

Toner leaves Belles

Doncaster Rovers Belles have confirmed they have parted ways with Manager Ciaran Toner.

In an official statement released by the club last Friday afternoon they stated:

"The Belles can confirm that Ciaran Toner has left his role as manager by mutual consent.

"First team matters will be overseen by Amanda Greenslade along with Debbie Barry and Lynn Goodman until the end of the season.

"All at the club thank Ciaran for the tremendous time and effort he has put into the role and wish him the very best for the future."

Appointed over a third of the way into the 2023-24 season, Toner took Belles from a position where the possibility of relegation was very real to narrowly failing to finish in the top half of the FA Women's National League Division One North table.

The transformation in Belles' fortunes last term was chiefly down to making the team near invincible at home where 8 games produced 6 wins and 2 draws with a scoring record of 17-4. Away from home, the 6 games played yielded just 4 points. However, the combined total of 24 points (from just 14 games remember) is

usually enough for a team to not have to worry about relegation in any of the FAWNL's six divisions where teams play 22 games. Belles also reached the County Cup final for the second successive season where they lost 3-2 to Huddersfield Town.

Ahead of the current campaign there was justified optimism for being in a comfortable mid-table position and with some astute signings, being able to flirt with the title chasers. My pre-season prediction for the title (and sole promotion place) was Middlesbrough who are second behind Cheadle Town Stingers on goal difference with each of the division's 12 teams having just two games to play.

Belles are currently second bottom, four points from safety and effectively needing a miracle to stay up.

Belles visit Middlesbrough this Sunday and end the season with a home game against Huddersfield. Middlesbrough have the division's best home record (unbeaten with 28 points from 10 games) and they need the points along with two high scoring wins if they are to guarantee finishing above Cheadle. Boro's solitary League defeat came when they crashed 3-0 away to Belles in November and Belles need a similar result

this Sunday.

Assuming Belles can conjure two wins from their two remaining games, they then have to rely on results elsewhere. Fortunately for Belles, six points will suffice if Norton & Stockton Ancients fail to add to their current tally of 20 points or if York City fail to record a victory in both their remaining games.

There have been too many games where they have been "Jekyll and Hyde" this season. Good enough in spells, but not making it count when on top, while defensively conceding goals in the latter stages of a game to drop crucial points.

Belles have just one clean sheet to date, ironically in the aforementioned victory over Middlesbrough. A month later in their defeat at Huddersfield, the defending was almost non-existent for Town's goals.

Player recruitment. This season's squad is effectively Toner's Belles. Players have left at various stages since last season. Some of this season's signings have come and gone.

Toner's team selections, along with formations, have come in for criticism, but far less than would surely be the case if it was Doncaster Rovers (men) getting similar results.

Even though Belles exited the County Cup to Huddersfield on penalties on Sunday, there has been a marked increase in positivity.

The parting of the ways has probably come too late to save Belles from relegation. If Amanda Greenslade can steer Belles to safety, she would deserve the "Manager of the Year" award.

Sheffield FC Relegated

Whilst looking inevitable for some time, the relegation of Sheffield FC was confirmed on Saturday with a 2-1 defeat at Pontefract Collieries. In a game that probably summed up a disappointing season, it was a performance of two halves with Club taking a 21st minute lead through Connor Cutts before being pegged back seven minutes later. The succumbed to a last minute goal to seal their fate.

They won't know what league they will be playing in next season until the FA placement system concludes at the end of May. It will be either the United Counties League or the Northern Counties East League.

Kiveton Park look favourite to take the County Senior League Division One title following a 2-1 victory over Sheffield Union. Kiveton leapfrog both Handsworth Reserves and Union to the top of the table. Kiveton, who lead the table by three points, travel to Athersley Recreation for their final game on Saturday, whilst Handworth, who have a 10 goal superior goal difference host Parkgate Reserves. Union have concluded their season and finish in a promotion place third.

In the Premier Division, Oughtibridge WM and Hemsworth Miners Welfare are battling it out for the title. Oughtibridge are three points ahead and travel to Penistone Church Reserves whilst Hemsworth will win the title if they win at Jubilee Sports and Oughtibridge lose.

Hallam FC - a COVID success story



success in three upcoming matches.

This remarkable turnaround has not occurred overnight; rather, it has been nearly a decade in the making, with an unexpected boost from the COVID pandemic. In 2016, the club's then-Chairman, Steve Basford, initiated a project known as "Target 200," aimed at increasing match attendance to an average of 200 spectators per game. To support this initiative, he enlisted volunteers with various skills to take on specific roles—those with bar experience managed the refreshments, individuals with strong customer service skills handled ticketing, and media-savvy volunteers took charge of the club's communications.

And that's where Ian Jones comes in. He started volunteering in 2018 and doubles up in the role of kitman as well as the media manager. He has a couple of helpers who give a hand with the social media side of the club.


lan explains "We reached the 200 target before COVID and, in fact, were averaging up to 250 and we felt we were going in the right direction, especially off the pitch. On the pitch wasn't going so well but there was an awful lot of good happening to get it off the ground and making sure the structure was right to get to where we are now."

COVID caused the 2019/20 season to be cut short but in May 2020, Hallam made an inspired decision to appoint Craig Denton as manager, He previously had huge success at Worksop Town and also a successful, albeit shorter period, as manager at Barton Town. Work commitments meant that Hallam was a perfect opportunity for him.

lan recalls "We have had good seasons before when Ryan Handley got us into the play-offs but it was a complete rebuild when Craig came in. I remember we had an open trials day at Sandygate when Craig first came in and we had 40 players turn up. I think only three players had been with us from the previous season."

The 2020/21 season was also curtailed by COVID but then success really took off on and off the pitch.

"COVID, as weird as it was, has probably been the best thing to happen to this football club," Ian explains. "The Government said people could go back to watch sport again but only at our level. The professional game could not have spectators and the likes of the semi-pro leagues such as the three divisions of the Conference and the Northern Premier League were still not able to play. They said our level was classed as amateur – people were bored, had nothing to do so they came to our games!



"We have a family friendly inclusive attitude to everyone that comes, you can stand with you mates; you can have a pint in the terrace.

"Obviously everybody wants us to win, but the people are coming just to enjoy a Saturday afternoon. As long as they've got some good football, the result is almost not relevant. We are getting a bigger fan base which has continued to grow."

Success on the field followed. In the first season back after COVID, Hallam stormed to the Northern Counties East Division One title with a record 102 points from 40 games scoring an amazing 146 goals and a positive goal difference of 103!

The following season they missed the Premier Division play-offs by a single point, and then last season, by their standards, finished a "disappointing" ninth. However, this was compensated by a run to the fifth round of the FA Vase (going out on penalties to Lincoln United), the farthest they have been in the competition since its introduction in 1974. "Without doubt, the on pitch success - which we couldn't have done without Craig and his team - has helped drive the growth," says lan.

This continued growth has brought with it its own problems off the pitch. But they are good problems to have.



lan explains "Richard (Pillinger) took over as Chairman at the end of COVID and he was keen to ensure we took advantage of the situation. We were able to get an awful lot of the local community who had never been to the ground involved. Some didn't even know we existed."

This last point is quite remarkable as anyone from Sheffield knows, the city has the World's oldest football club in Sheffield FC and the World's oldest football ground in Sandygate – and this is something that Hallam FC market exceptionally well.

lan continues: "It all just snowballed. We have people now having their kids as mascots, they buy merchandise and everyone keeps coming back. We have had three attendances this season of over 1,000. Our average League crowd is just under 600 – I think 'Target 200' has been smashed.

"A lot of money was spent on refurbishing the bar and the toilet facilities. But these were refurbished with 200 in mind – we have outgrown them so we are looking at how we can change and add with the new attendances. And if we are promoted again, this will bring with a whole heap of ground grading issues. It is good, though, and

something we will be embracing.

"We have developed good relationships with local companies. Our lads were training the other night and we arranged with a local pizza company to deliver pizzas after the session. We have promoted them across our social media channels and now our season ticket holders can also get a discount with them. It's all about the good relationships.

"We also have such a good atmosphere, we are competitively priced and people have realised that at £6 for adults and £4 for kids, you can come to a game, have a pint and food, drinks and food for the kids and stay behind for another drink after the game and still have change from what it would cost for the admission alone at a professional game."

One of those large crowds this season was the World's Oldest Derby when Hallam hosted Sheffield FC in the Quarter Final of the Senior Cup. In fact, it reignited the world's oldest game between two different clubs first played in 1860. 1,496 turned out to see the hosts win 2-1. It was the first time in over a decade the two have played each other with Sheffield having being a division higher since 2007.

There's a chance that the two may swap places next season with Sheffield FC being relegated from the Northern Premier League (although even if Hallam don't win their way through the play-offs they may still not play each other as there's a possibility that the FA may place Sheffield in to the United Counties League rather than the Northern Counties East League).

"I had a German guy contact me before the Sheffield game on my private Instagram channel and asked if I could get him a ticket for the match as he wanted to come over," said Ian. "I arranged it for him and he sorted out flights but the original game was called off due to snow. I just assumed he had gone back to Germany so I messaged him before the rearranged game just to be polite. He then told me he was still in the country, had been sofa surfing and was able to change his flight back so had stopped in the country for the rearranged game.

"He's coming again next year but bringing his mum and dad across with him next time!"

That victory over Sheffield came in the middle of an amazing spell of League form that has seen them go unbeaten since 30 November (when they were beaten 4-2 at home to another local rival in Handsworth). This run of form has seen them clinch second spot in the Premier Division and with it a shot with two potential home games to gain promotion to the Northern Premier League.


First up will be on Saturday when Thackley come to town.

"I thought it was going to be Albion Sports," said lan. "I am so glad its not – they always seems to have one over us." They can thank those pesky neighbours of Handsworth for that with their 3-1 win on the last day over Albion consigning them to 6th place and outside of the play-offs. Earlier in the season Albion won 4-1 at Hallam although the reverse fixture was a 2-2 draw.

Thackley beat Hallam 2-1 in their home game back in September although the game at Sandygate in January resulted in a 3-1 victory for the Countrymen. The attendance that day was 602. There will again be a four figure crowd on Saturday.

A win on Saturday will see another home fixture against either Golcar United or Beverley Town the following weekend. That could be an Easter special at Sandygate but as the saying goes, "One game at a time".

The victory over Sheffield in the Senior Cup was followed by a thrilling 3-2 semi-final victory over another team one division higher in Stocksbridge Park Steels, the winner coming in added time. The final will be against two divisions higher

"It's another fantastic opportunity to play in, and no disrespect to anyone, a proper stadium," says lan. "We have a lot of lads who have come through professional academies or have played professionally higher up but it's still fantastic. A fantastic day for family, friends and hopefully we can apply ourselves on the pitch but we know it's going to be a difficult game."

Worksop Town are set to finish runners up in the Northern Premier League Premier Division and have a shot in the play-offs themselves to win promotion to the Conference North. These games will be played shortly before the Senior Cup Final.

One thing that Ian will try to look at for next season, though, no matter what division they are playing in will be the kit. After each game as part of his kitman duties he visits the launderette. "We have to change the white socks," he says. "I keep telling the Chairman not to have white socks again. They are an absolute sod to clean – some of the pitches we play on shall we say are not the best so I'm not sure who's idea it was to have white socks!"

Blades Still Second, but Oxford Bags a Win!

What a difference a week makes – at least we're still second, as both of the Yorkshire clubs in the race "fell apart" somewhat!


Our performance was flat, and the whole game was a really low quality affair. We had only 1 shot that had a shot xg above 0.1, and both teams barely scraped a full match xg above 1. The game was decided by Campbell ball-watching and allowing his man to run and have a virtual tap-in, as a long throw was flicked on. The only player with any real credit was the Oxford keeper, Jamie Cumming, who did make a couple of decent stops – I pointed out last week that Cumming is 4th, one place above Cooper, in the Championship Goalkeeper stats.

Anyway, that's more than enough about a very forgettable game – what do the overall graphs and charts look like.


Graph I compares our progress against 3 benchmark sets of results which represent Automatic Promotion, Playoff Certainty and Playoff Possibility. My benchmarks take account of who our opponents are each week. On 83 points, comparing to my benchmarks, we are now 5 points ahead of my Autos Promotion (92-point) schedule – and that is with our 2 point deduction.

However, I now think that, unbelievably, we could need 97 for second place this year. I've added the new 97 target to Graph 1, which I will update if future results change my target. (Wendy's yellow trickle on Graph 1 has only crept up 1 point in the last 3 games as well!)

My current end of season forecast is Leeds 98, Blades 97, Burnley 96! - and that includes a draw at Turf Moor! Very squeaky burn time on April 21st!



Graph 2 compares this season against our last 3 successful promotions from this level (all in second place), in 2005/06, 2018/19 and 2022/23. On 83 points after 40 games (with the 2-point deduction) we are 6 points ahead of the 77 points that we had under Wilder in 18/19, 7 points ahead of Hecky in 22/23 and 5 points ahead of Warnock in 05/06. (Unfortunately, the second place totals in those seasons were very much lower than this season's will be!)



Let's hope that the 2 -point deduction isn't coming back to bite us!

Next, the coloured annotated up-to-date League Table which, unfortunately highlights those 2 unacceptable red blocks at the bottom of the table.

The Nailers had been a spin over the last couple of months, dropping from title contenders to fighting to stay in the top five. A Stocksbridge win would further cement them in the top five and potentially finish off Belper's season.

But football is not a simple game with obvious winners. And so Stocksbridge found out. They came out like the team on shaky ground, their defence looking lost and confused. And Belper were happy to take advantage, a quick ball into the box finding it's way to Jaanai Gordon. The former West Ham United striker went one-on-one with the goalkeeper and he was able to finish it off.

After the early shock, Stocksbridge recovered and were able to settle into the game. You could even argue they were the better team, especially when they were able to


