





Jorge Herrera learned how to be an entrepreneur in Roatán

A move to Roatán during his adolescence marks Jorge's life and turns him









orge Herrera is a young entrepreneur originally from Guarizama Olancho, the oldest of three brothers, his entrepreneurial story begins when his parents moved to Roatan, while he was still a teenager, when he was just 18 years old he applied to work at the Henry Morgan Hotel and his surprise was that he was hired immediately even without experience.

He started working in the bar and beach restaurant area as a waiter and bartender, with one of the best work teams at the time, after 2 and a half years he was promoted to the main lobby bar, where he was bartender for three and a half more years, at that time was the opening of the new hotel chain, Media Luna and in a

> management meeting, they decided that he would become the head of bars in Medialuna Beach

Several years later he decided to take the big leap and in January 2020 months before the start of the pandemic, he realized that he had a lot of knowledge in the area of hospitality and beverages. Then he decided to offer cocktail services for events, the concept was so well received that in Comaya-

gua. "Prior to the pandemic in March we already had many recreations, which were canceled by the closure of the pandemic, then in full pandemic came the opening of a food truck in the colonial zone of Comayagua where we started the first local Mossa," says Jorge Herrera.

He implemented a cocktail concept which when he started had acceptance in the hotel category cocktail bar in the central area, this even working for another company something very sacrificed for him, since he left at 5 pm from work and would have the place an hour later at 6 and closed it at 10

pm.
His message to entrepreneurs is not to stop dreaming and to remember that the dream is accompanied by effort and sacrifice, there are days when you cannot go on, but that is when you have to be strong and brave and continue, you have to be very disci-plined and organized in what you do and if you make a mistake you learn and correct it and in that way, you consolidate your business. There is learning to be surrounded by people who know how to let your new ideas and help you grow to be every day to be better, but about everything, before you start a project let it in the hands of God concludes.



SUSHI WINGS

is the innovative gastronomic function of the capital of Honduras

n Tegucigalpa, we had the opportunity to interview a promising woman of gastronomy in the Honduran capital, Milgian Girón, founder of Sushi Wings, a true gastrono-

Milgian Girón is a proactive person, passionate about each of the activities she performs, she is currently much focused on gastronomy and the creation of each dish presented in the restaurant.

For a long time, she dedicated herself to the practice of sports, soccer, competing in handball with the national team reaching the countries of Taiwan among others; also practiced soccer 11 in federated games throughout Honduras, volleyball in the League of the Olympic Village, and Flag Football in the national league of Honduras,

She is originally from a community that belongs to the municipality of Guayape Olancho.

She started months before the pandemic, just in January 2020, she had resigned from an insurance company before the COVID-19, then opened a small local food catra-

cha, with the arrival of the confinement during the pandemic, unfortunately, had to close and was left without work without money, in the midst of his frustration did not give up.

Then she began to think about what she could do and realized that she had L 2,500, a borrowed stove, and a refrigerator with a gas leak and she

came up with the idea of starting "Sus-

hi Wings HN".

Milgian had her first experiences with sushi during her stay in Korea and Taiwan when she saw a gastronomic culture very different from ours here in Honduras, she called my attention to everything, and she began to learn and investigate a little more about each dish that is presented in the Japanese country, and being in Honduras she began to prepare them constantly, and in the end, the kitchen of Sushi Wings has been every day a school for learning for her.

Entrepreneurship for Milgian has been

a beautiful experience because it has allowed her to learn and make people happy through gastronomy, but at the same time, it is an experience with many challenges, where she has also encountered the challenges of entrepreneurs such as permission to operate, tax payments, and neighbors annoyed by the changes in the area.

The menu she offers is a Japanese American fusion, what her customers are looking for most is sushi, wings, ramen, and noodles; these are the dishes that are the most popular daily.

Sushi Wings was born with the idea of providing customers not only Japanese food, because many times two people go to consume, but one of them did not like sushi, but if he liked the wings, then there we covered both people who consumed and were happy to find a corner where they found that delicious fusion.

She recommends entrepreneurs not to stop having perseverance, perseverance should not be lost as entrepreneurs, and do not forget the dream of growing every day, find to do something that we

like to do is very important, do not lose faith always pray that God does not leave our hand.

CICESCT trains journalists within the framework of the World Day Against Trafficking in Persons







alled "voices against human trafficking" is the training received by journalists, broadcasters and presenters from different media, which was given by the inter-institutional Commission Against Commercial Sexual Exploitation and Human Trafficking of Honduras.

Journalists from different television, radio, digital and print media received a manual for journalists which contains the necessary information on the correct approach to the issue of human trafficking and its modalities. At the same time, they were given the Law and Regulations Against Trafficking in Persons, where they will find everything about the legislation focused on this crime and its modalities. The head of the CICESCT Sua Martinez assures that it is of the utmost importance that communicators are sensitized, so that in this way they can communicate to the Honduran people correct messages about human

trafficking and how to prevent it. The workshop was attended by representatives of more than 120 journalists, as well as authorities represen-



ting the Secretary of Security, PADF, IOM, UNODC, Foreign Ministry, DINAF, the Supreme Court of Justice, among others.

This workshop was achieved with the support of the International Organization for Migration (OIM), which continues to work jointly with the CICESCT in the fight against human trafficking.

We continue working with Enfoque de Género, and the Defense of Human Rights, complying with the government plan of President Xiomara Castro.

During the festival, a variety of activities will take place, including the



Railroad Museum, the historical jewel of Honduras

t is a historical jewel because it is an important monument of Honduras because, through it, the new generations can connect with the past.

The National Railroad of Honduras was founded during the times of General José Trinidad Cabañas.

The Railroad Museum of El Progreso, Yoro is the only one in all of Honduras, it has all the history of the machinery from the banana era to the 2000s.

The railroad in Honduras dates back to the middle of the 19th century. The Railway Interpretation Center or Railway Museum was inaugurated on October 19, 2013, with the purpose of preserving one of the most important symbols of modernity in the city of El Progreso. The railroad has 32 pieces of historical

collection, locomotives, wagons, fruit cars, second class passenger cars, among others.

It has a photo library where there is a photographic exhibition of the events of the time and of important characters that stand out in the history of the railroad. It was inaugurated on September 10, 2014.

The idea of building a Railway Interpretation Center was born from the need to keep alive the historical memory of our town.

The 2.5 blocks of land where the mechanical plant of the Tela Rail Road Company operated, were managed by the progressive citizen Roberto Micheletti Bain while he served as president of the National Congress. The National Congress of the Republic granted them for the laudable cultural purpose of the Railroad Museum.


