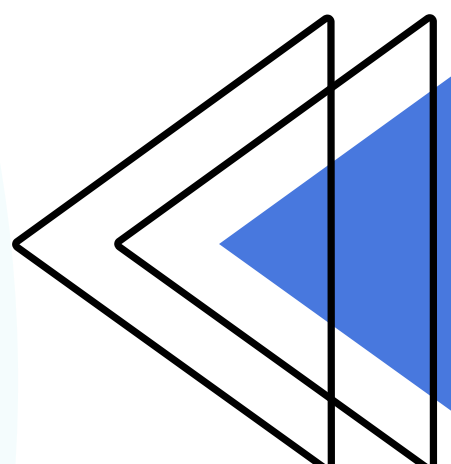
Focus on Socio-Emotional Learning

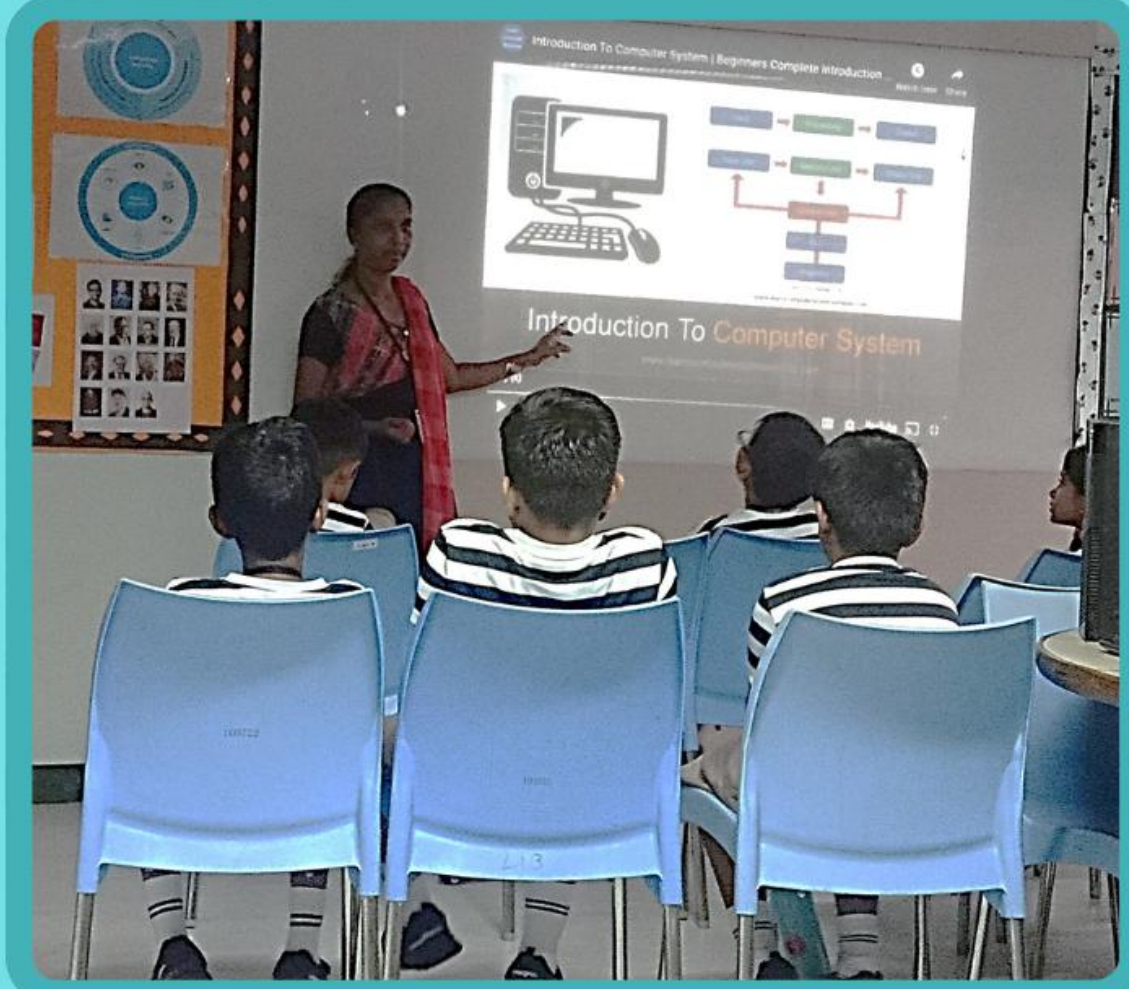
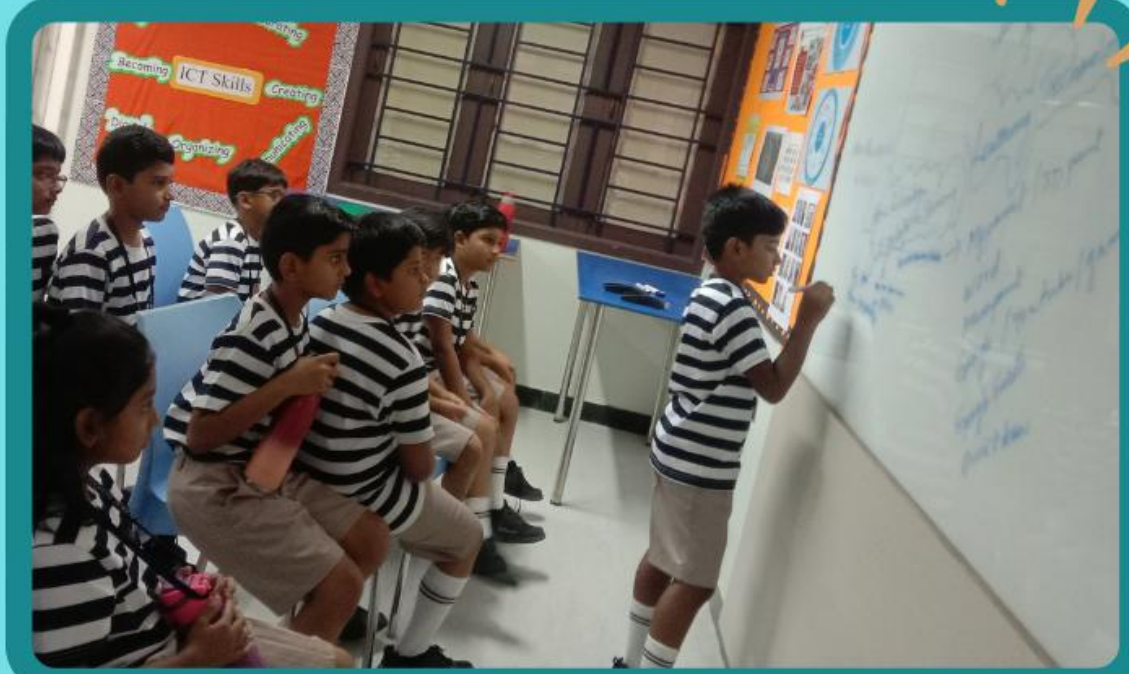

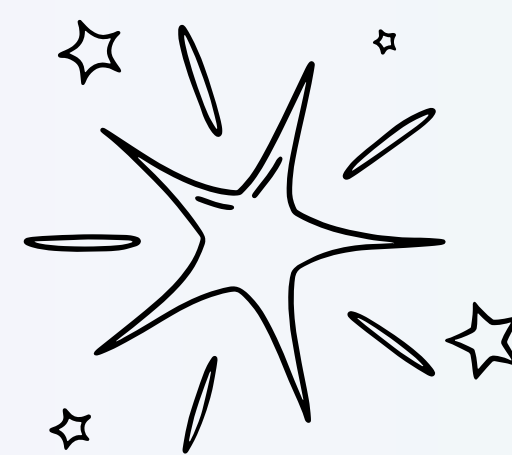
PYP STUDENT COUNCIL ELECTION CAMPAIGN

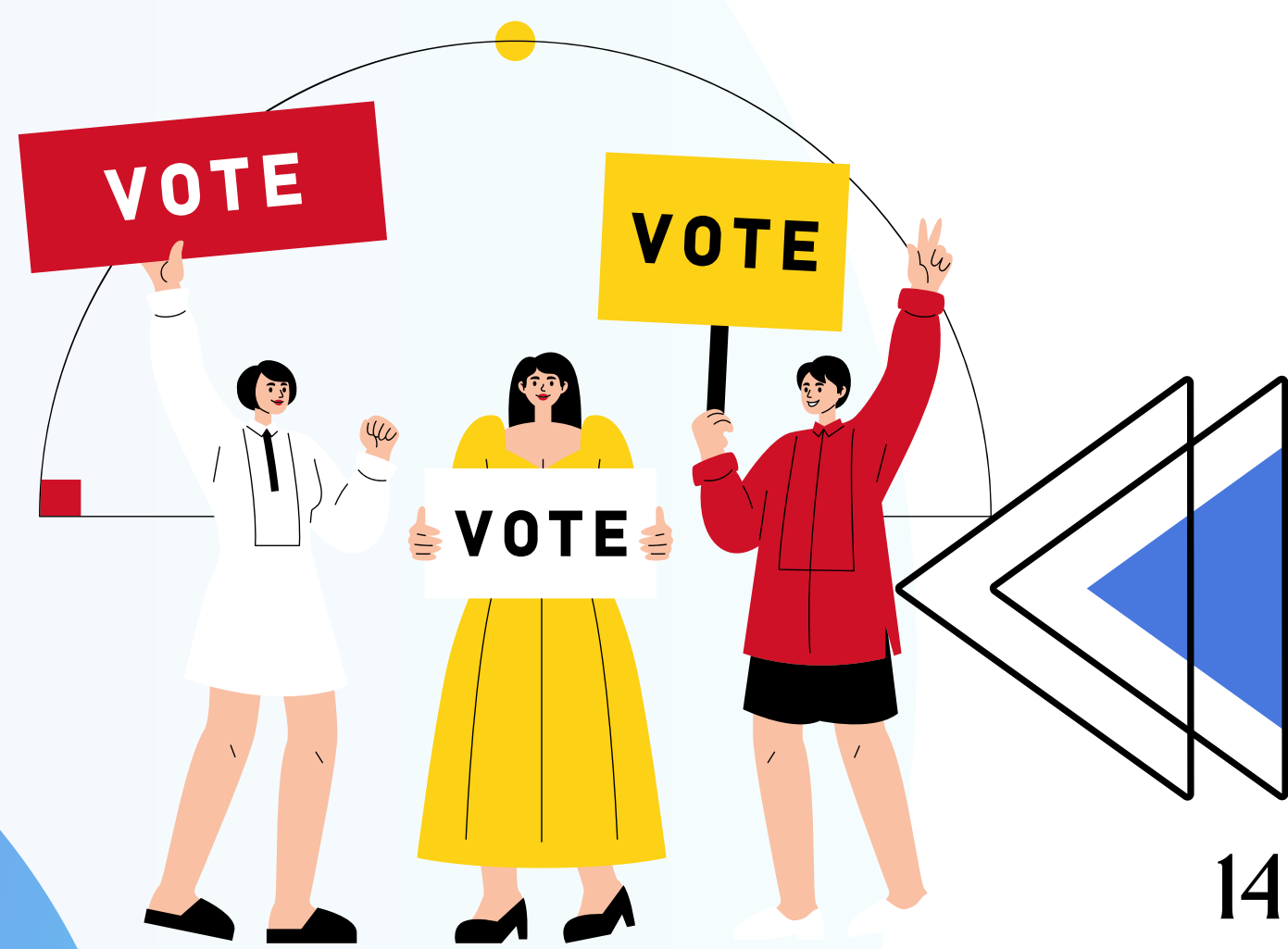
We encourage all students to reflect on the candidates' speeches and platforms and to make an informed decision when casting their votes. The future of our school's leadership is in your hands!

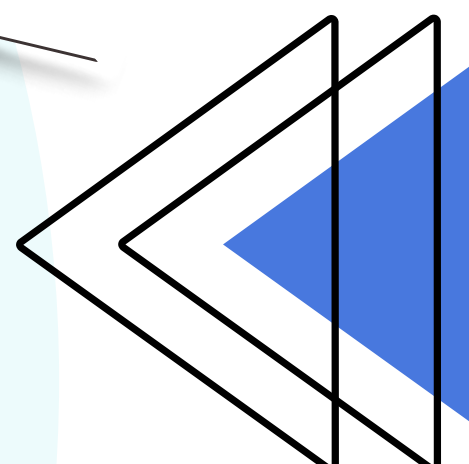
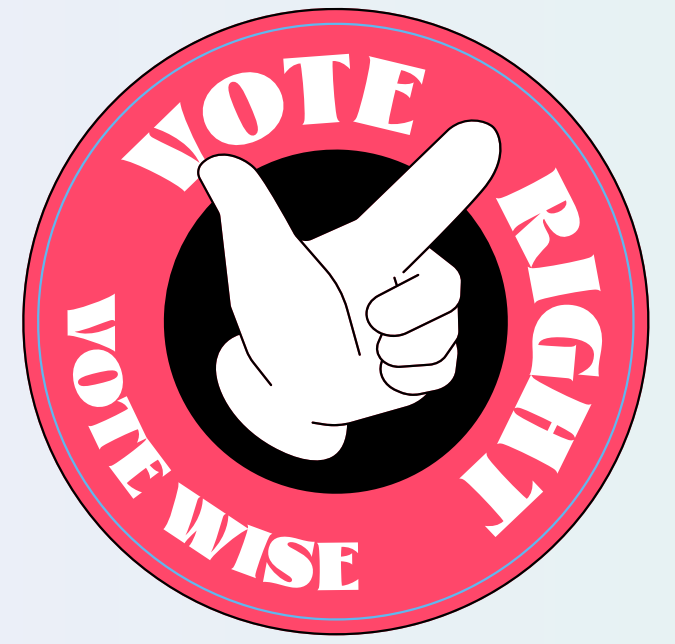

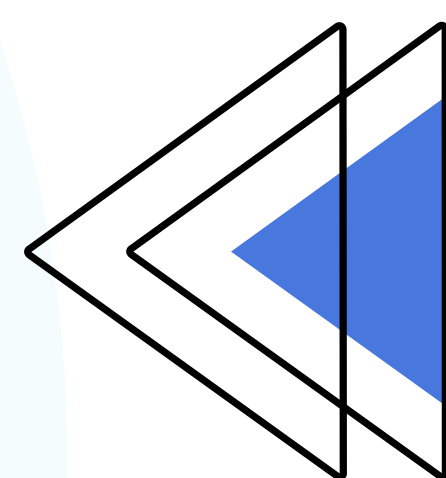

Students were divided into groups and were given a delightful task: choose a tune and create a story, either original or inspired.



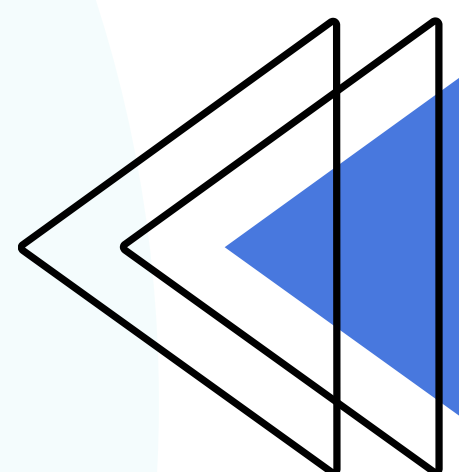

DESIGN THINKING TECHNOLOGY ENGINEERING

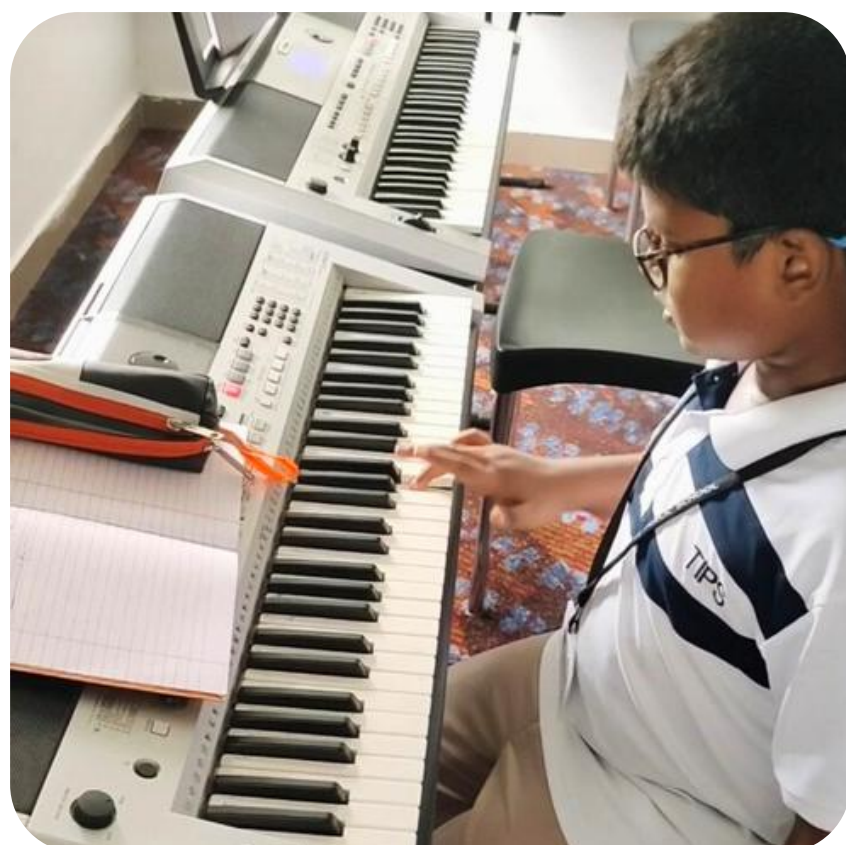

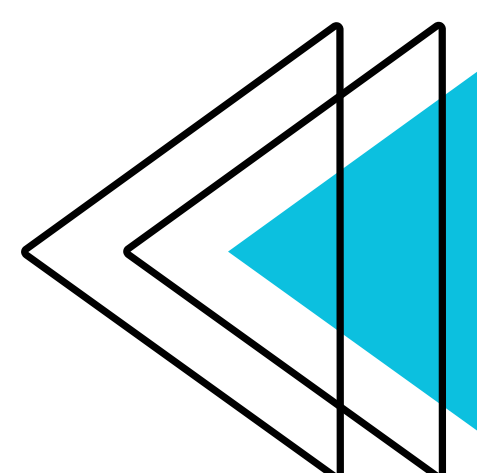
