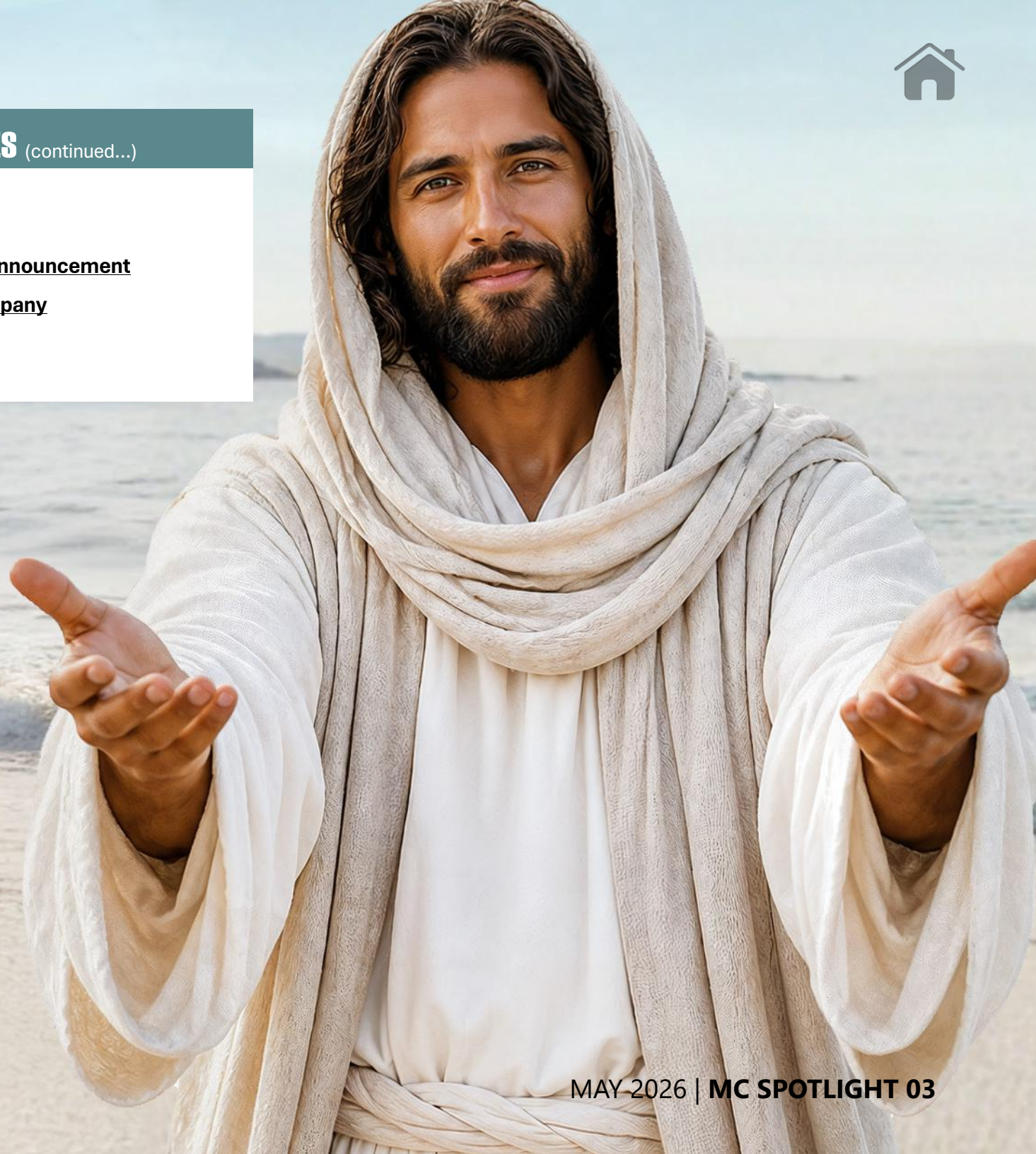

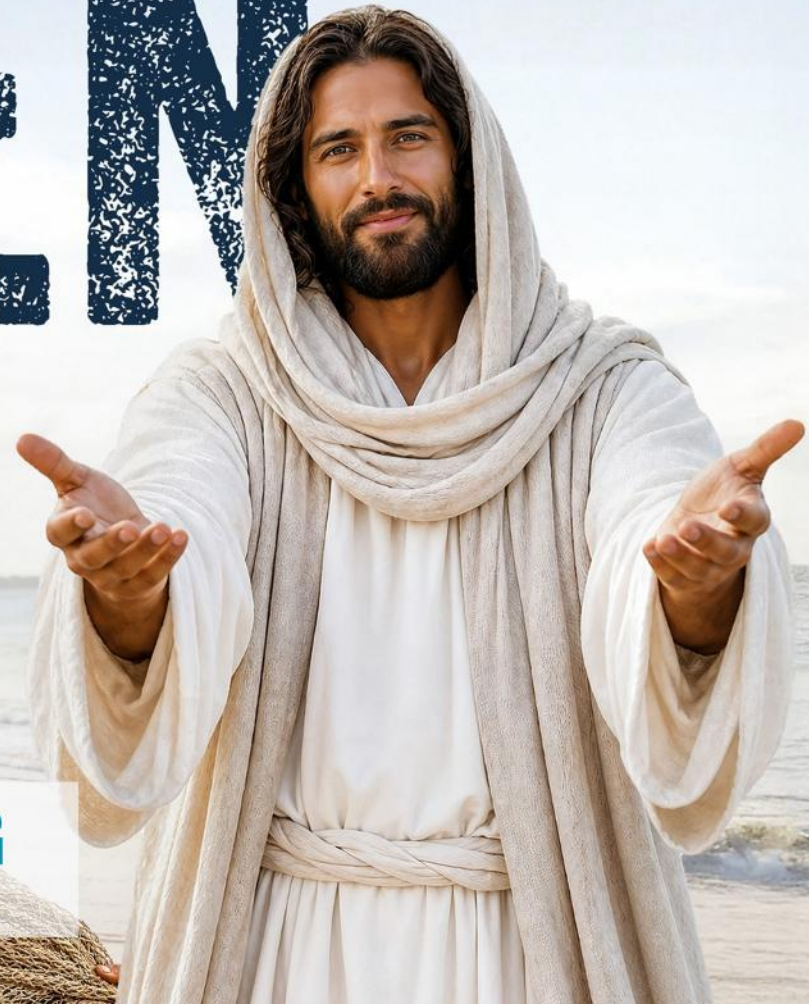

New Friends in Newfoundland Canadian Adventist Youth Summit 2026

This May, I had the opportunity to travel to Newfoundland for the *Canadian Adventist Youth Summit (CAYS) 2026*, themed “*Rise: Empowering Youth Leaders for Mission.*” Going into the week, I expected leadership workshops, worship services, and meetings with youth leaders from across Canada. What I did not expect was how encouraged, refreshed, and inspired I would feel leaving afterwards.

Hosted at *Camp Woody Acres*, CAYS brought together youth leaders from coast to coast serving in many ministries, including youth directors, AY leaders, Pathfinder leaders, regional representatives, chaplains, and others who share the same passion for seeing young people grow closer to Jesus.

One of the biggest blessings was connecting with other youth leaders. While leadership can be lonely, youth leadership has its own unique challenges. There are moments when you wonder if others understand the pressures of leading, supporting young people, balancing ministry with school or work, and still making time for your own spiritual growth. It was encouraging to sit down with leaders from different conferences and realize many of us share similar struggles, experiences, and hopes for the future of our church.



At the same time, it was exciting to hear about the amazing things happening across Canada. Whether it was creative outreach ideas like “Saturday Cafe” in Alberta or a running club ministry in Ontario, campus ministry experiences, or testimonies of God’s moving in local churches. Every conversation left me inspired and wishing I could visit every conference to see these ministries in action.

The workshops challenged and encouraged us in many ways. Several sessions focused on healthy leadership and the importance of not trying to carry every burden alone. Another powerful theme we explored was *Trusting God in Seasons of Waiting and Uncertainty*. As we reflected on Joseph’s journey and the unexpected challenges he faced, we were reminded that even when we cannot fully see what God is doing, He is still leading. Even difficult moments can serve a purpose and prepare us for what God has ahead.

We also had the chance to explore Newfoundland and enjoy God’s creation. One highlight was a boat tour where we saw puffins, an iceberg, and even a surprise whale sighting. Some of the best memories, though, were made during quieter moments: meals together, afternoon walks, late-night conversations, and laughing with people who had been strangers only days earlier.

Traveling back home, I felt inspired and encouraged by seeing passionate leaders serving God in different ways and witnessing the impact youth ministry is making across Canada. The summit challenged me to keep stepping forward in faith, investing in young people, and remembering that even leadership challenges can become growth opportunities. *CAYS 2026* was more than just a conference for me; it was a life-changing experience that reminded me why I serve. It challenged me spiritually, taught me valuable lessons about leadership and ministry, and reminded me how important youth ministry is in helping young people grow in their faith and feel connected, supported, and encouraged in the church.

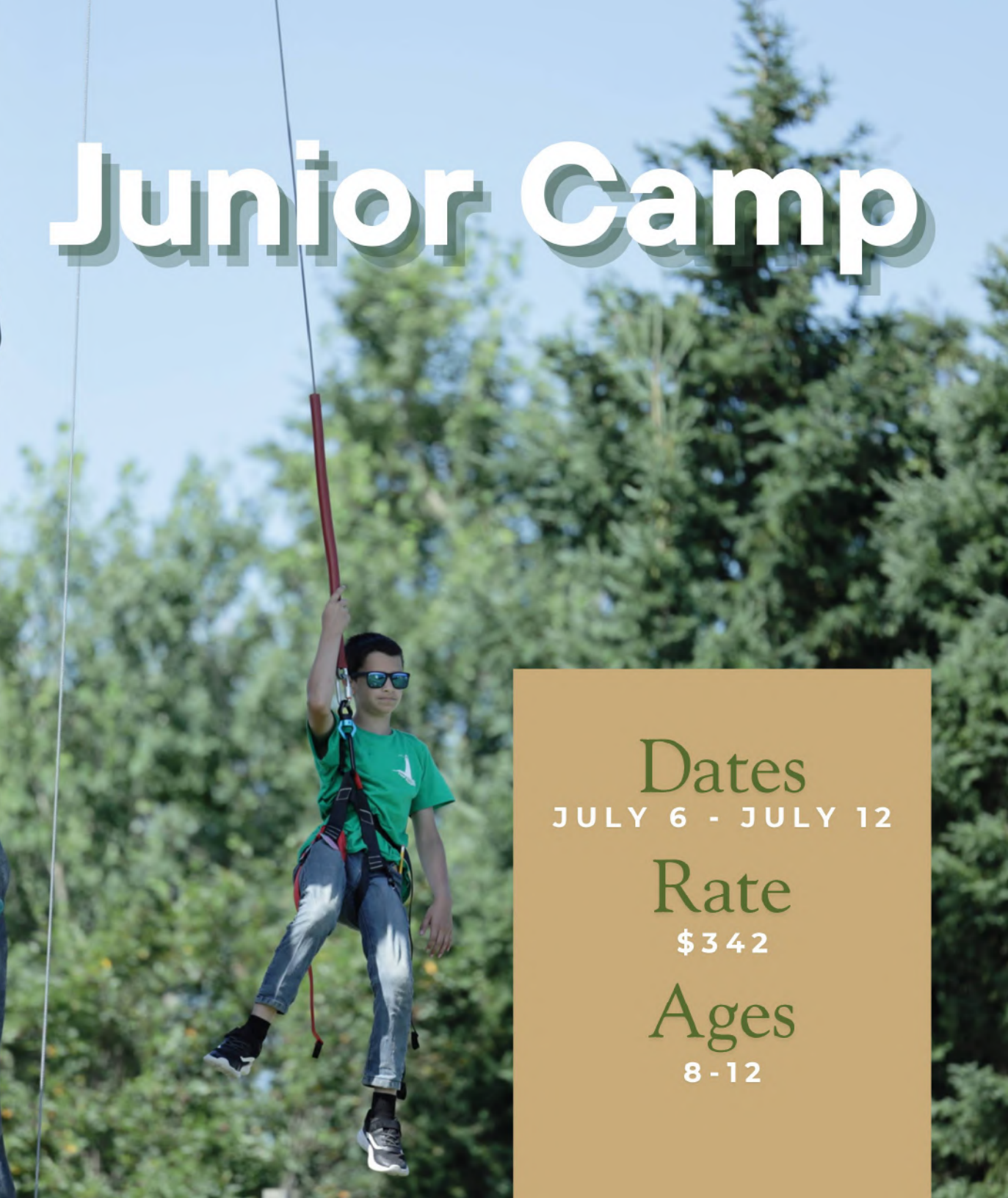

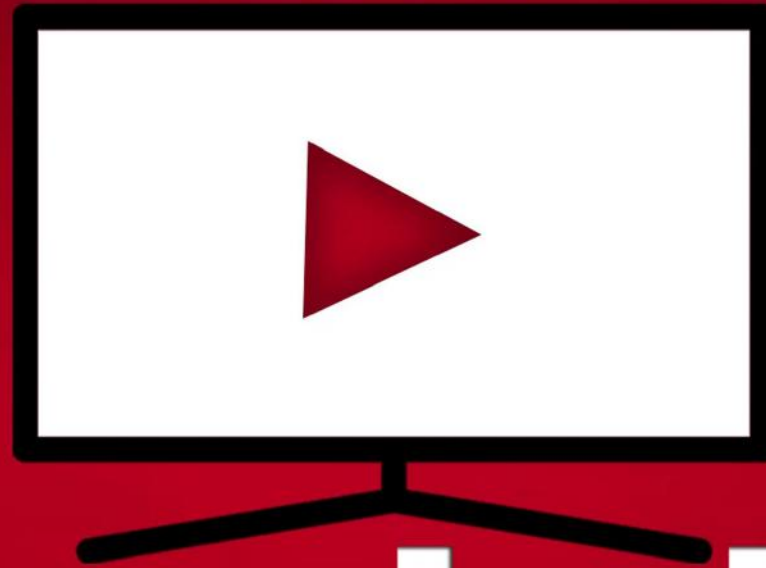

GOD'S CARETAKERS

God Knows Where Your Coins Are

Some Bible stories are long and dramatic. Others are short, simple, and surprisingly powerful. The story of Jesus, Peter, and the coin in the fish's mouth is one of those stories. It teaches us about trust, money, obedience, and God's care for us. It also reminds us that God can provide in ways we would never expect — even through a fish.

This story is found in Gospel of Matthew 17: 24–27. One day, temple tax collectors came to Peter in the town of Capernaum. They asked him, “Does your teacher pay the temple tax?” Peter quickly answered, “Yes.” (Peter often responded quickly. Thinking first was not always his strongest quality.)

When Peter returned home, Jesus already knew what had happened. Peter did not need to explain anything. Jesus spoke first. He explained that earthly kings do not collect taxes from their own sons, only from strangers. By saying this, Jesus showed that He is the Son of God. Because of that, He did not actually owe the temple tax.

But Jesus did not want to create unnecessary conflict or offense, so He chose to pay it anyway. Then Jesus gave Peter very unusual instructions: *“Go to the sea and throw in a line. Catch the first fish you find. When you open its mouth, you will find a coin. Take it and use it to pay My tax and yours.”*

No savings plan. No borrowing money. No asking the other disciples for help. Just go fishing. And not for dinner — for a tax payment. Jesus knew exactly where the money was. He did not guess. He did not hope a miracle might happen. He already knew the coin was inside the fish. That teaches us something important: nothing we need is hidden from God. He knows where the help is, where the answers are, and how things will work out.

Even when it feels like there is no money, no opportunity, and no solution, God is not worried. The coin was already there before Peter ever picked up the fishing line. *In the same way, your answer may already exist — it just has not appeared yet.*

But notice this: the money did not come until Peter obeyed. He had to do something that made very little sense. Fishing with one line and expecting money instead of fish required trust. God did not explain every detail. He simply asked Peter to obey.



There is another beautiful detail in the story: the coin was exactly enough to pay both taxes. Not more. Not less. God provided exactly what was needed at exactly the right time. God's provision is often like that — simple, timely, and enough.

Today, many people worry about bills, rent, groceries, and the future. This story reminds us of several important truths:

- God already knows what you need.
- God already knows where the answer is.
- God is not limited to normal methods.
- God responds to trust and obedience.

Your coin may not be in a fish's mouth — and that is probably a good thing. But it is not lost. God has not forgotten it. So, when you feel stressed or afraid about money or problems, remember this story: God knows where your coins are even before you cast the line.

ANXIETY & DEPRESSION RECOVERY PROGRAM

AT BOUCTOUCHE SDA COMPANY

Mental health problems are common and are growing, especially among young people and women.

Depression is one of the most common mental illnesses, and about five percent of adults worldwide have trouble with its symptoms. It is a serious medical condition that changes how a person feels, acts, and thinks. The rise in depression among youth in Canada is a significant concern.

According to the *2022 Mental Health and Access to Care Survey* 18.3% of Canadians aged 15 years and older met diagnostic criteria for a mood, anxiety, or substance use disorder. The *2023 Canadian Health Survey on Children and Youth* reported that 26% of youth aged 16 to 21 years rated their mental health as “fair” or “poor” compared to 12% in 2019. Because getting care is difficult, early help and support tools are very important to attain better mental health for individuals of all ages.

We decided to host Dr. Neil Nedley's *Depression and Anxiety Recovery Program* after seeing how many people in our community struggle with mental health. This program lasts eight weeks with a one-hour presentation each week. It helps participants to learn about the causes of depression and anxiety, teaches practical ways to cope, and suggests lifestyle changes to improve mental health. Dr. Nedley's solutions for restoring your life are grounded in creation-originated principles, biblical teachings, and divinely inspired revelations. The program helps people understand how our thoughts, nutrition, sleep, and many other facets of daily life directly shape brain function and therefore determine whether we thrive or falter in our personal mental health.

Our community members who have participated during the last four weeks have said that they are very satisfied and have enjoyed the weekly presentations. They talked about the new knowledge they have gained and the changes they can make in their daily life to improve their mental health. Dr. Nedley has helped thousands break free from depression and anxiety and regain a normal life through his program. With the worldwide mental health crisis, this program is a great tool churches could use to help their communities.
