

2. Attend 3 (three) structured learning programs, such as: (i) Research Code of Ethics and Publication Ethics, (ii) Scientific Writing, and (iii) Dissertation Research Proposal.
3. Attend 2 (two) learning programs through structured experience, such as: (i) Journal Editorial Internship and (ii) Attend International Seminar/Conference.

- Students must take minimum 46 credits.

#### D. New Graduates Route (LB)

- New Graduates Route is available for students with the following requirements:
  1. Students whose Bachelor's and Master's background are not linear, or
  2. Students who do not meet the requirements for Publication, Methodology, and Teaching Routes, or
  3. Students who meet the requirements for Publication, Methodology, and Teaching Routes but choose New Graduates Study
- Academic obligations for New Graduate Route Students are:
  1. Take all courses
  2. Attend all structured learning programs
  3. Attend all learning programs through structured experience
- Students must take minimum 46 credits.

Doctoral students are given the opportunity to choose and focus on one of these following six interests:

1. Organizational Change and Development
2. Clinical Psychology
3. Neural, Mental, and Behavior
4. Cognition, Social, and Emotional Development Throughout a Life-Span
5. Social Relations
6. Statistics and Measurement
7. Educational Psychology

## VISION

To be the pioneer of excellent and innovative world-class national doctoral education in psychology, devoted to serve the nation and humanity, rooted on the nation's cultural values in accordance with Pancasila.

To present graduates that are capable of conducting researches in the fields of psychology professionally, becoming experts in their research fields, as well as competing in national, regional, and international scale.

## STUDENT ADMISSION

Doctoral student candidates must have graduated from national master's program with minimum accreditation B, or international master's program recognized by Directorate General of Higher Education. Student candidates must pass the Doctoral Program Admission Test held by Faculty of Psychology UGM. This test measures basic knowledge on psychology. Furthermore, student candidates must fulfill the following requirements:

### A. Academic Requirements

1. Master's degree with minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.25 (three point two five) out of 4 (four) from at least B accredited Study Program when the candidate graduated;
2. Has at least 1 (one) article published by national scientific journal, or 1 (one) publication manuscript ready to send to reputable international scientific journal.
3. Recommendation letters from 2 (two) professionals who know candidate's academic potentials well, consisted of 2 (two) lecturers at candidate's master program and/or bachelor program (for those who do not have institution yet) or the head of the institution where the candidate works and 1 (one) other a lecturer at candidate's master program.

### B. English Proficiency Requirements

English proficiency test proven by valid certificate (max. 2 years after date of issue) from one of the following tests:

1. Academic English Proficiency Test (AcEPT) UGM with minimum score of 272 (two hundred and seventy-two); or
2. *Pusat Layanan Tes Indonesia's* Test of English Proficiency (TOEP PLTI) with minimum score of 471 (four hundred and seventy-one); or
3. International English Language Testing System (IELTS) with minimum score of 5.5 (five point five); or
4. Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL):
  - Internet Based Test (iBT) with minimum score 61 (sixty-one); or
  - Institutional Testing Program (ITP) with minimum score 500 (five hundred).

### C. Academic Potential Test Requirements

Academic potential test with minimum score 550 (five hundred and fifty) proven by certificate max. 2 years after date of issue from one of the following tests:

1. *Tes Potensi Akademik Pascasarjana* (PAPS) UGM; or
2. *Tes Potensi Dasar Akademik Pusat Layanan Tes Indonesia* (TPDA PLTI); or
3. *Tes Potensi Akademik Badan Perencanaan Pembangunan Nasional* (TPA Bappenas).

### D. Administrative Requirements

Submit administrative document files as follows:

1. Dissertation proposal manuscript
2. Copy of legalized diploma and academic transcript
3. Curriculum vitae
4. Health certificate approved by doctor
5. For employees, study permit from employer
6. Scientific publication manuscript
7. If any, proof of additional education that has been attended
8. If any, proof of involvement in scientific activities
9. Statement letter on the ability to pay student fee, except those who have applied for government scholarship
10. Proof of communication with future Promoter

## APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Application by student candidate is conducted by:

1. Completing application forms online through <https://um.ugm.ac.id/>;
2. Sending required files to Psychological Science Doctoral Program UGM via email [doktor.psikologi@ugm.ac.id](mailto:doktor.psikologi@ugm.ac.id);
3. Communicating with future promoter with relevant research. If there is any difficulty, candidate may consult with the Head of Psychological Science Doctoral Program UGM via email [doktor.psikologi@ugm.ac.id](mailto:doktor.psikologi@ugm.ac.id)

## LECTURES

Lecture activities are conducted with in-person system (Regular Lectures, Intensive Courses, Sit-in Lectures) or with Independent Study system. The number of mandatory credits that students must take depends on the students' route of study, with details as follows:

### A. Publication Route (JP)

- Publication Route is available for students with publications of at least **3 (three) scientific articles as first author** in the fields of Psychology at **reputable international journal within the last 3 (three) years**.
- Academic obligations for Publication Route students are:
  1. a. Take one (1) course, Dissertation.
  2. b. Attend 2 (two) structured learning programs, such as (i) Research Code of Ethics and Publication Ethics and (ii) Dissertation Research Proposal.
- Students must take minimum 36 credits.

### B. Methodology Route (JM)

- Methodology Route is available for students with the following requirements:
  1. **Bachelor and Master degree in Psychology**,
  2. Experience in **teaching quantitative and qualitative research methodology** courses and experience in **advising student's research or actively conducting researches within at least the last 5 years**.
- Academic obligations for Methodology Route students are:
  1. Take 4 (four) courses that include: (i) Quantitative and Qualitative Psychological Research Methodology of 2 credits on research methodology modules other than their mastered field, (ii) Mixed and Multi Research Methodology, (iii) Systematic Literature Studies, and (iv) Dissertation.
  2. Attend 4 (four) structured learning programs, such as (i) Research Code of Ethics and Publication Ethics, (ii) Scientific Writing, (iii) Recent Development in Scientific Research, min. 2 (two) modules, and (iv) Dissertation Research Proposal.
  3. Attend 2 (two) learning programs through structured experience, such as: (i) Journal Editorial Internship and (ii) Attend International Seminar/Conference.
- Students must take minimum 42 credits.

### C. Teaching Route (JA)

- Teaching Route is available for students with the following requirements:
  1. **Bachelor and Master degree in Psychology**,
  2. Experience in **teaching courses related to their dissertation research field within the last 5 (five) years**.
  3. Experience in **advising student research or actively conducting researches on the same topic with their dissertation research field within the last 5 (five) years**.
- Academic obligations for Teaching Route students are:
  1. Attend all courses, such as: (i) Quantitative and Qualitative Psychological Research Methodology, (ii) Mixed and Multi Research Methodology, (iii) Systematic Literature Studies, and (iv) Dissertation.
