This 12-day Norwegian coastal cruise explores the best of Norway's fjords, Arctic wilderness, and 34 charming ports, covering over 2,500 nautical miles. Crossing the Arctic Circle twice, you'll see Norway's natural and cultural wonders, including majestic mountains, lively cities, and quaint coastal villages.

DAY 1 Bergen

Welcome Aboard!

Your voyage starts in Bergen, Norway's second-largest city and a gateway to the fjords. Founded in 1070 A.D., Bergen boasts architecture influenced by the prosperous 14th-century German trading organization, the Hanseatic League.

If you have time before your ship departs, visit the UNESCO-listed wharfs in the colorful Bryggen district, now a neighborhood with artisan's shops, complete with cobblestone streets. Just across the street is the famous fish market, which serves delicious seafood. The Fløibanen funicular can also whisk you up Mount Fløyen for lovely views of the city.

DAY 2 Ålesund

Iconic Architecture and Fantastic Fjords

Your day begins with a scenic sail through the Nordfjord, followed by a visit to the charming town of Ålesund, known for its stunning Art Nouveau architecture. After a devastating fire in 1904, the town was rebuilt in a unique architectural style that features colorful buildings with ornate details. Stroll through the streets and take in the vibrant atmosphere, or visit Atlanterhavsparken, one of Europe's largest saltwater aquariums.

In the summer, your ship will set course for the UNESCO-listed Geirangerfjord, where you'll be surrounded by towering cliffs and waterfalls, including the iconic Seven Sisters. In spring and fall, the voyage heads to the secluded Hjørundfjord, offering dramatic mountain views and a stop at the peaceful village of Urke. Your final stop of the day is Molde, where you can enjoy the famous Molde Panorama of 222 mountain peaks across the fjord—especially beautiful in the summer when the town is in full bloom.



DAY 3

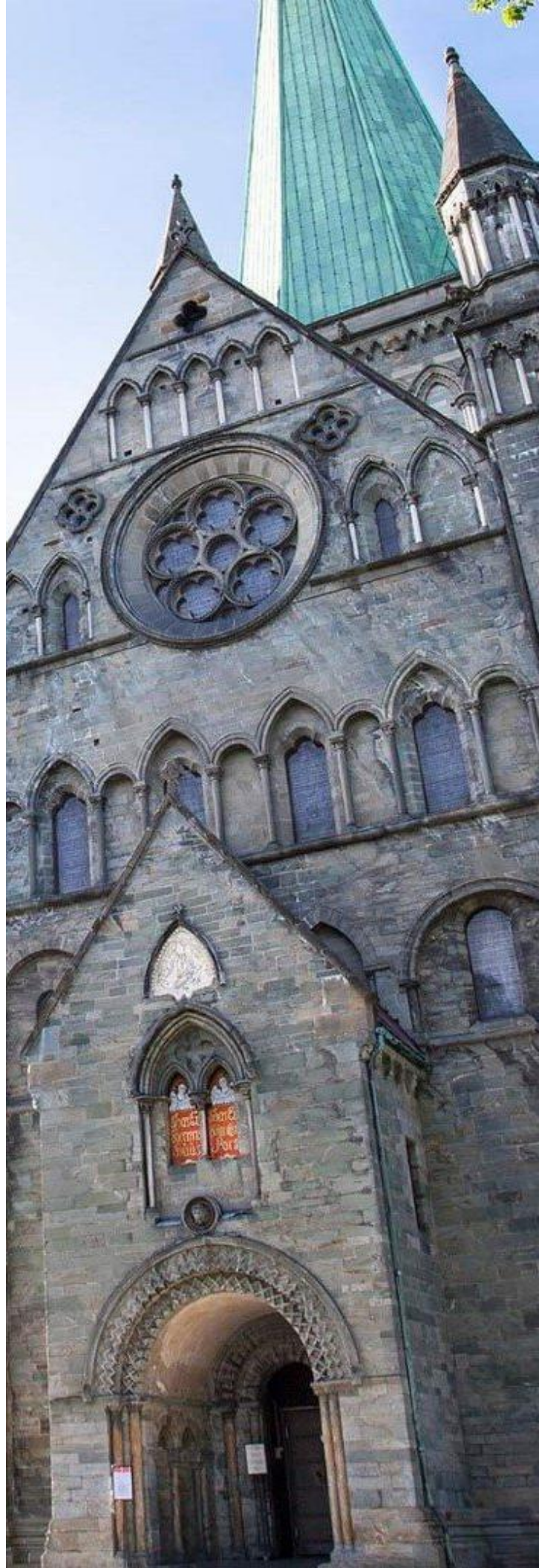
Trondheim

City of Kings and Palaces

Your ship docks in Trondheim, a city rich in history, founded by Viking King Olav Tryggvason in 997 A.D. The main attraction here is the stunning Nidaros Cathedral, Scandinavia's largest medieval building. Explore its intricate Gothic design or visit the nearby Archbishop's Palace, home to Norway's crown jewels.

After visiting the cathedral, take a stroll across the Old Town Bridge into the colorful Bakklandet district. With its charming wooden houses and cozy cafés, it's the perfect place for a relaxing walk or coffee along the Nid River.

As your ship departs in the afternoon, you'll sail past the picturesque Kjeungskjær Lighthouse and coastal islets. Enjoy the beautiful scenery as you head toward the port of Rørvik.





DAY 4

Bodø

We cross the Arctic Circle early in the morning, beginning your Arctic tour of Norway. We mark the moment with a traditional ceremony that's sure to wake you up!

Above the Arctic Circle in summer, you can enjoy the sun 24 hours a day, while in winter, your chances of seeing the Northern Lights greatly improve.

Into the Arctic

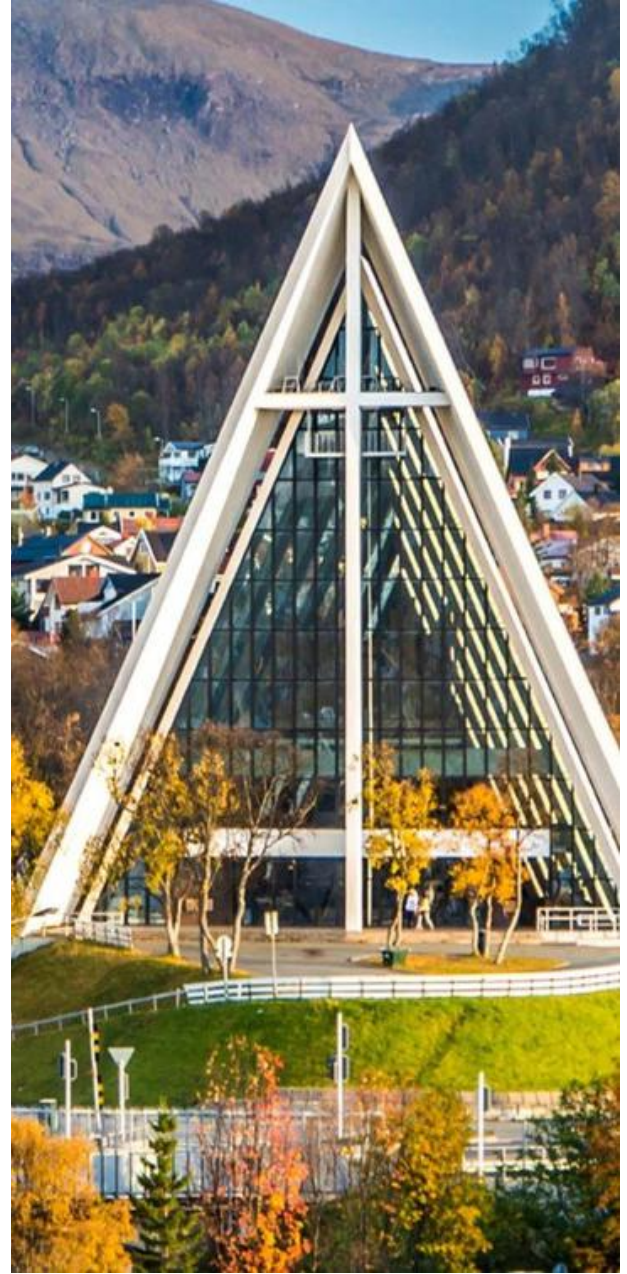
We'll dock in Ørnes, near Norway's second-largest glacier, Svartisen. The pier here is popular for the 'Love Bench', where sweethearts declare their lasting romance with a padlock.

Then we'll sail to Bodø, Northern Norway's second-largest city, overlooked by the Børvass peaks. Admire fabulous street art or join an optional boat excursion to Saltstraumen, the world's most powerful maelstrom.

The ship enters the Lofoten Archipelago in the afternoon. The Lofoten Wall, standing over 3,200 feet tall, is a stunning sight on the horizon.

Stamsund is home to one of the largest fishing fleets in the islands, which is busiest between January and April, when the Arctic cod—known locally as skrei—swim from the Barents Sea in the north down to Vestfjord to spawn.

You'll know you've arrived in the pretty harbor of Svolvær when you see rows of traditional fisherman's huts on stilts, known as rorbuer. This is the main town of the Lofoten Islands.



DAY 5 Capital of the Arctic

Tromsø

Your ship arrives in Tromsø, a vibrant city known as the "Gateway to the Arctic." Here, you'll have time to explore iconic sites like the Arctic Cathedral, with its stunning stained-glass windows, or visit Polaria, a fascinating Arctic experience center. Tromsø's lively cafés, bars, and the historic Mack Brewery are perfect spots to experience local flavors. In the evening, your ship sails past the towering Lyngen Alps, offering dramatic views of sharp peaks rising from the sea.

DAY 6

Honningsvåg

Gateway to the North Cape

Journey continues to Honningsvåg, the gateway to the North Cape, the northernmost point of mainland Europe. An optional excursion takes you to the famous North Cape globe monument, where you can enjoy breathtaking views of the Arctic Ocean. As you travel, keep an eye out for reindeer grazing in the surrounding hills—an iconic sight in this part of Norway.

As your ship sails northward, you'll pass the striking rock formation known as Finnkirka, once used as a Sámi sacrificial site. Later in the day, you'll arrive in Mehamn, Norway's northernmost mainland port. The Arctic wilderness surrounding these ports offers a sense of awe and remoteness, making this part of the voyage truly unforgettable.



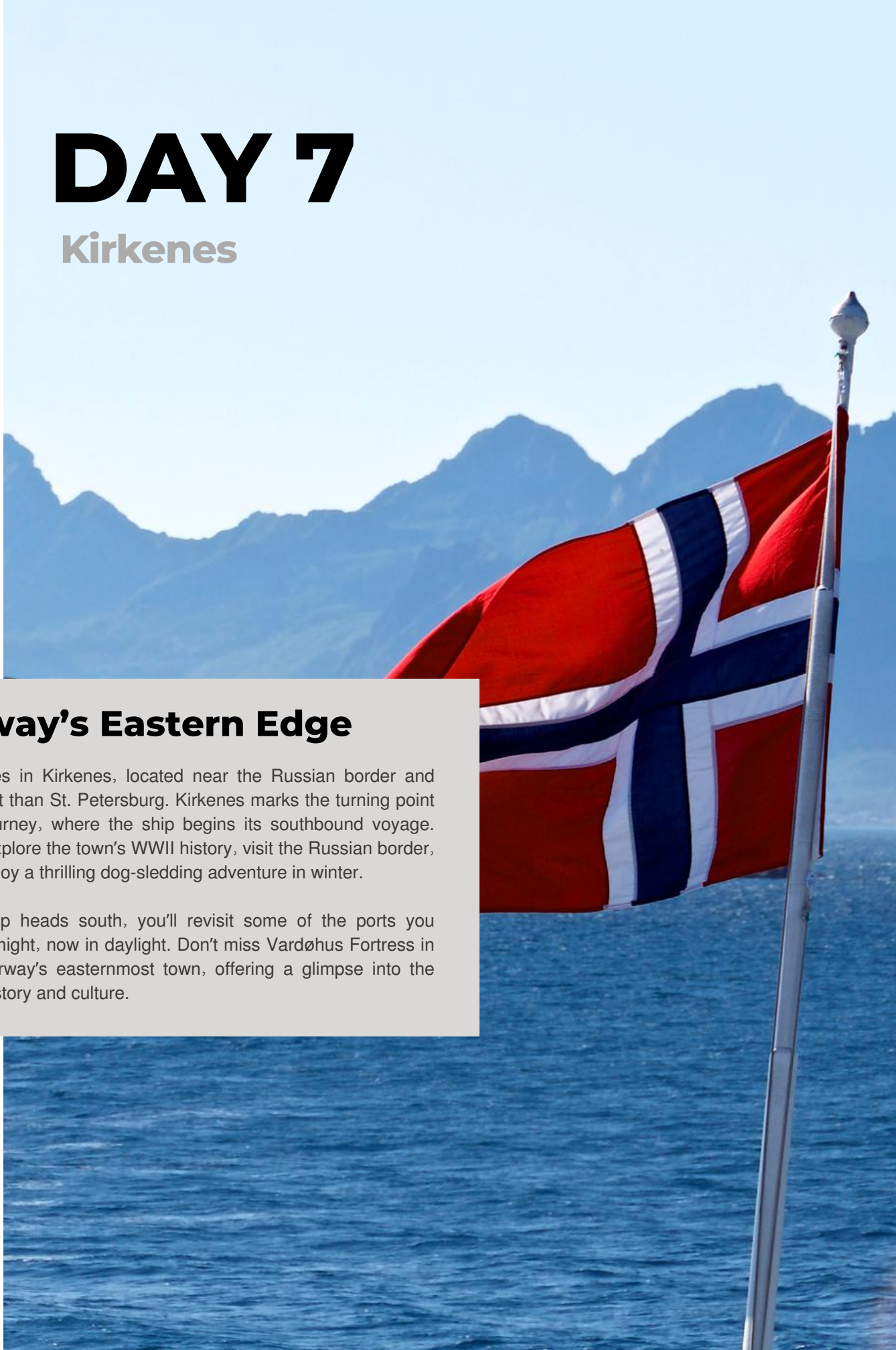
DAY 7

Kirkenes

Norway's Eastern Edge

Ship arrives in Kirkenes, located near the Russian border and farther east than St. Petersburg. Kirkenes marks the turning point of your journey, where the ship begins its southbound voyage. You can explore the town's WWII history, visit the Russian border, or even enjoy a thrilling dog-sledding adventure in winter.

As the ship heads south, you'll revisit some of the ports you passed at night, now in daylight. Don't miss Vardøhus Fortress in Vardø, Norway's easternmost town, offering a glimpse into the region's history and culture.



DAY 8

Hammerfest



From the Top of Europe

This morning, your ship calls at Hammerfest, one of the world's northernmost towns. Known for its rich polar history, Hammerfest is home to the UNESCO-listed Meridian Column, which commemorates the first measurement of the Earth's shape. Take a stroll through the town, visit the Polar Bear Society, or hike to the top of Mount Salen for panoramic views of the surrounding Arctic landscapes.

In the evening, you return to Tromsø, where you'll have the chance to explore the lively Arctic city under the Midnight Sun in summer or experience the Northern Lights in winter. Tromsø's vibrant atmosphere and stunning surroundings make it the perfect place to enjoy a night out or take part in one of the optional excursions offered in the area.

DAY 9

Svolvær

You'll be exploring the archipelagos of Lofoten and Vesterålen, true highlights of our scenic Norwegian route. After a call at Finnsnes in the early morning, the ship calls at Harstad. Here lies the world's northernmost medieval stone church on the peninsula: the white-washed Tronden Church. Next we'll stop at Risøyhamn, our smallest port of call. Then it's off to Sortland, where the landscape slowly transforms from hills to mountains towering over 3,280 feet high.

Our birthplace

Stokmarknes is where captain Richard With launched The Norwegian Coastal Express in 1893. Visit Hurtigrutemuseet, a building resembling a ship in a bottle. It chronicles the Hurtigruten legacy, centered around retired ship MS Finnmarken from 1956.

A ship-sized fjord

Sailing along Raftsund, the Captain may choose to take the ship into the tiny Trollfjord. The mountain walls will look so close, you'll think you can reach out and touch them! To exit the fjord, the ship will rotate 180 degrees in a single spot, then sail back out. Remember to look out for sea eagles here, too.

Leaving Lofoten

We'll reach Svolvær in the evening. The huge mountain that sits above the town is named the 'Svolvær Goat', due to its supposed resemblance.

DAY 10

Brønnøysund

A Landscape of Trolls

This morning, your ship crosses the Arctic Circle again, marking your return to southern Norway. As you sail along the Helgeland Coast, you'll pass some of Norway's most iconic landscapes, including the Seven Sisters mountain range. Legend has it that these towering peaks are seven troll sisters turned to stone by the rising sun. Along the way, you'll also see the distinctive Torghatten Mountain, famous for the hole that runs through its center, a natural wonder shaped by ice over thousands of years.

In the afternoon, the ship docks in the picturesque town of Brønnøysund. Here, you can explore the town's charming streets or take an optional excursion to hike up Torghatten Mountain for panoramic views. This area offers a perfect mix of natural beauty and folklore, providing a scenic and memorable stop along the journey.





DAY 11

Trondheim

Coastal Communities and Klippfisk



Underground Lake at Bergtatt Mine

Spend the morning in Trondheim, then sail past beautiful island scenery and some of Norway's smallest communities before exploring Kristiansund and Molde.

A ship-sized fjord

Stroll around Trondheim in the early morning as the city wakes. Then visit the sacred Nidaros Cathedral, the resting place of St. Olav. Walk to the Gamle Bybro bridge for a photo opportunity over the Nid River.

Perhaps treat yourself to quality coffee and a Nordic patisserie in one of the Bakklandet district's many chic cafés. Then walk up to Kristiansten Fort for sweeping views of Norway's third-largest city.

Dealing in dried cod

We dock at Kristiansund's harbor in the late afternoon. The town is spread over three islands and known for being Norway's 'Bacalao Capital' (called klippfisk in Norwegian) for the salted cod that's dried out on the surrounding cliffs.

Take a walk around the cobblestone streets of the old town and tour the lively port. You can also head up to the old watchtower at Varden viewpoint for lovely panoramic views.

Peaks and petals

The second-to-last port of the day is Molde, where you can spot the tops of the Romsdal Alps. Flowers should be in bloom in this 'City of Roses' between mid-June and late August.



DAY 12

Bergen



Until Next Time

Your voyage comes full circle today as the ship sails back into Bergen, where your journey began. As you approach the city, you'll pass through the scenic Nordfjord and catch a glimpse of the stunning Jostedal Glacier, mainland Europe's largest. It's a fitting way to end your coastal adventure, with Norway's spectacular fjords framing your final approach.



After disembarking in Bergen, you'll have time to say farewell to the crew and your fellow travelers. If you have some time before your onward journey, consider exploring more of Bergen's highlights, such as the colorful Bryggen wharf, the fish market, or taking a ride on the Fløibanen funicular for a final panoramic view of the city and surrounding fjords.
