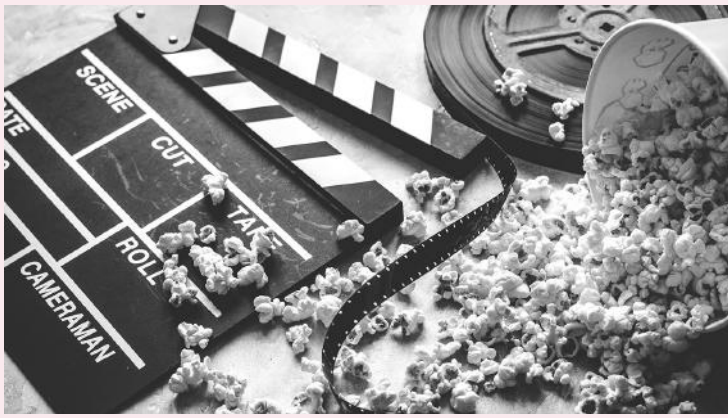

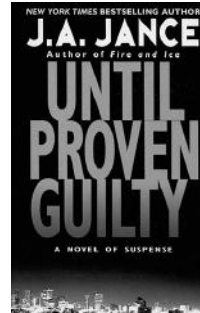

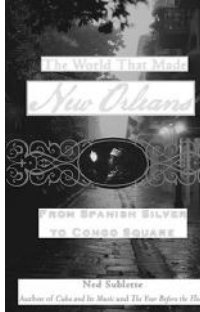

Sachem Public Library has seen an explosion in library usage over the past year and there are a few highlights we'd like to share. An astounding **72%** of our community members have a library card with more residents being registered each day. Patrons borrowed **647,478 physical and digital items** from our collection. Attendance at our programs increased by **15%** with a total of **245,196** attendees of all ages enjoying on and off-site programs. Library staff tackled **397,057 questions** from patrons last year, averaging over **1,000 questions daily**, a **15% increase** from the previous year! Our internet usage jumped another **34%** with a total of **294,478** public computer sessions.

Thanks to you, we were awarded Best Library on LI again for 2025! We appreciate your unwavering support. The staff members and trustees remain committed to offering our Sachem residents innovative programs and cutting-edge resources.
