Our most significant relationship is with God. God created us in His own image and likeness and made us the center of His marvelous creation because He wanted to enter into a covenant relationship with us. This covenant relationship is a family bond through which God would share His divine nature with us, as 2Peter 1: 4 tells us. Through Jesus, God gave us the privilege to share in His own divine life, so that we can now relate to Him as Our Father. We are God's sons and daughters. In our family bond with the Blessed Trinity, we will come to know and love God in Himself, and our true selves, the way God knows and loves us as His image and likeness. Only a sustained relationship with God will bring this about. This family bond is strengthened through consistent prayer and a daily commitment to the Person and teachings of Jesus.

In His life and teachings, Jesus made the claim that He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. He is the Savior of humankind because He is the Resurrection and the Life! Only through Jesus, the Son of God, will we enter eternal life. Through Jesus, we come to know and abide in the Father. The Father who abides in Jesus, then abides in us. In a sustained relationship with Jesus, therefore, we come to understand the purpose of our lives as God's image and likeness.

To facilitate this transformative rebirth in Jesus, Our Lord and Savior requested His Father to give us their Holy Spirit, the bond of love and union between them. The Holy Spirit scrutinizes the depths of God's Trinitarian life and reveals the divine life to us through the Person and teachings of Jesus (1Corinthians 2: 10-12). The Holy Spirit has been given to us in Baptism and Confirmation, and is our Advocate, the Keeper of our souls. The Holy Spirit re-creates us in the image and likeness of Jesus, through whom we come to know the Father.



PREPARING FOR THE JOURNEY

Some have an abiding trust in God's tender love for them and have developed an intimate and significant relationship with Jesus that has given them new perspective on life. They have established a covenant relationship with their Source and have an intense desire to be totally committed to God. God has truly become their Center, and they want to be at God's beck and call in all they do. Such persons know the rich benefits of being in a loving relationship with God. Because of sin, one of the sad facts of human life is our rejection or lukewarm acceptance of our Creator's vision and designs for us. Sadly, there are people for whom God is at best a distant and non-meaningful Presence. As we begin this journey, the guestion we are facing is about the place that God has in our lives: Has He become central and significant to you? If that is not yet the case, do you desire that God become central to your life? Do you have the same desire as the two disciples of John the Baptist, one of whom was Andrew, to find out more about Jesus: "Rabbi, where are you staying? He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day" (John 1: 38-39). In Revelation One, Week One: Laying the Foundation, you will explore, peacefully and seriously, this central question: Have you encountered Jesus as Savior and Lord of the World?

In creating us in His image and likeness, God established an unbreakable bond between Himself, the Original, and us, His image and likeness. We are the only earthly creatures who have been created in the divine likeness. God created us in the divine image so that He could share His own divine life with us through His Son, Jesus. If we choose to accept God's magnanimous invitation to participate in His enduring love for us through a covenant bond with Him, we will change profoundly. In prayer, we come face to face before our Creator and Lord, our Savior and Teacher. God looks upon us with special delight and tenderness because He recognizes Himself in us. God desires the best for us which is to be made perfect as He is perfect, merciful as He is merciful.

The only authentic way to be in God's Presence is to become transparent to God. Reverence, and speaking honestly from the heart is worthy of God, and of you, as God's image and likeness. So, when you pray, try to mean what you say, and say what you mean. Also, remember that you pray with your whole being, not just with the mind. Make sure you pay attention to your body, keeping it quiet and reverent. Your context for prayer is always a context of love: God loves you and desires intensely that you enter into a loving and generous relationship with Him. Triune God, I praise, adore, and thank you for your love and mercy!



Lead me into the Deep, Lord starts you out on an amazing journey with the Holy Trinity over twelve weeks. It chooses the option of offering spiritual formation by adopting the dynamics of a directed retreat. Spiritual Formation in a directed retreat dynamic is based on developing a consistent practice of daily prayer which would be a trusting face-to-face encounter with our Lord. Such daily prayer has immense benefits for the participants. It gives them ample opportunities for a first-hand experience of prayer. The participants become familiar with different methods of prayer. They learn how to apply the rules for the discernment of spirits, as they undergo the varying influences of good and evil in their prayer and daily circumstances of life. GEM's goal is that under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, they will learn to develop their own internal authority about their life of covenant union with God, of which they are having a first-hand experience in their prayer. In time, we hope that your relationship with God will permeate and influence every aspect of your earthly life.

The nightly review of the day is a significant practice in a disciple's formation. The context for our nightly review is our covenant relationship with God. Every single day, God is overwhelming us with grace upon grace, suffusing our lives with His tender mercies and unconditional love. Every single day of our lives, then, is an opportunity to praise, adore, and thank God for His indescribable goodness and loving kindness. We engage in praise and thanksgiving for the blessings and protection we received from God. So, with thanksgiving in your heart, you can go over your day, from morning to afternoon to evening, and see how God was Emmanuel, with you and in you. You can then do an examination of your conscience to see how you responded to God. Did you succumb to temptation and commit deliberate sin? As disciples, we owe it to our Savior and Lord to honestly acknowledge our sins. After you have examined your conscience and are ready to ask and receive forgiveness, you can recite the Act of Contrition. We encourage you to journal on the following questions: What is God saying to you? For what are you grateful? For what are you contrite? What spiritual discipline, including fasting, do you need to focus on tomorrow?


Jesus is proclaiming the good news that the long wait for sinful and lost humanity has ended. Satan's domination over human hearts is over. A bright light, the Light of the world, is shining in our darkness: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who lived in a land of gloom, a light has shone" (Isaiah 9: 1). That Light is Jesus! The kingdom of God or sharing intimately in the Blessed Trinity's eternal life is here, in and through Jesus who is our Way, Truth, and Life.

"Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." - Mark 1: 25-27

Working miracles and expelling demons were essential dimensions of Jesus' ministry. He came to end Satan's domination over human hearts. In today's event, Jesus heals and vanquishes the unclean spirit and brings healing and salvation to the man. Sickness and demonic possessions were attributed to sin. In overcoming the unclean spirit, and therefore sin, Jesus is proclaiming that He is God and is ushering in the kingdom of God. No wonder the crowd is amazed!



Through this and other miracles, Jesus' listeners are beginning to witness a sea change taking place in their relationship with God. Thus far, it was based on the interpretation of the Mosaic Covenant being offered to them by their scribes and rabbis. Instead of being uplifted and renewed, they felt burdened and without hope in their own interactions with the religious authorities, and from interactions that they witnessed between Jesus and their religious leaders. Clearly, Jesus is different. His teaching is superior to that of the scribes and rabbis that they have heard in their synagogues.

Jesus speaks with authority and is ushering in a new age. Jesus has come to fulfill the law and the prophets. This exorcism is clearly a visible sign that God's reign is being firmly established through Jesus. Only God has authority over unclean spirits. We have authority over them in the Name of Jesus! If the unclean spirits obey Jesus as he commands them, then Jesus must be divine! Jesus, I accept you as my Savior and Lord!

The nightly review of the day is very instrumental in developing a sanctified Unconscious. Painful memories that incite anger and resentment, generational sins that ensnare us, addictive behaviors that enslave us, they all reside in our Unconscious, and influence strongly our conscious thoughts, actions, and decisions. Our discipleship will be jeopardized if we are half-hearted about destroying the roots of sin in us. So, there is an urgent need to sanctify our Unconscious by creating as much space for Jesus as possible. One way of sanctifying our Unconscious is to make sure that we sleep with the Presence of God on our lips and in our hearts. When we sleep with grateful and forgiven hearts, our Unconscious will become God's abode. St. Ignatius of Loyola suggests that our last thoughts should linger on the Scripture passage we have selected for our Morning Prayer. With this important purpose in mind, and with a grateful heart, you can go over your day and see how Jesus worked miracles for you, bringing healing and salvation as He did to the Demoniac whom He healed. The reaction of the crowd was that Jesus taught with authority. Is that your reaction to Jesus and His teachings? You can then do an examination of conscience to see how you have been a disciple this day. After you have examined your conscience and are ready to ask forgiveness, you can pray the Act of Contrition. We encourage you to journal on the following questions: What is God saying to you? THE HEALING OF A PARALYTIC



Act of Faith

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PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

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"Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise, pick up your mat, and walk?' But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority to forgive sins on earth" – he said to the paralytic, "I say to you, rise, pick up your mat, and go home." He rose, picked up his mat at once, and went away in the sight of everyone. They were all astounded and glorified God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this." - Mark 2: 9-12

The miracles of Jesus play an important role in revealing His identity and mission. Today, we will consider the healing of a paralytic. Given the theological bias of the times, the paralytic was relegated to the lost sheep of Israel because of his illness which was looked upon as a punishment for sin, either his own or that of his parents. How then was he able to overcome his sense of despair and misery and come to Jesus? Was he able to persuade his stretcher bearers to take him to Jesus because of his faith, or was it their faith that persuaded him to approach Jesus? Their faith is severely tested when they realize that they cannot have access to Jesus because of the crowd around Him in the house and around it.



While their faith might have been stretched, it did not break. Rather than give up or wait for another auspicious time, they became even more determined to see Jesus, their only meaningful last recourse! They climbed up the roof and let the paralytic down to Jesus through the roof! Faith in Jesus can be amazing, producing totally unexpected deeds!

Jesus begins the interaction by forgiving the paralytic his sins. Jesus is making a profound statement through this astonishing and shocking introductory action. Only God can forgive sin! Clearly then, Jesus is claiming that He is God, and as God, He has the power to cure the man of his illness. After Jesus forgives the man his sins, to the horrified disgust of His opponents, He then heals the paralytic of his illness. Jesus is making a further point. Jesus can be our Savior, bringing about our exodus from the kingdom of sin and darkness to the kingdom of God, because He is God! The man's gesture of rising, picking up his mat, and walking away in the sight of everyone is an indescribable sight! We go through a similar experience in the sacrament of reconciliation. God's actions in Creation, and in the miracles of healing and exorcisms, make it clear that God is incomprehensible to our minds, and holy or totally other-than what we can ever imagine. The spontaneous response on our part, therefore, is astonishment, amazement, gratitude, and praise on our lips! As the crowd exclaimed, "We have never seen anything like this!" Jesus, I accept you as my Savior and Lord!

It is self-explanatory.



We do the nightly review of the day to assess our companionship with the Lord and take stock of our discipleship. This evening we will introduce a significant dimension of our sinful nature that we will need to examine. St. Ignatius of Loyola introduced the Particular Examination of Conscience in the Spiritual Exercises. From his experience, he came to see that we all have a significant weakness or core wound which acts as a major stumbling block to our progress in the spiritual life. This core wound could be generational, a core sin in our gene pool that jeopardizes our discipleship, sabotages what is good in us, and prevents a seriously committed relationship with the Lord. Or it could be the result of bad habits that have become deeply rooted in us, leading us to succumb to temptation and sin. You can take some time during your review today to consider what your Particular Examination of Conscience would be. What are the patterns of sin that keep recurring, and how do they begin and end? What would you need to do to overcome them? After you have spent time recalling with gratitude and praise God's many blessings bestowed upon you this day, you can then do the Particular Examination of Conscience along with your General Examination. As disciples of Jesus, we are to honestly acknowledge our sins and make an act of repentance. After you have examined your conscience and are ready to ask forgiveness, you can pray the Act of Contrition. We encourage you to journal on the following questions: What is God saying to you? For what are you grateful? For what are you contrite? What spiritual practices, including fasting, do you need to focus on tomorrow?

"As he was getting into the boat, the man who had been possessed pleaded to remain with him. But he would not permit him but told him instead, "Go home to your family and announce to them all that the Lord in his pity has done for you." Then the man went off and began to proclaim in the Decapolis what Jesus had done for him; and all were amazed" - Mark 5: 18-20

During His ministry in Galilee, Jesus set up headquarters in Capernaum. He was contending with some major challenges to establish the Kingdom of God. Herod Antipas was the Tetrarch of Galilee and his fortress in Tiberias was not far off. He had beheaded John the Baptist and was paranoid about any charismatic leader rebelling against him. Jesus was attracting crowds in the thousands and could become a major threat. Hence, He repeatedly told those He cured not to tell anyone of their healings. Secondly, Jesus was debunking the notion that the Messiah would restore the kingdom of Israel through military power. His own disciples would have great difficulty accepting Jesus as a Suffering-Servant Messiah who would take away the sins of the world through His sacrifice on the cross.



Lastly, the concept that Jesus would be the Messiah of the whole world was foreign to His Jewish audience even though this truth was foretold in their Scriptures about the Suffering-Servant being for all humankind: "It is too little, he says, for you to be my servant, to raise up the tribes of Jacob, and restore the survivors of Israel; I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth" (Isaiah 49: 6).

The healing of the demoniac addresses the truth that Jesus came for the Gentiles as well. The disciples will understand this truth only after the Outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The presence of the herd of swine tells us that we are in Gentile territory. Most probably, the demoniac was a Gentile. He was dwelling among the tombs, and no one could restrain him, not even with chains. Jesus is about destroying the power of Satan and his dominion over people, and this man, in this case. In the encounter between Jesus and the unclean spirits, they concede defeat because they know that Jesus is the Son of the Most High. Jesus accedes to their request to inhabit the herd of swine, unclean animals, who are a better dwelling place for them than humans.


The change in the Gerasene man is amazing: "the man who had been possessed pleaded to remain with him." Instead, Jesus sends him on a mission, asking him to witness to his family and friends: "Go home to your family and announce to them all that the Lord in his pity has done for you" (Mark 5: 19). This visit to Gentile territory was the first of two. The first time, the inhabitants were awed by Jesus' power, and terrified by it as well.



They asked Jesus to leave them. During His second visit, however, the crowds were very welcoming of Jesus. They followed Jesus in great numbers. He fed four thousand people by multiplying seven loaves and a few fish. Probably, the healed demoniac was a powerful witness to Jesus among his fellow inhabitants, preparing them to receive the good news in Jesus. Jesus, I accept you as my Savior and Lord!

"He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" - Mark 4: 39-40

Jesus chose eleven of His twelve Apostles from Galilee. Most of them were from Bethsaida or Capernaum, both coastal towns of the Sea of Galilee. And a goodly number of them were fishermen. The Sea of Galilee is 13 miles long, north to south, and about 8 miles wide, east to west. It is about 686 feet below sea level. They were familiar with the Sea of Galilee, and over their careers as fishermen had seen and experienced its many moods. Yet on this occasion, they were terrified with the violent squall that came up, with the waves breaking all over the boat so that it was already filling up. We are told that they were terrified and feared for their lives: "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" (Mark 4: 38). As opposed to their panic, Jesus was in the stern, fast asleep on a cushion. His disposition suggested that He was in control of the situation. He woke up and rebuked the storm and calm was restored. The disciples were beginning to recognize that Jesus was much more than being like one of them. He had to be divine as only God could control the storm the way Jesus did. Their faith in Jesus is at once challenged and deepened.



After He had calmed the storm, Jesus asked them why they were so terrified and did not have faith in Him. To have faith would suggest that we are in a situation that is beyond our resources. We are in crisis because our circumstances are far more powerful than we are. Consequently, we rely on someone else who has greater power than we do. In His questions to them, Jesus was making it clear that the Messiah had arrived in their midst.

The disciples respond to the miracle with awe and adoration: "They were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?" The disciples are undergoing a paradigmatic change in the Presence of Jesus. Their old worldview is being dismantled! Jesus must be the Son of God. Hence, Mark begins his gospel in the following manner: "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God." Jesus, I accept you as my Savior and Lord!

As stated in an earlier reflection, gratitude and compassion are an important dimension of the nightly review of the day. At the heart of gratitude is the realization that we are totally dependent on God, that our lives, therefore, can only make sense when we live within the bond of covenant union with God. When we reject God as the Center of our lives, we either make ourselves or other idols the purpose of our existence. We embark upon a slippery slope that leads us away from God, headed toward eternal separation from Him. Engaging in thanksgiving during our nightly review of the day is important, but it is not enough. The prayer of gratitude needs to become our constant companion during the day. We need to practice the presence of God through His innumerable blessings and graces being offered to us throughout the day. So, keep this in the back of your mind as you engage in thanksgiving during your review. Now, with thanksgiving in your heart, go over your day and see how God was Emmanuel, with you and in you. Then, do your Particular and General Examination of Conscience to see how you responded to God. After you have examined your conscience and are ready to ask forgiveness. you can pray the Act of Contrition. We encourage you to journal on the following questions: What is God saying to you? 

Our nightly review of the day has an immediate and a long-term purpose. The long-term purpose of the nightly review is to foster and deepen our awareness of God's presence during the whole day. When done seriously, the nightly review leads to a strong desire to be in communion with God throughout the day. With familiarity with the practice of the Presence of God, a disciple will develop a consistent awareness of God's presence and love throughout the day. Keeping this long-term benefit in mind, we can now express our praise and amazement at God's immense love and compassion for us as His sons and daughters. We then do an examination of conscience, both Particular and General, to see how we have responded to God as disciples of Jesus. Have we been obedient to the guidance of the Holy Spirit? In what specific ways have we sinned? After you have examined your conscience and are ready to ask forgiveness, you can pray the Act of Contrition. We encourage you to journal on the following questions: What is God saying to you? For what are you grateful? For what are you contrite? What spiritual discipline, including fasting, do you need to focus on tomorrow?
