



Leadership of Phonics & Early Reading

Audience

Phonics and Early Years Leaders in schools

Description

This is an opportunity for schools to 'Aim Higher' and further close the gap to national average in phonics by the end of Year 1. Or to 'Aim High' by improving and sustaining Y1 phonics outcomes of above 85% and above 90%. Meetings will focus on identifying key actions to support the leadership of phonics and how teaching, assessment and monitoring can be further improved. They will also look at how children's growing phonics knowledge can be used to build fluency and the enjoyment of early reading.

The first meeting will be led by Manjit Nandhra, New Wave English Hub Lead. An invitation to join this meeting will also be extended to the Headteacher (or Senior Leader). This will provide an opportunity for EYFS and Reading/Phonics Leaders to share their visions for improving phonics outcomes; set clear objectives on their action plans that directly link to the School Development Plan and place the development of early reading at the heart of their leadership role.

Time will be spent in the final meeting to analyse and review outcomes and plan further actions for the forthcoming year.

Experienced and successful Phonics Leaders and Phonics Champions, who have led improvement in their own schools, will also contribute to these meetings.

Aims

- To share good and outstanding practice linked to phonics and the development of early reading
- To support leaders in developing a successful and succinct action plan
- To support further development of teaching, learning and assessment in phonics and its application to reading
- To support leaders in developing an enriched reading environment
- To support leaders in enabling high proportions of pupils to achieve in phonics by the end of Y1 and reach the end of KS1 expectations in reading.

Outline

Each session will focus on:

- · Reviewing and refining current action plans
- Reviewing assessment outcomes and actions to further support learning and teaching
- Discussion around establishing provision to promote enjoyment for reading
- Sharing good/outstanding local practice

Reading Buddy Training



What is a Reading Buddy?

- A Reading Buddy is a volunteer who reads with children regularly on a one-to-one basis in a school, helping to develop enjoyment of reading
- As a Reading Buddy you will work with children each week
- No previous experience is necessary as training will be given
- All you need is patience and enthusiasm

What do Reading Buddies and children think?

"Reading with a Reading Buddy is so much fun. My Reading Buddy is very kind and if I get stuck on a word she helps me work it out."

What will it involve?

- Reading Buddies will need to be able to commit to an hour each week for at least one school term
- You will work with children to develop their confidence to read and discuss a book, either in English or their home language
- You will support children in their reading and spend time discussing the story to develop their wider understanding
- You will need to agree to the school's volunteer policy



Understanding end of KS1 expectations in Reading, Writing & Maths

Audience

Year 2 Teachers including those new to Year 2 or ECTs

Aims

- To become familiar with the non-statutory teacher assessment framework statements at the end of Year 2
- To explore the 2018/19 nationally developed exemplification materials for each performance descriptor at the end of KS1
- To support Year 2 teachers in further developing impact on learning and teaching
- To ensure long and medium term plans are tailored to enable children to meet the expected standard or beyond

Outline

Reading Session (October):






