional about getting feedback across our division through surveys and focus groups. We deliberately reached out to our spanish speaking staff as well. This fall, we plan to debut our Strategic Plan at our Student Affairs update.

Orange County Veterans and Military Families Collaborative - The Orange County Veterans and Military Families Collaborative is in its 5th year of convening and coordinating over 100 non-profit agencies in Orange County that serve veterans and their families.

Campus Efforts on Asymptomatic Testing & Compliance – Communication and coordination of campuswide COVID-19 related messaging directed to students along with their parents and families with an additional focus on the cohort who continued to reside on campus in student housing.

Creative & Marketing Communications – Realigned priorities to serve all units within the division and expanded to add two full-time designers and three student positions on the team.

CampusGroups – Student Affairs implemented the CampusGroups platform to leverage UCI's vibrant campus life into the digital realm. This campuswide engagement system promotes connection, collaboration and success by providing departments, units and campus organizations with feature-rich tools for organizational management, workflows, event promotion and management, scheduling, data gathering and more.

Esports – The online environment is familiar to esports players and gamers. UCI Esports transitioned easily by partnering with Campus Recreation's intramural sports program offering a wider selection of games and supporting more tournaments.

The View Ahead

Our priorities will continue to focus on student development and well-being, and supporting staff in the post-COVID work environment. Our new mixed-mode work environment allows us to embrace new approaches to providing meaningful and innovative avenues for student success.

The UCI Commencement Application

The UCI Commencement Application is used for graduate registration, faculty hooder registration, graduate check-in, volunteer registration and management, managing ticket counts and accommodation requests, volunteer check-in, and various additional admin tools. The application was integrated with the campus OneCard initiative to provide a seamless experience for graduates. The goal is to expand upon the integration this year with earlier communication and support from the Campus Card Office.





Regalia Loan Program

The Commencement Office worked with Basic Needs Center to create a Regalia Loan Program for those in need. The Center works with Campus Social Workers for referrals. The program currently had 10 sets of regalia in various degrees and sizes being used for the initial program. In addition, the Center will accept gently used regalia donations from graduates to add into the program.

Recognized Staff Groups A

Staff groups that work in support of student-facing Student Affairs teams were recognized for their consistent support and vital roles.



WSCUC accreditation >

Assessment, Research, and Evaluation prepared the division to contribute to the WSCUC accreditation visit. Reaccreditation was successful! The accreditation team wrote about the promise of our assessment infrastructure in their report and encouraged us to continue pursuing the institutionalization of assessment efforts in order to ensure and demonstrate the division's contributions to student learning and success at UCI.

New Workforce Relations Specialist Role

What We Do

Student Life & Leadership offers education and skill development opportunities that enhance academic success and prepare students for their leadership roles in a diverse, dynamic, and global society.

What Our Work Means to the Campus

SLL plays an integral role in the holistic development of students. We complement academic learning by intentionally structuring programs and services to support students in their growth and identity. We are focused on the quality of the student experience and student well-being while promoting inclusive excellence in all settings.

SLL units prioritize cultivating campus partnerships in order to maximize our outreach to students in various settings.

Major Accomplishments

This past year, our units were able to successfully embrace a hybrid work model.

Office of Academic Integrity & Student Conduct went fully remote repurposing their physical space for our newly renamed Basic Needs Center.

The Basic Needs Center (BNC) held a grand re-opening which was covered by local media as being a leading BNC in the state.

RISE Suite went through a full-year cycle and continues to serve as a hub for a number of Resource Centers serving students.

Launched the **College Corps** program in cooperation with the State of California.

The View Ahead

In 2023-24, we will be celebrating our 40th Annual Randy Lewis All-University Leadership Conference. Our Center for Student Leadership prepares for a large incoming class of students that will be going through Orientation (firstyear/transfer/international students). Given the growth in our cluster, we are reorganizing our Business Services Office moving forward. We also look forward to leading efforts around understanding civil discourse and free speech on campus with students.

Black Graduation Celebration 2023 ≻

Over 600 people attended the Black Graduation Celebration to honor the accomplishments of Black graduates and to wish them well on their next journey in life!

Free Academic Support

Student Outreach and Retention (SOAR) served 3,256 unique students during 14,699 visits either through academic support, program events, space utilization (fridge/microwave) or peer consultations. As part of their free academic support services, SOAR printed 19,055 pages and distributed 2878 scantrons and 1197 green books to students.

Spanish Hour

Spanish Hour at the Latinx Resource Center started as a pilot program. The program was led by interns who designed thematic workshops in Spanish to help students learn or improve their Spanish-speaking skills in a casual setting.

What We Do

Our units assist students with a wide array of issues related to psychological counseling, disability-related services, assault and intimate partner violence support, recreational sports and fitness activities, a full range of health care services, and health/wellness education. We also support the early childhood education of the children in our community.



The mission of the Wellness, Health & Counseling

Services cluster is to support the campus' goal of being first in class by providing services that support students' physical and mental health and wellness to enhance their academic success.

What Our Work Means to the Campus

Our work allows students to get the support they need. Whether it is connecting students to basic needs such as food and housing resources, providing mental health services, providing assistive technology so students with disabilities have full access to their academic coursework, or educating the campus community about ways of preventing sexual violence, our staff is involved in all aspects of the student experience. Our work allows students to prioritize their mental and physical well-being so they can focus on their academics.

Major Accomplishments

Anteater Recreation Center – Returned to full operation with 23,500 students making over 781,000 visits.

Campus Assault Resources & Education (CARE) – Welcomed new CARE director Eli Pascal and assistant director Joan Rich. Established a campus-based sexual assault and domestic abuse forensic exam site for UCI affiliates.

Campus Social Work – New administrative support allowed for more time for direct services to students.

Center for Student Wellness & Health Promotion – Drew over 750 students to its flagship events, a first-ever Mental Health Fair and the first Zot Health Wellness Fair since returning from the pandemic.

Child Care's Early Childhood Education Center and Verano Preschool – Received their five-year NAEYC Accreditation.

Counseling Center – Increased staffing expanded the capacity to meet student needs. Integrated hybrid services for virtual and in-person options. Showcased "Community" themed student artwork at their Art of Healing Showcase.

Disability Services Center (DSC) – Welcomed new director Adam Kasarda DSC. Purchased new golf carts for Ring Road Rides.

Student Health Center – Passed its COLA/CLIA lab audits and OCDPH pharmacy audits. Hosted a record number of nurse clinics. Hit a record 22,000 patient visits in fall.

The View Ahead

During the 23-24 academic year, services will continue to mitigate some of the stress and loneliness that have emerged due to the pandemic. We will also continue to look for appropriate space to meet testing accommodation needs and also staff expansion needs. We look forward to re-examining our mission, vision, and values to be more in alignment with the division's new strategic plan.

Take Back the Night ≻

During Sexual Assault Awareness Month in April of 2023, Take Back the Night was attended by more than 350 students and featured more than 39 campus and community organizations at its resource fair. Students and campus partners participated in Denim Day, and nearly 1,000 students visited the Clothesline Project display.
