In honor of Women's History Month, here is a little-known fact about Red Oak women ...

The original name used by the women's organization at Red Oak was the "Women's Christian Society". This was a very active group at the church. They worked long and hard to raise funds to send missionaries to Africa and to help the community with farming and other needs. In the early 1970's the name was changed to the "United Methodist Women". Being led by Mrs. Clifford Simmons, as President, those serving included Mrs. Ida Bryant, Ms. Mary Bryant, Mrs. Luella Clemons, Mrs. Thelma Coleman, Ms. Pinky Evans, Mrs. Etherleen Johnson, Mrs. Florence Miller, Mrs. Lula Scandrett, Mrs. Ada B. Slaughter, Mrs. Lizzie Slaughter, Mrs. Rosa Slaughter, Mrs. Willie Weems, Mrs. Louiza Welch, and others.

The UMW participated in many activities that benefited the church, community, and society. They diligently adhered to the mandates of the local district and the North GA Conference. For many years, the UMW was made up of the elder ladies of the congregation. However, Mrs. Simmons led the charge to include younger ladies, training them in all aspects of membership and preparing them for future leadership of the local organization.



WHY DO WE HAVE AN AED IN OUR CHURCH?

By law, churches are not required to have an automated external defibrillator (AED). However, there are many good reasons why a church should consider investing in one of these life-saving devices.

The American Heart Association (AHA) recommends that AEDs be "available in public and/or private places where large numbers of people gather." Red Oak certainly meets the definition of being a place where large numbers of people gather. Think of how many people pass through our church each week. Now think of the weekly classes, plays, dinners and other events that bring large crowds. Having this life saving equipment in our church can make the difference between life and death.

Thank you to the UMM for providing the funds for the purchase of the AED and thank you to everyone who took the time to attend the training.





Colorectal Cancer and the Black Community

Colorectal cancer disproportionately affects Black Americans, and access to care for the highly preventable disease is thought to be behind why this group is 20% more likely to receive a colorectal cancer diagnosis than any other racial or ethnic group.

As a result, experts suggest that African- Americans get screened beginning at age 45. If you have a personal or family history of colorectal cancer, colorectal polyps or inflammatory bowel disease, talk with your health care professional. You may need to be tested earlier or more frequently.
