In 2023, we celebrated our organization's 40th anniversary. As the year ended, I had the great honor of touring the daughter and granddaughter of our founder, Eleanor Fletcher, around our newly expanded campus. It was humbling how impressed they were with how we had built upon Eleanor's vision, truly growing the facility into a world-class destination. Strategically, we maintain Eleanor's core wish to provide the community with free access to environmental learning.

In fact, Loggerhead Marinelifelife Center ranked third in the entire country for Best Free Attraction in the prestigious *USA Today* 10Best Readers' Choice poll. A panel of travel industry experts submit nominees for these awards, then readers vote on the finalists. We competed against icons like Redwood National Park and Central Park. Not bad company!

Critical free access to our programs is only made possible through the incredible generosity of our donors and sponsors. Through door donation stations, visitors can easily give a cash or credit card donation to help support our work and free access for others. Personal and foundation giving came in at a historic high through our annual fund. This is a testament to the role we play in the community and the faith that you as donors and partners have in our mission. Thank you for that trust and support in the valuable work that we do. Each patient at our facility receives thousands of dollars of medical care and treatment. Since these turtles don't carry health insurance, the burden of that cost falls on us. All that we do for each of these turtles is made possible by our donors. In 2023, thanks to our dramatically expanded campus, we treated more turtles than ever before, releasing thousands of hatchlings and 85 older turtles back into our waters.

We marked our 40th anniversary with records set in all areas of the organization. Loggerhead Marinelife Center saw more than 310,000 guests in 2023, coupled with 116,000 that visited the Juno Beach Pier, which we manage. Our incredible boutique gift store had nearly \$4 million in sales and is a critical element to our financial security, as it takes the pressure off needing to sell tickets. We can truly say every turtle T-shirt and plush sold at the gift store helps the mission and helps save turtles. A record number of events occurred in our newly expanded event space that includes the Sky Deck, and our Education Programs engaged more than 97,000 students. Our Research Department monitored a record 25,025 nests on the 9.5 miles of beach that we oversee. Our conservation crew removed more than 5,000 pounds of marine debris.

Looking back at what this team has accomplished with the support of our community is truly incredible. This is an exceptional team of paid staff at all levels. We have more than 400 volunteer staff that contributed over 40,000 service hours in all areas of our operation. We also have a committed and dedicated board that gives financially and actively participates.

This year, we completed our strategic blueprint that maps the course of our growth for the next five years. This growth will expand our role in ocean conservation, as well as support causes critical to sea turtle protection through issue-based advocacy. The future looks very bright thanks to your support.

ANIMAL CARE IS PRIORITY ONE

Excellence in animal care is the top priority for staff at Loggerhead Marineline Center (LMC) – from the sea turtle rehabilitation hospital to the Animal Husbandry Department. Last year (2023) was a banner year for the hospital team that treated 2,593 sea turtles of all life-stage classes. These sea turtles represented all five species typically found in the waters of the Atlantic Ocean of the U.S., including loggerheads, green turtles, leatherbacks, hawksbills, and Kemp’s ridleys. Of these turtles, 213 were juveniles up to adults, and 2,380 were hatchlings. The newly expanded campus allowed for this large patient load that saw an amazing 72% survival rate, which is higher than rehabilitation norms across species.

On December 5, 2023, 13 cold-stunned Kemp’s ridleys were transferred from the

New England Aquarium to LMC for care. All were successfully rehabilitated and released at Cape Canaveral. The creation of a new intensive care unit that allows neonates and critically ill patients to have a quiet, climate-controlled environment is key to this success.

While LMC specializes in sea turtles, the animal husbandry team cares for the complex life support systems that filter and clean the turtle hospital tanks and the aquarium exhibits. These habitats replicate Florida’s coastal ecosystem featuring fishes and aquatic invertebrates. Excellence in animal care is a focus for this team that monitors diets, water quality, and system operation for animals ranging from moon jellies to porcupine pufferfish. This year saw the opening of the Invasive Species Exhibit

featuring red lionfish, a species not native to local waters, but having negative impacts on the food chain.

As an aquatic veterinarian, Chief Science Officer and Head Veterinarian, Dr. Heather Barron, must manage multiple species. While she is a master at identifying any potential issues in a lined seahorse, she truly shines in sea turtle diagnostics and treatment. This year, 68 lifesaving surgical procedures were performed on our sea turtle patients. Within the year, we performed 22 CT scans at **Jupiter Medical Center**, prompting a gift by the **Glenn W. Bailey Foundation** to purchase our own CT machine to be installed in the 2024 hospital renovation.



SCIENCE SUCCESS



The record-breaking Florida sea turtle nesting season garnered news headlines across the globe. LMC was front and center to one of the busiest nesting areas in the state, pushing cutting-edge science. The season ended with an incredible 25,025 nests. Each one of these critical nests laid by threatened and endangered sea turtles was counted, identified to species, and generated critical scientific data such as nest temperatures and reproductive output. Dr. Justin Perrault, Vice President of Research for LMC, attributes the record-breaking year in part to ocean conservation efforts coming to fruition that have been practiced for decades.

During the nesting season, the LMC Research Department satellite tagged 11 nesting loggerheads and 20 nesting leatherbacks. Several leatherbacks headed

north – all the way to the waters of Canada, reaching Newfoundland and the Gulf of St. Lawrence south of Quebec. One leatherback named Zoey, tagged in 2022, transmitted for 534 days, and another named Domino, missed the all-time diving depth record for the species by a mere 336 feet, reaching 3,669 feet.

At LMC, science transcends departments. In the hospital, a loggerhead patient named Rocky was treated using a novel veterinary technique, blood patch pleurodesis, which helped repair torn lung tissue with clotting from red blood cells infused to the location.

Dr. Barron co-authored four papers, collaborated with several other veterinarians on numerous studies, and presented at leading veterinary conferences across the nation.

Despite the round-the-clock operation from late February through October, the Research Department published six scientific manuscripts on topics ranging from shark predation on sea turtles to the effects of lighting on sea turtle hatchlings and contaminant exposure. Loggerhead sea turtle tagging work is helping drive industry knowledge on clutch frequency (the number of nests laid by one turtle in a single nesting season) for the species, which highlighted an average of 6.4 nests per turtle. The team is now collaborating with the Conservation Department to extrapolate the data from our Responsible Pier Initiative to publish the successes of that program.

CULTURE OF CONSERVATION

Conservation pervades all that we do at LMC – from rehabilitating sea turtles, to researching the effects of plastics on marine ecosystems, to educating local youth on how to fish sustainably. While ocean conservation is at the core of everything we do, the Conservation Department has been focused on ways to mitigate human impact on sea turtles.

This year saw the growth of our Responsible Pier Initiative as it expanded to three piers in Port Aransas, Texas, growing the program to 74 participating piers. This program helps mitigate accidental entanglements of sea turtles and seabirds, leading to successful sea rescues.

Sea turtles are at risk of boat strikes during nesting season. Understanding that many of our sea turtle patients come into the hospital with boat-inflicted injuries, the Sea Turtle Protection Zone (STPZ) partnership that we are a part of helps educate boaters on ways they can minimize boat strikes on sea turtles, such as lowering speed within

a mile from shore and wearing polarized sunglasses. Ten new community partners were added this year to the STPZ, along with an extension of the program to the southern edge of Palm Beach County, and outreach at numerous community events.

Juno Beach remains clean of debris thanks to LMC's marine debris efforts. The Conservation Department led 131 beach cleanups in 2023, engaging more than 4,750 local volunteers. Approximately 5,000+ pounds of marine debris were removed from local beaches, equaling more than one pound per volunteer. LMC's Conservation Manager, Valerie Nicole Tovar, indicated that one of the most frequent items found during our beach cleanups was bottle caps.

Plastics are impacting sea turtles in various ways from ingestion and entanglement, to the presence of contaminants in the bloodstream and eggs. Conservation is at the root of our work and our scientific studies. Our research looks for the presence of chemical plasticizers in the blood, eggs,

and internal organs of nesting and stranded leatherbacks, loggerheads, and green turtles, and found that these chemicals were present, often in high concentrations, in most tissues. This work has significant One Health implications, as it suggests the ocean environment, including the seafood that sea turtles and humans eat, is contaminated with chemicals known to have negative health effects.

BOTH AN ATTRACTION AND AN INITIATIVE

Juno Beach Pier, managed by LMC, is a bucket list attraction for Palm Beach County tourists and a daily destination for residents. In 2023, visitors totaled 116,445. The pier is the flagship location for LMC's Responsible Pier Initiative (RPI).

ELEVATING EDUCATION

Through a full menu of educational experiences for kids, and kids at heart, we engaged 97,263 students last year. This ranged from hands-on experiences like Junior Vet Lab, to the monthly By the Sea Lecture series in our Gordon & Patricia Gray Auditorium, featuring marine scientists, conservationists, and artists. The Oceans of Opportunity Initiative reaches students who do not have access to quality ocean education. The Education Department, led by Vice President, Hannah Campbell, managed to provide field trip scholarships to 3,000 Title I students, and served 2,526 individuals through Driving Ocean Connections, which is provided to K-5 Title I students in after-school programming.

While LMC is known for its traditional education opportunities, the hospital, under Dr. Barron's guidance, continues to mentor and train the next generation of wildlife veterinarians. There were 17 externs, including veterinary medical school, undergraduate, and veterinary technician students, who learned key skills during their time with the LMC hospital. We consider our local nesting beaches as an outdoor laboratory. The Research Department also serves as a global hub for students. The team trained and assisted five Ph.D. students in the field to complete their projects.



Innovation abounded across campus to highlight learning in all forms. Sensory Saturdays provided access before open hours to individuals sensitive to noise, lighting, or crowd stimulus. American Sign Language (ASL) tours have increased through our Field Operations Manager, Jennifer Reilly, and interpretation has been integrated into events on campus. Self-guided audio tours are available through rentable headsets in both English and Spanish.

Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) became a partner in education supporting our 28-passenger, ADA-accessible bus used to transport camp participants to coastal experiences. Engaging partnerships like the one with FPL allowed LMC to extend its reach both on-site and off-campus. From kids getting wet and sandy during camp to ocean literacy workshops for Palm Beach County STEM educators, there is something here for everyone.



DONOR SUPPORT MAKES THE DIFFERENCE



The work highlighted in the four pillar areas of Rehabilitation, Research, Conservation, and Education would not have been possible without the generosity of our incredible donors and sponsors. When philanthropist Gordon Gray founded the Circle of 100 in 2012, he envisioned a robust group of like-minded donors whose passion for our mission could help LMC become a global leading authority on sea turtles. Today, the Gordon Gray Circle of 100 includes more than 200 members, with nearly half contributing more than \$10,000 annually. This steadfast commitment to the annual fund ensures that LMC hires and retains world-class staff, covers the overhead for the

complex life support systems for turtles and fishes, provides top-notch veterinary care, and so much more!

In 2023, our team continued its progress obtaining critical funding for projects – opening in 2024 – to improve the Center. Numerous individuals and foundations contributed to this effort. The **Frank Dimino Foundation** supported the River to Reef Playscape, which is an exciting, new addition being installed in the **Jen and Bob Male Children’s Play Area**. The **Morse Hill Foundation** supported the installation of a 360-degree, underwater camera for the Juno Beach Pier. The **Henry Foundation, Curtis and Edith Munson Foundation**, and the

Ann Petersen Family contributed matching gifts to add exhibits to the Welcome Center. This represents just a sample of the generosity of those who believe in advancing LMC’s mission. We truly appreciate their commitment.

Critical support came from our partners and event sponsors. The **Marine Industries Association of Palm Beach County** collaborates with us to support several programs across the organization. **Tampa General Hospital, TBC Corporation, Northern Trust**, and others have been vital to the support of our best-in-class events ranging from the Circle of 100 Dinner to TurtleFest to Go Blue.

SUSTAINING FREE ACCESS

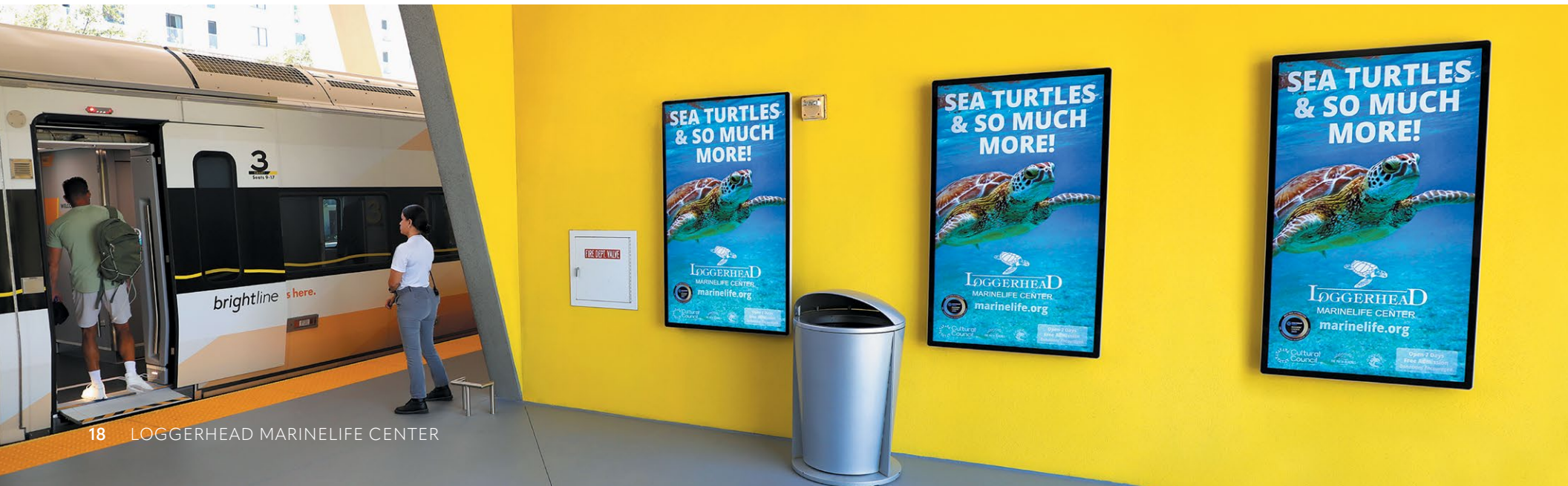


Loggerhead Marinelifelife Center ranked No. 3 in the *USA Today* 10Best Readers' Choice poll for Best Free Attraction. Industry leaders select the nominees, then readers cast their votes. A prestigious ranking, LMC beat out the Golden Gate Bridge and the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, and other government-funded attractions.

Although we use the term donation-based, the goal is the same – provide access to ocean education and face-to-face encounters with sea turtles and other marine life to all. LMC deploys

a unique model that blends door donations and retail revenue from its world-class boutique gift store to cover a significant portion of its annual operating costs.

LMC had an all-time attendance record of 310,000 visitors in 2023, with more than 116,000 additional visitors to the Juno Beach Pier. Moved by our mission, visitors contributed \$800,000 in donations at our Welcome Center. Increased marketing efforts, including Brightline station takeovers, have helped attract new visitors.



Working in tandem with door donations, the gift store generated nearly \$4 million in gross sales. At LMC, every purchase of a plush sea turtle, stylish T-shirt, or home décor piece, helps fund the work that we do. The gift store also supports local artisans, offering selections not found in other stores. Shoppers embrace the work of artists Claudia Hafner and Kelley Tracht, whose art is available on items from mugs to luggage tags. LMC's Vice President of Retail, Kate Fratalia, has an eye for what sells and what stands out. For the first time, LMC has an artist in residence, Deano Cook, whose oil paintings and photography are available in the gift store and during pop-up events.

As in other areas of the operation, partnership is key. For example, the Retail Department expanded collaborations with Els for Autism and The Arc of Palm Beach County. Both programs provide the gift store with beautifully crafted items that represent our mission and our region.

Within the industry, we monitor two common data points: per-person spending and an average sale. Per-person spending has been as high as \$13, an incredible number compared to similar facilities. The average gift store purchase is \$40, another glowing metric. This strategy allows us to direct revenue back into the operation, while maintaining free access to those that need it.



CELEBRATIONS FOR THE TURTLES



Our newly expanded, state-of-the-art campus can now host events, yet another avenue to support free access to LMC visitors. Whether a wedding, corporate luncheon, or a celebration of life, individuals select LMC as a sustainable and mission-friendly location. Just as every turtle sundress sold at the gift store helps support our mission, so does each event we host. The new event space consists of a ballroom and the Ocean View Sky Deck, which offers a beautiful view of Juno Beach.

In 2023, LMC hosted 55 external events attended by more than 5,000 guests, many of whom were introduced for the first time to LMC and our work. The Events Department was proud to have an 80% booking rate and raised \$270,000 in rental revenue. In addition, LMC was recognized as a premier wedding venue in the 2023 Couples' Choice Awards by WeddingWire.com.

We pair our world-class location and service with a focus on sustainability. LMC partners with local caterers who exceed the sustainability mandate in every area – from lack of single-use plastics to seafood choices. To promote our sustainability efforts further, we launched a sustainable wedding giveaway valued at \$45,000. More than 100 couples applied, and the story of the winning couple's wedding was featured in numerous media outlets.

Each year, LMC hosts its own community events and celebrations. The biggest annual event was TurtleFest, which kicked off sea turtle nesting season. Attended by more than 10,000 people, TurtleFest featured live music, vendors, food, and kids' activities. In addition, Run 4 The Sea, the Go Blue Awards, and the Golf Invitational rounded out the year's events. Combined, they raised \$687,419 in funding to help sustain LMC's mission.

A key gateway of engagement is the Blue Friends Society. In 2023, the group celebrated 15 years of supporting LMC. At 400 members strong, their goal is to bring families and individuals together through eco-friendly social events that benefit LMC. The Blue Friends coordinate and host the weekly Saturday morning beach cleanups sponsored by **Carrier**. In total, 3,680 community volunteers removed 2,300 pounds of trash. The Blue Friends also hosted Sprinkles for the Sea, an event for families, and the Summer Solstice Soirée at the Center. **Key Bank** is the annual Blue Friends Social Sponsor, ensuring money raised during events goes toward supporting LMC's mission.



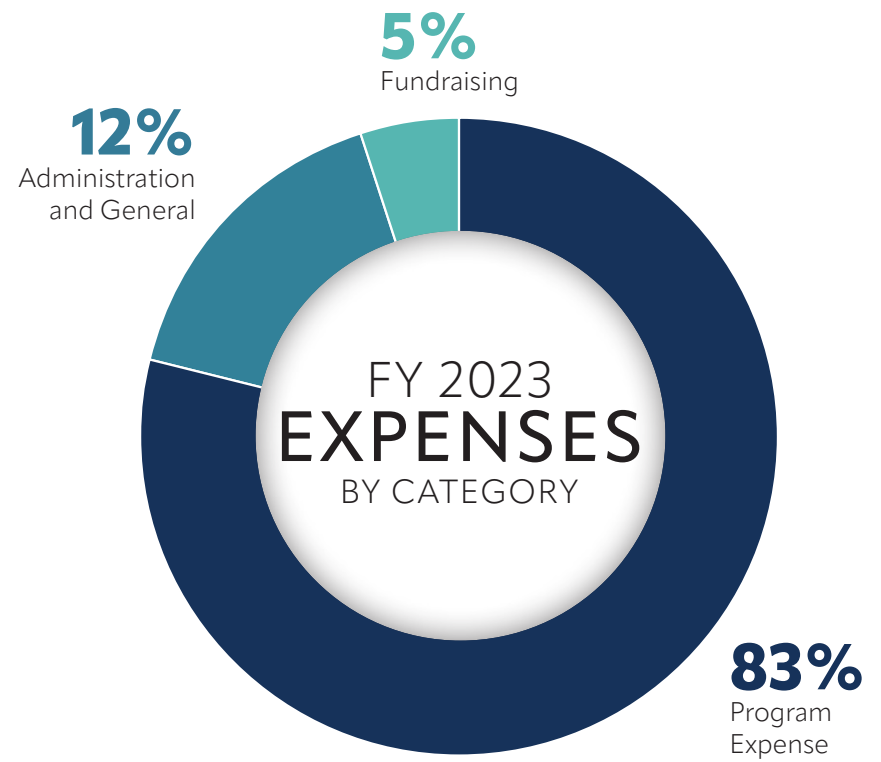
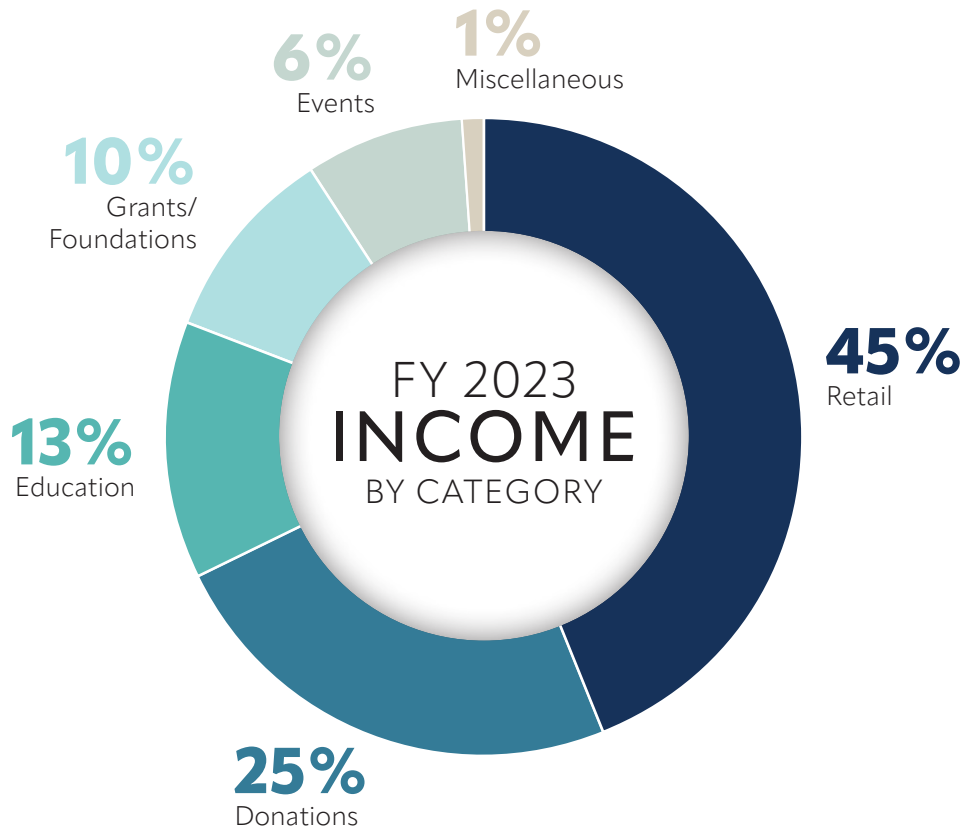
FINANCIAL SECURITY

MAPPING THE FUTURE

In 2023, LMC embarked on an all-encompassing strategic planning initiative to advance its mission to promote conservation of ocean ecosystems, with a special focus on threatened and endangered sea turtles. The resulting strategic blueprint, summarized below, will guide LMC over the next five years to achieve its vision of becoming a leading authority locally and internationally in ocean conservation via sea turtle rehabilitation, research, and educational programs.

LMC will expand and strengthen the areas of Rehabilitation, Research, and Education. A full renovation of the **Gordon & Patricia Gray Family Hospital** and **George & Lynn Bovenizer Research Laboratory** will facilitate program improvements in these areas. The Education Department will broaden its program offerings and outreach, particularly for Title I schools, while also developing a floating classroom in the form of an ADA-compliant boat for on-water programs.

We will grow and develop four program areas, with a large focus on Conservation and Advocacy. Sea turtles are inextricably linked to the health of our marine ecosystems. In the next five years, LMC will explore programs and enter partnerships to address

coastal ecosystem restoration and water quality. True to its mission, LMC will undertake a thoughtful and deliberate process to advocate for relevant emerging policies. This new effort will focus on protection status of sea turtles, water quality issues, and the ecosystem. Like the conservation space, LMC will look to build strong partnerships in these arenas, acknowledging that many voices are better than one.

As operational and financial demands grow, another area of strategic focus is financial security, both annually and long term. Operating finances will enhance revenue streams to maintain the donor-based admission model. To ensure its ability to withstand adverse conditions and provide long-term stability, LMC will develop endowments for operations and key positions. Building on the success of its Waves of Progress Campaign, LMC will seek to fund several key initiatives such as exhibit upgrades and a new seawater pumping system.

The future of our organization is bright with a talented staff and passionate support from our board members and volunteers. LMC's strategic blueprint provides the focus for our growth.

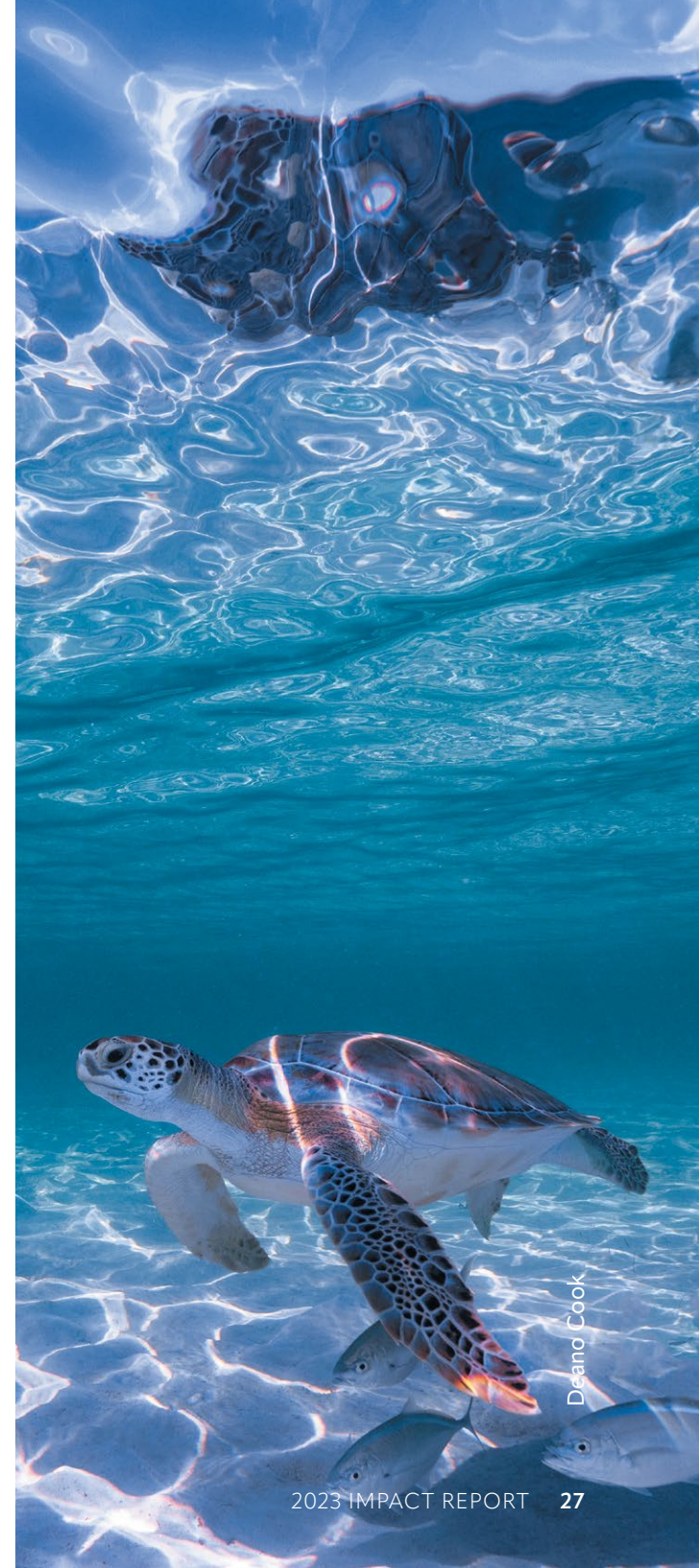
