# **News & Announcements**

### **Library Space Improvements Coming In 2025**

In 2023, the Library evaluated our current space utilization in order to make long-term improvements to meet our community's changing needs. Along with your feedback from our recent community survey, we identified the need to update our Youth Services area, improve our lobby space to include a better café area, and create more study and work spaces. You asked, and we listened! We're excited to announce the first phase of our long-term space improvement project.

### **New Play Space for Kids**

GPL's Youth Services Department serves thousands of children each year. In 2023, children's books accounted for 66% of all books checked out, and attendance at kids' programs surpassed that of all other audiences. In the 15 years since the design of our children's area, new research has taught us more about the importance of play; it's essential for nurturing social and emotional growth, developing language skills, and sparking creativity and imagination. Our new play space will blend the wonder of books with the power of play, offering endless opportunities for learning and discovery.

### More Study Rooms for One to Two People

GPL sees over 700 study room reservations per month, and during peak times like finals week, it can be hard to find rooms available for those needing a quiet space for Zoom meetings or job interviews. To accommodate, we're adding seven smaller study rooms for one to two people on the second floor, freeing up the existing study rooms for larger groups.

### Improved Vending Café in the Lobby

Patrons spend more time working, studying, and reading at the Library these days, making our lobby a space for gathering. To improve the atmosphere in our lobby, we're partnering with a local coffee house to provide hot and cold coffee drinks, and we're upgrading our vending machines to offer fresh food options. The new café space will be in the east side of the lobby.

### How will these projects be funded?

The projects will be funded by special reserves dedicated to capital building repairs and improvement projects and supplemented by capital campaign fundraising by the Glenview Public Library Foundation (learn more on page 19). The Library is also pursuing an Illinois State Library public library construction grant. Watch for these exciting projects to begin in 2025.
