



FA BALANCE CALL HITS SHEFFIELD

FC

Sheffield FC have lost their FA appeal after league bosses prioritised keeping divisions even over travel and local rivalries.

The world's oldest club will now play in the United Counties League Premier Division North next season after the decision was upheld in full.

The FA Appeal Board ruled that maintaining balanced league sizes across the National League System was the key factor in the move.

Club officials argued the switch would increase travel and cost them important local fixtures, including matches against Handsworth.

But the Board found the FA's decision was reasonable, stressing it must act for the benefit of the whole pyramid rather than any single club. The appeal was dismissed on all grounds, with Sheffield FC also losing their appeal fee.

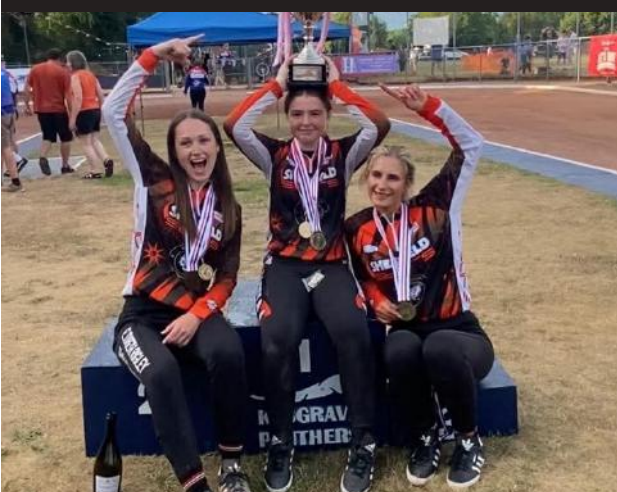

NON LEAGUE ROUND UP

Walton steps aside at Welfare

Armthorpe Welfare have confirmed a major change ahead of the 2026/27 season with Brad Walton stepping down as first-team manager following a campaign that delivered clear progress on the pitch.

Walton guided The Wellie to a 7th-place finish in Northern Counties East League Division One in 2025/26, with the club collecting over 70 points across the campaign and ending in the top third of the table.

That outcome represented a significant step forward when compared to the previous season, when Armthorpe had finished 13th in the same division, underlining the club described last season as “memorable”, with Welfare winning more than half of their matches during key spells and establishing a strong attacking return, scoring at better than two goals per game. [Notable results along the way, including a high-scoring 8-1 away victory at Glasshoughton Welfare and a number of eye-catching wins against promotion-chasing sides.

While Walton will now step back from the dugout, his continued presence at the club is not new. He has already been involved in off-field roles within the Armthorpe setup, including

administrative and committee work, suggesting this move is as much a repositioning as a departure.

Armthorpe have opted for a familiar and internal solution in naming his successors, with Danny Charlotte and Lee Joynt appointed as joint managers for the upcoming campaign.

Both figures are well known at the Marra Falcons Stadium and have strong ties to the current squad. The Charlotte name is already prominent within the playing group, with multiple family members representing the club during the 2025/26 season, pointing to a deep-rooted connection and knowledge of the squad dynamics.

Joynt, meanwhile, is another figure with established links to non-league football in the region and previous management involvement. He has been part of coaching setups elsewhere, having prior experience working together in a first-team management setup at Kellingley Welfare in the West Yorkshire League.

Their appointment reflects a clear emphasis on continuity rather than wholesale change, with both individuals already embedded in the club's structure. The duo inherit a side that showed genu-

ine signs of development last term. Armthorpe combined improved results with attacking intent but will be targeting greater consistency after an otherwise strong campaign was punctuated by occasional heavy defeats.

Walton's continued involvement behind the scenes should help provide stability during the transition, while Charlotte and Joynt will be tasked with building on the foundations laid over the past 12 months.

Both the Northern Counties East League and the United Counties League hold their Annual General Meetings this Saturday (20 June), where the final league structures for the 2026/27 season will be formally confirmed following last month's FA allocations.

Alongside ratifying divisions, the meetings will cover the usual off-field business including any rule amendments, administrative updates, and confirmation of promotion and relegation outcomes ahead of the new campaign.

With structures in place, attention will quickly turn to fixtures. Early-round schedules for both leagues are expected to be released before the end of the month, although full fixture lists will once again be delayed slightly.

That is largely due to ground-sharing arrangements involving a small number of clubs, requiring coordination across leagues.

The Northern Premier League also stages its AGM this weekend and, as in recent seasons, their campaign will begin on Saturday 8 August—two weeks after the Step 5 and 6 leagues get under way.

Their fixture release is likely to follow the established pattern, with dates expected after the National League publishes its schedule on Friday 10 July, ensuring alignment across the pyramid and avoiding clashes where clubs share facilities.

Meanwhile, all local sides have already returned to pre-season training as preparations intensify ahead of the new season. The formal player registration process is due to open shortly, although many clubs have wasted no time in confirming retained players alongside new additions.

There has already been a steady flow of announcements across social media, and that is expected to accelerate in the coming weeks.

A full breakdown of squad changes across the region will appear in our annual season preview edition, which will be published on Friday 24 July (note a day later than usual).

More Mont names revealed daily

The build-up to the 2026/27 Montagu Cup continues to gather momentum as organisers drip-feed further entrants following last week's opening announcements.

After the initial batch introduced a strong foundation—featuring holders Wickersley CC, former winners Westville and consistent performers like Brinsworth DC—the latest names add even greater depth and variety to this year's line-up.

Swinton Sportsbox are among the newest to be confirmed as they return for a second season in the competition under their new identity, formerly The Gym Bar FC. Runners-up in both the Mexborough Sunday League and Challenge Cup, they will be eager to build on last year's experience after falling to eventual winners Wickersley in the first round.

Another fresh face comes in the form of Scawthorpe Herons, whose first team make their Mont debut after an impressive rise through the Doncaster Sunday League. A fourth-place finish in their first Premier Divi-



sion campaign highlights their rapid progress.

Thorpe Hesley Village are back for a third attempt after a solid sixth-place finish in the RDSL Premier Division, where they produced a number of eye-catching results and continued their steady development at that level.

There is no shortage of pedigree among the new confirmations. AFP Pewter Pot extend their long-standing association with the competition into a 15th consecutive season. Four-time winners during a dominant spell in the mid-2010s, they will

been to make amends for last year's early exit despite another strong league campaign.

Wombwell Main bring further history, with seven Montagu Cup titles placing them joint second on the all-time list. Although their recent season in the County Senior League was inconsistent, their experience in knockout football makes them a dangerous addition.

Club Dearne's development side also return after an impressive debut season in the County Senior League that ended in promotion. Having already

reached a Mont quarter-final in 2024/25, they continue to show clear upward momentum.

Barnsley Sunday League champions AFC Pogmoor enter for the first time following an unbeaten league-winning campaign. They will be one of several sides looking to carry domestic success into the Mont arena.

Barnburgh WMC are another new name, stepping into open-age football together after progressing through junior ranks. They will hope to echo historic success associated with the Barnburgh name in the competition.

The Cottage FC return to the Mont for the first time since 2020/21, bringing experience as a long-established Sunday League club after a steady season in the Barnsley Premier Division.

Earlier in the week, last season's finalists and winners were also confirmed. The Gate Inn arrive after a superb campaign that saw them lift the RDSL Premier Division and Brian Beeley KO Cup, while Wickersley CC return aiming to become only the second side in 12 years to retain the trophy.

Hickleton Harriers

are also back for a second attempt following a promising debut that included a notable victory over RDSL opposition en route to the last 16.

When combined with last week's first reveals—including Whiston, Deer Park Tap, Denaby United Sunday, FC Mailcoach and debutants Loca FC and Doncaster City U23s—the field is already shaping up to be one of the strongest in recent memory.

More entrants are expected to be announced in the coming days as the countdown to another summer of Montagu Cup action continues across South Yorkshire.

WHY NUMBERS FORCED SHEFFIELD FC MOVE

Sheffield FC's appeal against their switch to the United Counties League has been dismissed after the FA ruled the move was necessary to prevent an imbalance in league numbers.

The world's oldest club will now compete in the United Counties League Premier Division North for 2026/27 after the Appeal Board rejected all four grounds of appeal.

At the centre of the case was a numbers issue across Step 5.

The Northern Counties East League is

set to run with 20 clubs, while the United Counties League Premier Division North will operate with 18.

The FA faced a situation where alternative adjustments risked leaving divisions with uneven or odd numbers — something it tries to avoid across the National League System.

Sheffield FC argued they should remain in the Northern Counties East, highlighting increased travel, higher costs and the loss of local fixtures if moved.

They also questioned

why other clubs were not moved instead, particularly the two Retford sides, who they believed could have switched without the same impact.

But that option was examined and rejected.

The FA told the hearing that moving Sheffield FC instead of the Retford clubs avoided creating further imbalance, with the two Retford sides treated as a pair due to their close proximity. Sheffield argued that they could have been paired with a club such as Hands-

worth but this was rejected.

Crucially, the Board accepted that switching those clubs could have resulted in uneven divisions — effectively creating the kind of mismatch in numbers the FA was trying to prevent.

That made the issue less about geography and more about arithmetic.

The Board heard that allocations are only finalised after promotion, relegation and reprieve decisions, by which point options are li-

imited and any change can have knock-on effects elsewhere.

While the FA accepted there may have been a more geographically suitable solution for Sheffield FC when considered on its own, it argued decisions must work across the whole system.

The Appeal Board agreed.

Its role was not to decide the best placement, but whether the FA's decision was so unreasonable it should be overturned.

It ruled that thresh-

old had not been met.

In doing so, it also noted Sheffield FC's position on the edge of competing leagues, making them one of the clubs most likely to be moved when numbers need adjusting.

The outcome leaves Sheffield FC in a new division for the coming season — and underlines the reality of the allocation process.

When the numbers do not fit, keeping leagues balanced can take priority over geography, travel and local rivalries.

Rawmarsh Claim Historic West Shield After 56 Years



The West Shield was held aloft for the first time in 56 years as Rawmarsh Community School edged past the other five schools in the tightest of tournaments.

In 1922, the West Shield was donated by Goldthorpe Empire cinema owner Edwin West, just over half a mile from our hosts in 2026 - Astrea Academy Dearn.

The tournament was

organised on a league basis and, going into the fifth and final round of matches, each of the six schools had a chance of winning the West Shield.

A goal from Bentley Brown of Rawmarsh was enough to secure a 1-0 victory against Dearn. This proved the crucial goal as Rawmarsh leapfrogged St. Pius who finished with a goalless draw with Wath.

The last team to win the West Shield was Brampton Ellis in 1970. Their captain that day, Bob Mountain, was on hand to present the refurbished shield to Rawmarsh. Bob went on to have an outstanding non-League career after a brief spell with Huddersfield Town.

ing the competition and the driving force of Andy Scattergood for reviving this old competition.

One year after Edwin West donated the West Shield, the neighbouring cinema owner, Russell Totty started the Totty Cup which is still played for today.

The West Shield lasted until 1970 with Brampton Ellis beat Thurnscoe High 8-0.

The shield stayed at Brampton Ellis for over 50 years before teacher Andrew McCleavy passed it on to the Don & Dearn Schools FA in 2024

Local silversmith, Bob Lamb, restored the shield in his Sheffield workshop just before retiring in 2025 after 66 years in the industry.

The Don & Dearn schools has expanded

from two long-standing competitions (Totty Cup and Barlow-Salmons) to eight over the last few years. An extra two supplementary cups - Gordon Swann Cup and Brian Hyde Cup - our former referees. There are now three girls competitions (Don & Dearn, Karen Walker Shield and Winstanley Cup). The West Shield completes the list.



South Yorkshire duo honoured with MBEs

Two leading sports figures from South Yorkshire have been recognised in the King's Birthday Honours with MBEs for their outstanding contributions.

Doncaster's Richard Morris has been awarded an MBE for services to sport and

community development after decades of work growing participation and opportunity at grassroots level.

Morris, a well-known figure across the region, has played a key role in driving inclusive programmes, helping thou-

Powell and O’Hearne Take Sheffield Helm

Rotherham appeal against lateral transfer

Sheffield FC Women have announced the appointment of Martin Powell and Dan O’Hearne as their new management team ahead of the upcoming season in FA Women’s National League Division One Midlands.

Speaking on their appointment, Dan said: “From our initial conversations and then meeting the board, Martin and I were hugely impressed with the work that is going on behind the scenes off the pitch.

“In turn, we are working hard to build a successful squad in order to compete at the top end of the table on the pitch and are looking forward to the season ahead.”

Martin added: “Delighted to be here; it’s a huge opportunity that we couldn’t turn down. After hearing about the plans that the club has going forward, I’m genuinely excited to be involved and can’t wait to get back in the dugout with Dan.”

The pair worked together earlier this decade at Leeds United Women. Besides his stint at Leeds, O’Hearne previously managed Sheffield United for a few years last decade, and his most recent managerial experience in the FAWNL came at Barnsley Women FC a few years ago.

The club stated: “Everyone at Sheffield FC Women would like to extend a warm welcome to Martin and Dan. We look forward to supporting them as they lead the team into an exciting new chapter and work towards a successful season both on and off the pitch.”

Sheffield will be bidding to improve on last season’s sixth-place finish, which was very creditable for a side making its return to the FAWNL after one season in the East Midlands Regional League.

Meanwhile, as was to be expected, Rotherham United have submitted an appeal to be restored to the East Midlands Regional League after they were placed in the North East Regional League when the allocations for

tiers 1–6 of the women’s pyramid were announced a fortnight ago.

Speaking to the Rotherham Advertiser, club Chair Francesca Ross said: “The climate at the moment is that everything is costing more.

“Our training facilities are a big cost, as is the increased travel due to the change of league. That has time as well as cost implications because our players have jobs and other commitments.”

Had Rotherham remained in the East Midlands, they would have been in a ten-team Premier Division, which would have had just the one lengthy round trip, to Newport Pagnell.

The North East Premier Division has 12 teams, most of whom are very much north east. There are four games north of the River Tyne, with the furthest being Alnwick, approximately another 40 miles north after crossing the river. Going back some 30 years, that lengthy round trip was a cause for concern for Rotherham, who were then known as Kilnhurst, for the away fixture at Amble, just a few miles from Alnwick.

The article in the Rotherham Advertiser strongly hints at Rotherham folding if their appeal fails. The only other alternative would appear to be taking a voluntary relegation and dropping two tiers.

That would mean Rotherham being placed in the Sheffield & Hallamshire Women’s County League, where their Under-21s played last season. Potentially, the two may combine so that there is just one Rotherham team.

What does not aid Rotherham’s cause in this matter is that it does not have any youth teams under its name. Also, Parkgate, who had an Under-18s team in the Girls League last season, now has an open-age (adult) team entered for 2026–27, and several of their players appeared for both Parkgate on a Saturday (Girls) and Rotherham on a Sunday (Women).

For the moment, it is

a wait-and-see situation. All appeals to the initial allocation for tiers 1–6 are expected to be heard before the end of this month.

Although they have not issued any details relating to an appeal, I would expect Brunsmear Athletic to appeal against their initial North East placement and to be placed in the East Midlands instead.

Meanwhile, several players with local connections have received recognition for their endeavours last season by being placed in the respective FAWNL divisional teams, as voted for by the general public for the Since ’71 website.

With a maximum of two players from any one club permitted per submission, the Division One Midlands team featured Ocean Rolandsen (Barnsley Women), Becky Kendell (Sheffield FC), and former Barnsley and Doncaster Rovers Belles forward Emily Brett (now at Notts County). Peterborough United’s Evie Driscoll-King, who combined playing for

Posh with studying at the University of Sheffield and being a key player for the University Women’s team, made the cut as a substitute.

While the Belles suffered relegation from tier 4, three of their

former players found themselves in the Northern Premier Division (tier 3) team. They are Olivia Cook (Stoke City), Hope Knight (Hull City), and Georgia Marshall (Wolverhampton Wanderers).

The Division One North team featured a trio of players formerly at Barnsley – the Huddersfield Town pair of Bethan Davies and Laura Elford, plus Drew Greene (now at Leeds United).

Interview with Paul Billington

Banks, Bogus Test and CIA Plot Mystery

When it comes to stories, there aren't many bigger, or indeed stranger, than this.

With the 2026 World Cup well underway, our older readers will remember the first time Mexico hosted the tournament in 1970. It remains the only edition of the World Cup that England have entered as reigning champions, following our solitary success in 1966.

Four years later, the tournament saw a repeat of that final, with West Germany the opposition in the quarter-finals. However, on this occasion, the Three Lions were missing legendary goalkeeper Gordon Banks. That's a talking point in itself, but not enough to be spoken about 56 years later.

As the chair of the Yorkshire Tennis & Padel Federation, Paul Billington, tells us, the story lies in the reasoning behind his absence.

"At that time, Banks was by far the best goalkeeper in the world, acknowledged by everybody. In Mexico, the team were in the same hotel, eating the same food, but the one person who got severe food poisoning was Gordon Banks. This became world news because it meant he was unlikely to play against West Germany,

"England lost 3-2 in extra time, after being 2-0 up. The replacement goalkeeper for Banks was Chelsea's Peter Bonetti, who made two fairly major errors. On the front page of the Observer a couple of weeks ago, there was a story about the CIA being involved in poisoning Banks. When I met him, I asked him about that.

"He said that on the morning of the match, England manager Sir Alf Ramsey and trainer Les Cocker got him out of bed and took him down to the hotel car park. They said we're



going to give you a fitness test, to a tree in the car park about 20 feet away. He ambled over, walked back, and Alf Ramsey said, 'That's brilliant, you're playing.'

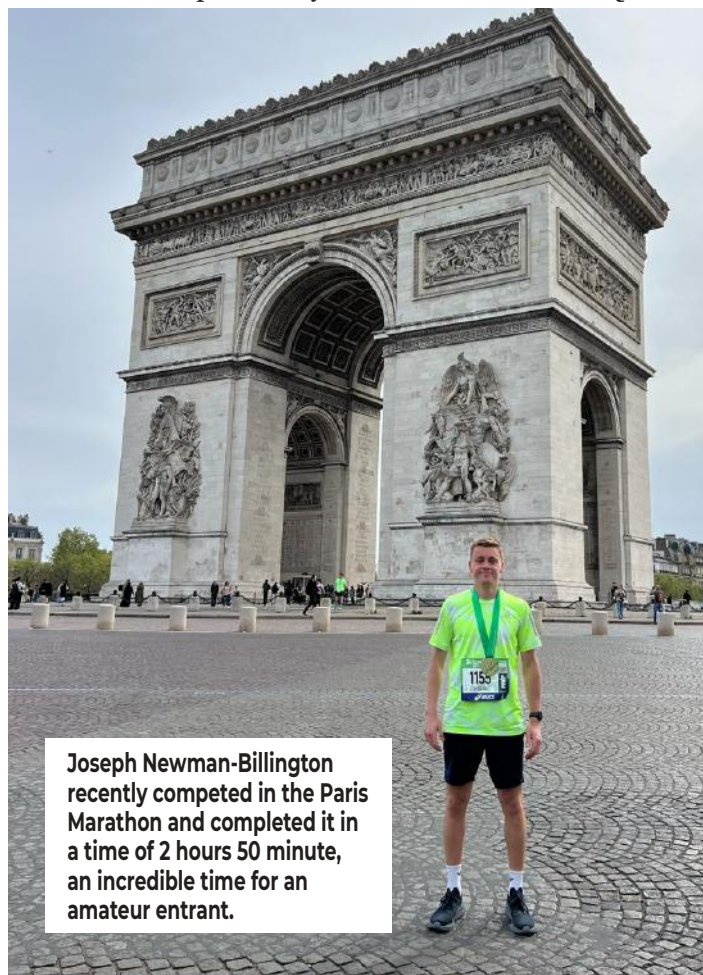
"It was only 10 minutes before kick-off, when he was so sick that he could not stand up in the changing rooms, that he couldn't play."

By modern-day standards, that's barely believable. As mentioned, Banks has been back in the news following an investigation by journalist Ed Jervis into a theory that he was poisoned by the CIA. This week, Jervis held a Q&A at Stoke City's bet365

Stadium to speak about his three-year quest to reveal the truth in this barely believable tale.

Billington met the former Stoke City goalkeeper as part of his work for Sheffield City Council, as he was involved in England's efforts to host the 2018 World Cup. While the tournament was eventually awarded to Russia, the process was a memorable one regardless of the outcome.

"I worked for the council for many years, always in sport, in different roles. But for the last dozen years, I was the Director of Parks,

Sports and Culture. I was lucky enough to be involved in Sheffield's bid for England to host the 2018 World Cup.

"The FA invited cities to be part of their bid. In Sheffield, with two clubs, it was about which of those grounds would be included. Eventually, the decision was made that it would be Hillsborough.

"The main reason was that Bramall Lane is completely boxed in with housing on four sides. Whereas Hillsborough's got the park, and for a World Cup venue, they need space for fan parks, media zones, and catering."

"The highlight of the bidding process was that we got to meet Sir Bobby Charlton. We also contacted Banks, who was from Sheffield. He agreed to be an ambassador for Sheffield in our bid. You couldn't wish to have met a nicer, humbler person."

These days, Paul is chair of the Yorkshire Tennis & Padel Federation. While the former has been played in this country for well over a century, padel has a much fresher history on English soil. It has seen rapid acceleration in recent years, but its novelty hasn't worn off just yet.

"Padel has grown massively," Paul said. "It's been around in Spain and Mexico for many years, but has grown here in the last five years. It's absolutely rocketing. There are now a million people playing regularly.

"It feels like there's a new facility every week, because it's easier to play than tennis. First of all, the serve is underarm, rather than the complexity of a normal tennis serve, which takes years of coaching. But underarm, you

can do almost straight away.

"Secondly, unlike tennis, there's much more continuity because you've got the sidewalls to play off. And thirdly, it is almost entirely played in pairs. It's a very sociable game with a lower skill threshold."

Tennis runs deeply in the Billington blood, with Paul's two sons, Joseph & Reuben, heavily involved in the sport throughout their lives. It's something that makes their father a very proud man.

"We're lucky enough to live at Woodseats, so we've always been within a stone's throw of Graves Tennis and Leisure Centre. We were able to get our sons there on a Saturday morning. Proximity and access are things that I've always felt are critical to people taking part in sports.

"They're both hardworking, committed individuals who turned out to be pretty good tennis players. As Jack Nicklaus said, 'The more I practice, the luckier I am.'

"Joseph now works for the LTA (Lawn Tennis Association) after being the tennis manager at Graves. He studied at Loughborough University, and his current LTA role involves promoting participation in tennis by working alongside councils and operators.

"Reuben was working for Court-side, who run the council's parks tennis programme, including the facility at Hillsborough Park. He now works for Everyone Active, helping the least active communities in the city become more active."

Summer is always dominated by sport, and this year will be no different.

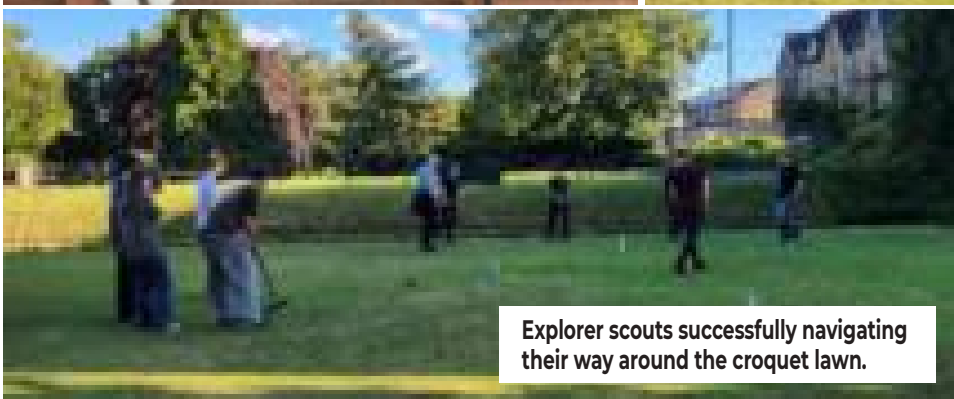

Sheffield Stars 50, Hull 60, Heckmondwike Saints 45.

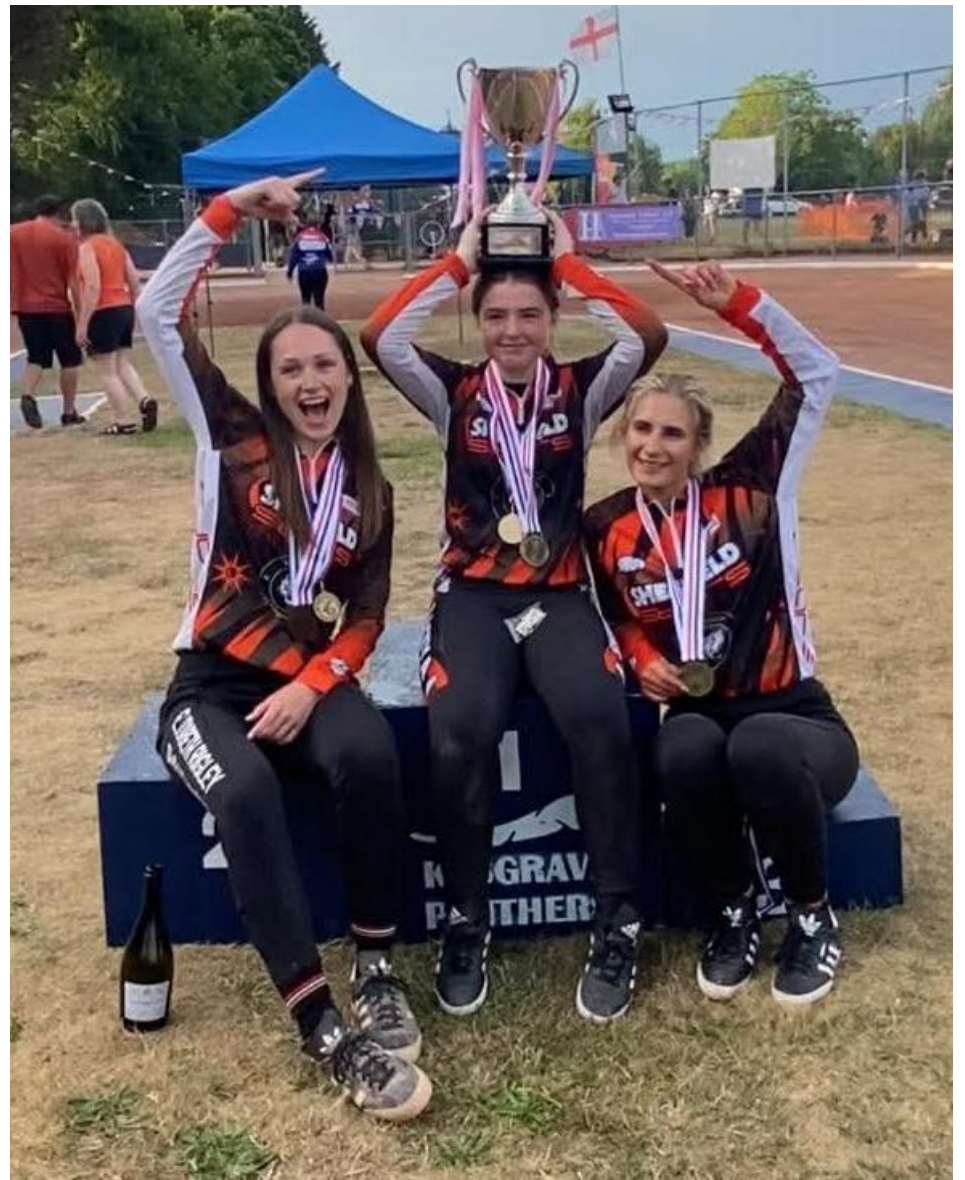
